- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 54-63 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to definitions; to amend and reenact subsection 5 of section 54-44.4-02,
- 3 subsection 2 of section 54-60.1-01, and sections 54-63-01 and 54-63-03 of the North Dakota
- 4 Century Code, relating to the renewable energy program; and to repeal sections 54-17-38 and
- 5 54-17-39 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the biomass incentive and research

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 8 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Subsection 5 of section 54-44.4-02 of the North Dakota 9 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
 - 5. Procurements through a contract or other instrument executed by the industrial commission for energy-related programs under chapters 17-05, 54-17.5, 54-17.6, and 54-17.7, and 54-63 and under those statutes in title 38 authorizing the industrial commission to perform well and hole pluggings, reclamation work, equipment removal, leak prevention, and similar work.
- SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Subsection 2 of section 54-60.1-01 of the North Dakota

 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
 - 2. "Business incentive" means a state or political subdivision direct cash transfer, loan, or equity investment; contribution of property or infrastructure; reduction or deferral of any tax or any fee; guarantee of any payment under any loan, lease, or other obligation; or preferential use of government facilities given to a business. To be considered a business incentive, the total assistance in all forms must be valued at twenty-five thousand dollars or more committed within a year. Unless specifically provided otherwise, the term does not include:

1 Assistance that is generally available to all businesses or to a general class of a. 2 similar businesses, such as a line of business, size, or similar criteria. 3 b. Incentives resulting from Bank of North Dakota programs unless the incentive 4 is a direct interest rate buydown or is an investment made pursuant to the 5 North Dakota alternative and venture capital investments and early-stage 6 capital funds program. 7 Public improvements to buildings or lands owned by the state or political C. 8 subdivision which serve a public purpose and do not principally benefit a 9 single business or defined group of businesses at the time the improvements 10 are made. 11 d. Assistance provided for the sole purpose of renovating old or decaying 12 building stock or bringing such building stock up to code and assistance 13 provided for designated historic preservation districts, provided that the 14 assistance does not exceed seventy-five percent of the total cost. 15 Assistance to provide job-readiness and training services if the sole purpose e. 16 of the assistance is to provide those services. 17 f. Assistance for housing. 18 g. Assistance for pollution control or abatement. 19 h. Assistance for energy conservation. 20 i. Tax reductions resulting from conformity with federal tax law. 21 j. Benefits derived from regulation. 22 Indirect benefits derived from assistance to educational institutions. k. 23 Ι. Assistance for a collaboration between a North Dakota institution of higher 24 education and a business. 25 Redevelopment if the recipient's investment in the purchase of the site and in 26 site preparation is seventy percent or more of the assessor's current year's 27 estimated market value. 28 General changes in tax increment financing law and other general tax law n. 29 changes of a principally technical nature.

1 Federal assistance provided through the state or a political subdivision until Ο. 2 the assistance has been repaid to, and reinvested by, the state or political 3 subdivision. 4 Federal or state assistance for the lignite research, development, and 5 marketing program under chapter 54-17.5. 6 Federal or state assistance for the oil and gas research, development, and q. 7 marketing program under chapter 54-17.6. 8 Federal or state assistance for the renewable energy program under chapter <u>r.</u> 9 54-63. 10 **SECTION 3.** A new section to chapter 54-63 of the North Dakota Century Code is 11 created and enacted as follows: 12 **Definitions.** As used in this chapter, "advanced biofuel" means fuel derived from 13 renewable biomass and includes: 14 Biofuel derived from cellulose, hemicellulose, or lignin; 1. 15 2. Biofuel derived from sugar and starch other than ethanol derived from corn kernel 16 starch: 17 Biofuel derived from waste material, including crop residue, other vegetative waste 3. 18 material, animal waste, food waste, and yard waste; 19 4. Diesel-equivalent fuel derived from renewable biomass, including vegetable oil and 20 animal fat; 21 5. Biogas, including landfill gas and sewage waste treatment gas, produced through 22 the conversion of organic matter from renewable biomass; 23 Butanol or other alcohols produced through the conversion of organic matter from 24 renewable biomass; and 25 7. Other fuel derived from cellulosic biomass. 26 **SECTION 4. AMENDMENT.** Section 54-63-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is 27 amended and reenacted as follows: 28 **54-63-01.** Renewable energy council - Composition. The industrial commission 29 shall consult with the renewable energy council in matters of policy affecting the administration 30 of the renewable energy development fund. 31 The renewable energy council consists of:

