## 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 39-06.2 of the North Dakota

- 2 Century Code, relating to a nonresident commercial driver's license; to amend and reenact
- 3 sections 39-06.2-02, 39-06.2-08, and 39-06.2-09 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to
- 4 an application for a nonresident commercial driver's license; and to declare an emergency.

## 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 39-06.2-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is
7 amended and reenacted as follows:

- **39-06.2-02. Definitions.** As used in this chapter, unless the context or subject matter
  otherwise requires:
- "Alcohol" means any substance containing any form of alcohol, including ethanol,
   methanol, propanol, and isopropanol.
- 12 2. "Alcohol concentration" means:

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- a. The number of grams of alcohol per one hundred milliliters of blood;
- b. The number of grams of alcohol per two hundred ten liters of breath; or
- 15 c. The number of grams of alcohol per sixty-seven milliliters of urine.
- "Commercial driver's instruction permit" means a permit issued under subsection 4
   of section 39-06.2-07.
- "Commercial driver's license" means a license issued under this chapter which
   authorizes an individual to drive a class of commercial motor vehicle.
- 20 5. "Commercial driver's license information system" means the information system
  21 established under the Commercial Motor Vehicle Safety Act to serve as a
- clearinghouse for locating information related to the licensing and identification ofcommercial motor vehicle drivers.

1	6.	"Commercial motor vehicle" means a motor vehicle or combination of motor			
2		vehicles designed or used to transport passengers or property:			
3		a. If the gross combination weight rating is twenty-six thousand one pounds			
4		[11794 kilograms] or more provided the towed unit has a gross vehicle weight			
5		rating of more than ten thousand pounds [4536 kilograms];			
6		b. If the vehicle has a gross vehicle weight rating of more than twenty-six			
7		thousand pounds [11793.40 kilograms] or such lesser rating as determined by			
8		federal regulation;			
9		c. If the vehicle is designed to transport sixteen or more passengers, including			
10		the driver; or			
11		d. If the vehicle is transporting hazardous materials and is required to be			
12		placarded in accordance with 49 CFR part 172, subpart F.			
13	7.	"Controlled substance" means any substance so classified under section 802(6) of			
14		the Controlled Substances Act [21 U.S.C. 802(6)], and includes all substances			
15		listed on schedules I through V, of 21 CFR part 1308, as they may be revised from			
16		time to time.			
17	8.	"Conviction" means an unvacated adjudication of guilt, or a determination that a			
18		person has violated or failed to comply with the law in a court of original jurisdiction			
19		or an authorized administrative tribunal, an unvacated forfeiture of bail or collateral			
20		deposited to secure the person's appearance in court, the payment of a fine or			
21		court cost, or violation of a condition of release without bail, regardless of whether			
22		or not the penalty is rebated, suspended, or probated.			
23	9.	"Disqualification" means a withdrawal of the privilege to drive a commercial motor			
24		vehicle.			
25	10.	"Drive" means to drive, operate, or be in physical control of a motor vehicle.			
26	11.	"Driver" means any person who drives, operates, or is in physical control of a			
27		commercial motor vehicle, or who is required to hold a commercial driver's license.			
28	12.	"Driver's license" means a license issued by a state to an individual which			
29		authorizes the individual to drive a motor vehicle.			

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- 13. "Drug" means any drug or substance or combination of drugs or substances which
   renders a person incapable of safely driving, and includes any controlled
   substance.
   14. "Employer" means any person, including the United States, a state, or a political
   subdivision of a state, who owns or leases a commercial motor vehicle, or assigns
- a person to drive a commercial motor vehicle.
  The additional state of a person as a result of a motor vehicle accident.
- 8 16. "Felony" means any offense under state or federal law which is punishable by
  9 death or imprisonment for a term exceeding one year.
- 10 17. "Foreign jurisdiction" means any jurisdiction other than a state of the United States.
- 18. "Gross vehicle weight rating" means the value specified by the manufacturer as
  the maximum loaded weight of a single or a combination (articulated) vehicle. The
  gross vehicle weight rating of a combination (articulated) vehicle (commonly
  referred to as the "gross combination weight rating") is the gross vehicle weight
  rating of the power unit plus the gross vehicle weight rating or actual weight of the
  towed unit or units.
- 17 19. "Hazardous materials" means any material that has been designated as hazardous
  18 under 49 U.S.C. 5103 and is required to be placarded under subpart F of 49 CFR
  19 part 172 or any quantity of a material listed as a select agent or toxin in 42 CFR
  20 part 73.
- 20. "Imminent hazard" means the existence of a condition that presents a substantial
  likelihood that death, serious illness, severe personal injury, or a substantial
  endangerment to health, property, or the environment may occur before the
  reasonably foreseeable completion date of a formal proceeding begun to lessen
  the risk of that death, illness, injury, or endangerment.
- 26 21. "Motor vehicle" means every vehicle that is self-propelled, and every vehicle that is
  27 propelled by electric power obtained from overhead trolley wires but not operated
  28 upon rails, except vehicles moved solely by human power and motorized
  29 wheelchairs.
- 30 22. "Noncommercial motor vehicle" means a motor vehicle or combination of motor
  31 vehicles not defined by the term commercial motor vehicle.

