| Purpose of Grant: The Office of Attorney General, BCI Division, will work with the U.S. Attorney and U.S. Marshals Service (USMS) to design and implement a training program for all law enforcement officers and attorneys participating in this project. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Establish, train, and equip investigative teams of tribal, federal, and state law enforcement officers to identify and arrest offenders who are not in compliance with sex offender registration as well as initiate new cases to protect the children located in these communities. Priority will be given to offenders that: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> o 1) have convictions for acts of violence targeting children, o 2) have potential for federal criminal charges under USC 18 § 2250, and/or, o 3) reside in areas of Native American reservations where local law enforcement lack sufficient jurisdiction and resources to conduct these investigations. In instances where an offender who resides outside of North Dakota fails to comply with the North Dakota registration requirements, this office will work with the USMS. This grant will provide investigative funding for officers to travel, as necessary, to investigate and extradite offenders. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Train officers in specialized investigative techniques needed when computers and digital media are found in the possession of unregistered child sexual predators. Training will be provided to the agencies on each reservation responsible for sex offender registration. • Train attorneys in requisite elements of fact in order to charge an individual under state and federal reporting statutes, elements of proof, acceptable case format, and investigative techniques. | | |