1 The commissioner of commerce or the commissioner's designee. a. 2 b. A member with a substantial interest in the agriculture industry appointed by 3 the governor. 4 C. A member with a substantial interest in the biodiesel industry appointed by 5 the governor representing biodiesel interests. 6 d. A member with a substantial interest in the biomass industry appointed by the 7 governor representing biomass interests. 8 A member with a substantial interest in the wind industry appointed by the e. 9 governor representing wind interests. 10 f. A member with a substantial interest in the ethanol industry appointed by the 11 governor representing ethanol interests. 12 g. A member with a substantial interest in advanced biofuel and sugar-based 13 biofuel, appointed by the governor. 14 Subject to subsection 6, the terms of office for members of the council are three 2. 15 years but of those first appointed, two serve for one year, two serve for two years, 16 and three two serve for three years. 17 3. The commissioner of commerce shall serve as chairman. 18 4. The council shall have at least one regular meeting each year and such additional 19 meetings as the chairman determines necessary at a time and place to be fixed by 20 the chairman. Special meetings must be called by the chairman on written request 21 of any three members. Four members constitute a quorum. 22 5. The council shall recommend to the industrial commission the approval of grants, 23 loans, or other financial assistance necessary or appropriate for funding, research, 24 development, marketing, and educational projects or activities and any other 25 matters related to this chapter. Any grants, loans, or other financial assistance 26 must be matched on a dollar-for-dollar basis. 27 Members of the council serve at the pleasure of the governor. 28 **SECTION 5. AMENDMENT.** Section 54-63-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 29 30 54-63-03. Industrial commission powers. 31 The industrial commission may:

- 1 Make grants or loans, and provide other forms of financial assistance as a. 2 necessary or appropriate, to qualified persons for funding research, 3 development, marketing, and educational projects or activities, feasibility 4 studies, applied research and demonstrations, venture capital investments, 5 grants and matching grants, and low-interest loans and loan buydowns to 6 foster the development of renewable energy, including wind, biofuels, 7 biomass, solar, hydroelectric, geothermal, and hydrogen, that is produced 8 from the foregoing renewable energy sources. Any financial assistance that 9 the commission awards to a project must not be the project's sole support. 10 Any financial assistance the commission awards must be conditioned on the 11 assurance that the applicant or a third party will support the project by either 12 monetary or nonmonetary means. The amount of this additional support is at 13 the commission's discretion. 14 Provide incentives for multifeed facilities to process corn ethanol, cellulosic b. 15 ethanol, canola biodiesel, and soy biodiesel. 16 Provide incentives for scaleable technologies. C. 17 d. Provide incentives to increase efficiencies such as research and utilization of 18 renewable energy coproduct utilization for livestock feed, human food 19 products, and industrial use technologies. 20 Execute contracts and all other instruments necessary or convenient for the e. 21 performance of its powers and functions under this chapter. 22 f. Accept aid, grants, or contributions of money or other things of value from any 23 source, to be held, used, and applied to carry out this chapter, subject to the 24 conditions upon which the aid, grants, or contributions are made, including 25 aid, grants, or contributions from any department, agency, or instrumentality 26 of the United States for any purpose consistent with this chapter. 27 Establish interest buydown programs for equipment needed for production, g. 28 harvest, storage, and transport under the special private lands open to
 - h. Fund technical assistance from the university system and private entities to producers.

Establish incentive programs that have as their purpose demonstrating to the 2 agriculture community the commercial feasibility of producing, harvesting, 3 storing, and delivering biomass feedstock. The program may include 4 providing funds to producers of perennial biomass crops, including native 5 grasses, so that such producers have an income during the time needed for 6 these plants to mature and become ready for harvest. 7 Provide incentives to support research and demonstration projects and obtain į. 8 matching grants for projects involving advanced biofuels and sugar-based 9 biofuels. 10 2. The industrial commission shall contract with the department of commerce to 11 provide technical assistance to the renewable energy council and the industrial 12 commission to carry out and effectuate the purposes of this chapter, including 13 pursuit of aid, grants, or contributions of money or other things of value from any 14 source for any purpose consistent with this chapter. The department may contract 15 with a public or private third party to provide any or all of the technical assistance 16 necessary to implement the purposes of this chapter. 17 SECTION 6. REPEAL. Sections 54-17-38 and 54-17-39 of the North Dakota Century