1	23.	"Nonresident commercial driver's license" means a commercial driver's license				
2		issued by a state to an individual domiciled in a foreign country meeting the				
3		requirements of 49 CFR 383.23(b)(1).				
4	<u>24.</u>	"Out-of-service order" means a temporary prohibition against driving a commercial				
5		motor vehicle.				
6	<del>24.</del> <u>25.</u>	"Serious traffic violation" means a conviction when operating a commercial motor				
7		vehicle of:				
8		a. Excessive speeding, involving a single charge of any speed fifteen miles				
9		[24.14 kilometers] per hour or more, above the posted speed limit;				
10		b. Reckless driving, as defined under section 39-08-03 or local ordinance,				
11		including charges of driving a commercial motor vehicle in willful or wanton				
12		disregard for the safety of persons or property, improper or erratic traffic lane				
13		changes, or following the vehicle ahead too closely;				
14		c. A violation of any state or local law related to motor vehicle traffic control,				
15		other than a parking violation, arising in connection with a fatal accident;				
16		d. Driving a commercial motor vehicle without obtaining a commercial driver's				
17		license;				
18		e. Driving a commercial motor vehicle without a commercial driver's license in				
19		the driver's possession. An individual who provides proof to the enforcement				
20		authority that issued the citation, by the date the individual must appear in				
21		court or pay a fine for such violation, that the individual held a valid				
22		commercial driver's license on the date the citation was issued, is not guilty of				
23		this offense; or				
24		f. Driving a commercial motor vehicle without the proper class of commercial				
25		driver's license or endorsement, or both, for the specific vehicle group being				
26		operated or for the passengers or type of cargo being transported.				
27	<del>25.</del> <u>26.</u>	"State" means a state of the United States or the District of Columbia.				
28	<del>26.</del> <u>27.</u>	"United States" means the fifty states and the District of Columbia.				
29	SE	CTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 39-06.2-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is				
30	amended and reenacted as follows:					
31	39-06 2-08 Application for commercial driver's license					

31 **39-06.2-08.** Application for commercial driver's license.

1	1.	The application for a commercial driver's license or commercial driver's instruction		
2		permit must include the following:		
3		a. The full name and current mailing address of the person applicant;		
4		b. A physical description of the person applicant, including sex, height, weight,		
5		and eye and hair color;		
6		c. Date of birth;		
7		d. The applicant's social security number, unless the application is for a		
8		nonresident commercial driver's license and the applicant is a resident of a		
9		foreign jurisdiction;		
10		e. The person's applicant's signature;		
11		f. The certifications including those required by 49 CFR part 383.71(a);		
12		g. Any other information required by the director; and		
13		h. A consent to release driving record information.		
14	<u>2.</u>	The application must be accompanied by an application fee of fifteen dollars.		
15	<del>2.</del> <u>3.</u>	When the holder of a commercial driver's license changes the holder's name or		
16		mailing address, an application for a duplicate license must be made as provided		
17		in section 39-06-18.		
18	<del>3.</del> <u>4.</u>	No person An individual who has been a resident of this state for thirty days may		
19		not drive a commercial motor vehicle under the authority of a commercial driver's		
20		license issued by another jurisdiction.		
21	<del>4.</del> <u>5.</u>	Any person individual who knowingly falsifies information or certifications required		
22		under subsection 1 is subject to suspension, revocation, or cancellation of the		
23		person's individual's commercial driver's license for a period of at least sixty		
24		consecutive days.		
25	SE	CTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 39-06.2-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
26	amended and reenacted as follows:			
27	39-	06.2-09. Commercial driver's license.		
28	1.	Content of license. The commercial driver's license must be marked "commercial		
29		driver's license", and must be, to the maximum extent practicable, tamper proof. It		
30		must include the following information:		
31		a. The name and residential address of the person;		

