1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 40-49 of the North Dakota

2 Century Code, relating to referral of an ordinance adopted by a board of park commissioners.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 40-49 of the North Dakota Century Code is 5 created and enacted as follows:

6	Peti	tion to refer ordinance - Suspension of ordinance - Publication - Ballot.
7	<u>1.</u>	An ordinance that has been adopted by the board of park commissioners may be
8		referred to the qualified electors of the park district by a petition protesting the
9		ordinance. The petition must be signed by qualified electors of the park district
10		equal to at least ten percent of the entire vote cast for all candidates for executive
11		officer of the city at the preceding regular city election and must be presented to
12		the board of park commissioners within ten days and before four p.m. on the tenth
13		day after the ordinance described in the petition became effective. An ordinance
14		protested against is suspended upon the filing of a petition. A petition filed under
15		this section must meet the requirements of sections 40-12-03 and 40-12-04 and
16		the city auditor shall examine and certify the petition as provided in section
17		<u>40-12-05.</u>
18	<u>2.</u>	When a referendum petition is filed, the board of park commissioners shall
19		reconsider the ordinance described in the petition, and if the ordinance is not
20		entirely repealed, the board shall submit the ordinance to the vote of the qualified
21		electors of the park district at the next regular city election or at a special election
22		to be called for that purpose. The ordinance may not become effective unless a
23		majority of the qualified electors voting on the question vote in favor of the
24		ordinance.

1	<u>3.</u>	The city auditor shall publish an ordinance to be submitted to the electors under
2		this section once in the official newspaper of the city. The publication must be
3		made no more than twenty days nor fewer than five days before the submission of
4		the ordinance to a vote.
5	<u>4.</u>	The ballot to be used in voting upon a referred ordinance must be in substantially
6		the following form:
