HB 1338 would establish a landfill siting board with membership from the State Health Department (2 positions), state engineer and state geologist. The board would review relevant information, conduct 2 public hearings and make a decision on the appropriate location for a landfill.

The bill does not differentiate between the different types of landfills and therefore is assumed to include private, public municipal waste landfills; inert landfills and industrial landfills.

Section 2 which would require participation on a landfill siting board would have the greatest fiscal impact. Technical review, data collection and review-response to public comments would require significant time for each of the involved agencies. Assume 1 month salary per landfill site application, legal representation up to \$5,000; and up to 3 landfill applications per year (6 per biennium) if all landfill types are included. The actual number of permits may be more or less depending upon the year.

Assume:

\$9,500 per agency employee (4) per landfill application (9,500 x 4 x 6 = 228,000)

\$5,000 legal fees per agency (3) per landfill application $(5,000 \times 3 \times 6 = 90,000)$

Non state member compensation and travel expenses for all members (30,000)

3 landfill applications per vear

3 agencies, 4 state agency employees involved.