1		b. The person's color photograph;			
2		c. A physical description of the person, including sex, height, weight, and eye			
3		and hair color;			
4		d. Date of birth;			
5		e. A distinguishing number assigned to the person which upon request may b			
6		number different from the person's social security number;			
7		f. The person's signature;			
8		g. The class or type of commercial motor vehicle or vehicles which the person is			
9		authorized to drive together with any endorsements or restrictions;			
10		h. The name of this state; and			
11		i. The dates between which the license is valid.			
12	2.	The director may issue a nonresident commercial driver's license pursuant to the			
13		limitations of 49 CFR 383 including waiving the social security number			
14		requirement. The face of the license must be marked "nonresident" in accordance			
15		with 49 CFR 383.153(b).			
16	<u>3.</u>	Classifications, endorsements, and restrictions. Commercial driver's licenses may			
17		be issued with the following classifications, endorsements, and restrictions; the			
18		holder of a valid commercial driver's license may drive all vehicles in the class for			
19		which that license is issued and all lesser classes of vehicles except motorcycles.			
20		Vehicles for which an endorsement is required may not be driven unless the			
21		proper endorsement appears on the license. The requirements of placarding			
22		vehicles transporting hazardous materials under subparagraph b of paragraph 3 of			
23		subdivision a and the endorsement required under paragraph 1 of subdivision b do			
24		not apply to a person who is the operator of a farm vehicle, provided such vehicle			
25		is controlled and operated by a farmer and used to transport hazardous materials			
26		in the form of farm supplies within one hundred fifty miles [241.40 kilometers] of			
27		the farm, and not used in the operations of a common or contract carrier.			
28		a. Classifications:			
29		(1) Class A. Any combination of vehicles with a gross vehicle weight rating			
30		of more than twenty-six thousand pounds [11793.40 kilograms],			

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1			provided the gross vehicle weight rating of the vehicles being towed is
2			in excess of ten thousand pounds [4535.92 kilograms].
3		(2)	Class B. Any single vehicle with a gross vehicle weight rating of more
4			than twenty-six thousand pounds [11793.40 kilograms], and any such
5			vehicle towing a vehicle not in excess of ten thousand pounds [4535.92
6			kilograms].
7		(3)	Class C. Any single vehicle with a gross vehicle weight rating of
8			twenty-six thousand pounds [11793.40 kilograms] or less or any such
9			vehicle towing a vehicle with a gross vehicle weight rating not in excess
10			of ten thousand pounds [4535.92 kilograms] comprising:
11			(a) Vehicles designed to transport sixteen or more passengers,
12			including the driver; and
13			(b) Vehicles used in the transportation of hazardous materials which
14			requires the vehicle to be placarded under 49 CFR part 172,
15			subpart F.
16		b. Endo	prsements and restrictions:
17		(1)	"H" - authorizes the driver to drive a vehicle transporting hazardous
18			materials.
19		(2)	"T" - authorizes driving double and triple trailers.
20		(3)	"P" - authorizes driving vehicles carrying passengers.
21		(4)	"N" - authorizes driving tank vehicles.
22		(5)	"X" - combinations of tank vehicles and hazardous material vehicles.
23		(6)	"S" - authorizes driving a schoolbus.
24		Other rest	rictions may be placed upon a commercial driver's license, as provided
25		in section	39-06-17. The applicant shall pay a fee of three dollars for each
26		endorsem	ent.
27	<del>3.</del> <u>4.</u>	Applicant	record check. Before issuing a commercial driver's license, the director
28		shall obta	in driving record information through the commercial driver's license
29		informatio	n system, the national driver's register, and from each state in which the
30		person ha	s been licensed.

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- 4. <u>5.</u> Notification of license issuance. Within ten days after issuing a commercial
   driver's license, the director shall notify the commercial driver's license information
   system of that fact, providing all information required to ensure identification of the
   person.
- 5 <u>5.</u> <u>6.</u> Expiration of license. A commercial driver's license issued under this chapter 6 expires in the manner provided for operator's licenses under section 39-06-19.
- 6. <u>7.</u> License renewal procedures. Every person applying for renewal of a commercial
   driver's license must complete the application form required by subsection 1 of
   section 39-06.2-08, providing updated information and required certifications. If
- the applicant wishes to retain a hazardous materials endorsement, the written test
  for a hazardous materials endorsement must be taken and passed.
- 12 **SECTION 4.** A new section to chapter 39-06.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is 13 created and enacted as follows:
- 14 Nonresident license.
- 15 <u>1. The department may issue a nonresident commercial driver's license to an</u>
- 16 applicant who does not present a social security card as required by section
- 17 <u>39-06.2-08 but who otherwise meets the requirements for a nonresident</u>
- 18 <u>commercial driver's license</u>. A license issued under this subsection is valid only
- 19 during the period of time of the applicant's authorized stay in the United States.
- 20 The license may be renewed only upon presentation of valid documentary
- 21 evidence that the status has been extended. The department shall renew without
- 22 <u>a skills or knowledge test a nonresident commercial license that has been expired</u>
- 23 for a duration not longer than one year.
- 24 <u>2.</u> The fee for a nonresident commercial driver's license is twenty dollars.
- 25 **SECTION 5. EMERGENCY.** This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
