1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 1 of section 39-06-03.1, subsection 2 of

2 section 39-06-07, and subsection 1 of section 39-06-14 of the North Dakota Century Code,

3 relating to the online registration of donors.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 39-06-03.1 of the North Dakota
6 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

7 1. The director shall issue a nondriver color photo identification card to any North 8 Dakota resident who fulfills the requirements of this section. An application for an 9 identification card must be made on a form furnished by the director. Within thirty 10 days from receipt of a complete application that includes the applicant's social 11 security number, the director shall determine whether to issue and, if appropriate, 12 issue a nondriver photo identification card to an applicant. The application must 13 provide for the voluntary identification of the applicant as a donor under the 14 provisions of chapter 23-06.6. If requested on the identification card application, 15 the identification card issued by the director must include a statement making an 16 anatomical gift under chapter 23-06.6. Voluntary identification of the applicant as a 17 donor under chapter 23-06.6 also may be completed by an online registry 18 approved by the director. If the applicant's donor intention is made by the online 19 registry, the intention must be recorded on the applicant's record. The intention is 20 not required on the card unless a duplicate card is obtained or at the time of 21 renewal. If the person is under the age of eighteen or at least the age of eighteen 22 and under the age of twenty-one, the photo must be against the same color 23 background required on a motor vehicle operator's license for an operator of that

- Legislative Assembly 1 age. Subject to the provisions of subsection 1 of section 39-06-19, identification 2 cards expire eight years from the date of issue and may be renewed. 3 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Subsection 2 of section 39-06-07 of the North Dakota 4 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 5 2. Every application must state the full name, date of birth, sex, social security 6 number, residence and mailing address, and briefly describe the applicant. In 7 signing the application the applicant is deemed to have certified that all information 8 contained on the application is true and correct. The application must be 9 accompanied by the proper fee. The application must also provide for the 10 voluntary identification of the applicant as a donor under the provisions of chapter 11 23-06.6. Voluntary identification of the applicant as a donor under chapter 23-06.6 12 also may be completed by an online registry approved by the director. If the 13 applicant's donor intention is made by the online registry, the intention must be 14 recorded on the applicant's record. The intention is not required on the card unless a duplicate card is obtained or at the time of renewal. The application must contain 15 16 such other information as the director may require. 17 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 39-06-14 of the North Dakota 18 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 19 The director, upon payment of a ten dollar fee, shall issue to every qualified 1.
- 20 applicant an operator's license as applied for in the form prescribed by the director. 21 The license must bear a distinguishing number assigned to the licensee, a color 22 photograph of the licensee, the full name, date of birth, residence address, and a 23 brief description of the licensee, and either a facsimile of the signature of the 24 licensee or a space upon which the licensee shall write the licensee's usual 25 signature. The director may not issue a distinguishing number that is, contains, 26 can be converted to, or is an encrypted version of the applicant's social security 27 number. If the licensee is under the age of eighteen, the photograph must be 28 against a color border or background that is different from the color used for other 29 licensees. If the licensee is at least the age of eighteen and is under the age of 30 twenty-one, the photograph must be against a color border or background that is 31 different from the color used for other licensees. application, the license issued by the director must include a statement making an
anatomical gift under chapter 23-06.6. Voluntary identification of the applicant as a
donor under chapter 23-06.6 also may be completed by an online registry
approved by the director. If the applicant's donor intention is made by the online
registry, the intention must be recorded on the applicant's record. The intention is
not required on the card unless a duplicate card is obtained or at the time of
renewal. No license is valid until it has been signed by the licensee with the
licensee's usual signature. The department shall develop a system to require each
applicant for an operator's license or renewal of an operator's license to determine
whether or not the applicant wishes to be a donor under chapter 23-06.6. For
purposes of verification, an officer may require the licensee to write the licensee's
signature in the presence of the officer. The director may adopt rules, pursuant to
chapter 28-32, relating to the manner in which photographs are to be obtained and
placed on operator's licenses. The photograph may be produced by digital
imaging or other electronic means and is not a public record.
