## SENATE BILL NO. 2057

1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new chapter to title 54 and a new section to chapter

2 54-60 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to a centers of research excellence program

3 and centers of entrepreneurship excellence grants; to amend and reenact section 54-60-22 of

4 the North Dakota Century Code, relating to centers of workforce excellence grants; to provide

5 for transfers; to provide a continuing appropriation; and to provide an appropriation.

## 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

7 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 54-60-22 of the North Dakota Century Code is

8 amended and reenacted as follows:

9 **54-60-22.** Workforce enhancement council - GrantsCenters of workforce excellence

10 grants.

11 The workforce enhancement council shall recommend to the commissioner the approval of 12 centers of workforce excellence grants to institutions of higher education assigned primary 13 responsibility for workforce training in this state to be used to create or enhance training 14 programs that address workforce needs of private sector companies. A grant made under this 15 section may be used for curriculum development, equipment, recruitment of participants, and 16 training and certification for instructors but may not be used to supplant funding for current 17 operations. The department may distribute funds under this section after: 18 1. The division of workforce development certifies that a proposed training program

meets a critical workforce shortage in a target industry or other high-demand
occupation and is expected to lead to employment in this state; and

The proposed recipient provides the department with detailed documentation of
 private sector participation, including the availability of one dollar of matching funds for
 each dollar of state funds.

1 **SECTION 2.** A new section to chapter 54-60 of the North Dakota Century Code is created

2 and enacted as follows:

- 3 <u>Centers of entrepreneurship excellence grants.</u>
- 4 <u>The department shall administer a centers of entrepreneurship excellence grant program,</u>
- 5 which shall provide grants to department-certified entrepreneurial centers to be used to assist
- 6 <u>entrepreneurs in accessing capital, to assist entrepreneurs through providing marketing</u>
- 7 assistance, to support building entrepreneur infrastructure, and to develop entrepreneurial
- 8 talent. The centers of excellence commission, established under chapter 15-69, shall make
- 9 grant award determinations under this section. The department shall work with the centers of
- 10 excellence commission in establishing guidelines to qualify for a grant under this section which
- 11 may include preference for an applicant that establishes the availability of matching funds.
- 12 SECTION 3. A new chapter to title 54 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted
- 13 as follows:

## 14 <u>Definitions.</u>

- 15 In this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires:
- <u>"Center" means a center of research excellence that has been designated under this</u>
   <u>chapter.</u>
- 18 2. "Commission" means the centers of excellence commission as defined under chapter
  19 15-69.
- 20 <u>3.</u> "Department" means the department of commerce;
- 21 <u>4.</u> <u>"Industry cluster" means one of the following industries:</u>
- 22 <u>a.</u> <u>Advanced manufacturing;</u>
- 23 <u>b.</u> <u>Energy;</u>
- 24 <u>c.</u> <u>Information and technology;</u>
- 25 <u>d.</u> <u>Tourism;</u>
- 26 <u>e.</u> <u>Value-added agriculture; or</u>
- <u>f.</u> An industry, including the aerospace industry, specifically identified by the
   <u>department of commerce as an industry that will contribute to the gross state</u>
   <u>product.</u>
- 305."Infrastructure" means new building construction or major building renovation. The31term does not include a purchase of equipment or remodel of an existing building.

1	<u>6.</u>	"Research university" means an institution under the control of the state board of
2		higher education which has a full-time student enrollment in excess of nine thousand
3		students.
4	Cen	ters of research excellence - Application - Eligibility.
5	<u>1.</u>	The department shall establish a centers of research excellence program. The
6		commission shall make funding award determinations under this program. A center
7		must be a research university or a nonprofit university-related or college-related
8		foundation of a research university which is working in partnership with the private
9		sector.
10	<u>2.</u>	The department shall provide center application forms, accept applications, review
11		applications for completeness and compliance with commission policy, forward
12		complete applications to the commission in accordance with guidelines established by
13		the commission, and assist with preaward reviews and postaward monitoring as may
14		be requested by the commission. No more than two applications per campus of a
15		research university institution may be submitted to the department for each round of
16		center funding.
17	<u>3.</u>	The commission shall meet as necessary to review all complete applications; consider
18		the potential need for independent, expert review of complete applications; approve or
19		disapprove complete applications; make funding award recommendations for
20		commission-approved proposed centers; direct the department to distribute funds to
21		the centers; monitor centers for compliance with award requirements; review changes
22		in assertions made in center applications; and conduct postaward monitoring of
23		<u>centers.</u>
24	<u>4.</u>	In considering whether to approve or disapprove a center application, the commission
25		shall determine whether the applicant has conducted the due diligence necessary to
26		put together a viable proposal, the commission shall determine whether the applicant
27		has provided information in the application which clearly outlines how the matching
28		fund requirement will be met, and the commission shall consider whether the center
29		<u>will:</u>

11	<u>5.</u>	<u>In c</u>	onsidering whether to approve an application, the commission may provide for an
12		inde	ependent, expert review of the application to determine whether the proposed
13		<u>cen</u>	ter is viable and whether the proposed center is likely to have the desired
14		<u>eco</u>	nomic impact. As necessary, the commission may contract for additional technical
15		<u>revi</u>	ew of applications. The commission may not approve an application unless the
16		<u>con</u>	mission determines the proposed center has a high likelihood of viability and
17		<u>suc</u>	cess in positively impacting economic development in the state.
18	<u>6.</u>	<u>The</u>	board rules adopted under subsection 9 of section 15-10-17, relating to ownership
19		<u>of ir</u>	ntellectual property, inventions, and discoveries, must address activities and issues
20		<u>unic</u>	que to centers.
21	<u>Use</u>	e of fu	unds - Terms of funds - Distribution of funds - Postaward monitoring.
22	<u>1.</u>	<u>A ce</u>	enter shall use center grant funds to enhance capacity and leverage state, federal,
23		and	private sources of funding. A center awarded center funds under this chapter may
24		<u>not</u>	use the funds for infrastructure, to supplant funding for current operations or
25		<u>aca</u>	demic instructions, or to pay indirect costs.
26	<u>2.</u>	<u>For</u>	no fewer than six years and no more than ten years following center designation,
27		<u>the</u>	commission shall monitor the center's activities in order to determine whether the
28		<u>cen</u>	ter is having the desired economic impact.
29	<u>3.</u>	<u>As a</u>	a condition for receipt of center funds under this chapter, a center shall agree to
30		<u>con</u>	tract with an independent accountant annually in an agreed-upon procedures
31		eng	agement and provide the budget section of the legislative management with a

1		report of the results. The agreed-upon procedures report must be provided until the
2		completion of the commission's postaward monitoring of the center. As a condition for
3		receipt of center funds under this chapter, a center shall agree to provide the
4		commission with the information necessary to monitor the postaward activities of the
5		<u>center.</u>
6	<u>4.</u>	Before the commission directs the department to distribute center funds awarded
7		under this chapter, the center shall provide the commission with detailed
8		documentation of private sector participation and the availability of two dollars of
9		matching funds for each dollar of state funds to be distributed. Of the two dollars of
10		matching funds, at least one dollar must be cash, of which at least fifty cents must be
11		from the private sector. The matching funds may include funds facilitated through the
12		collaboration of the private sector participants with other funding entities. The noncash
13		matching funds may include in-kind assets with itemized value. Private sector
14		participation may be established through equity investments or through contracts for
15		services with private sector entities. In making funding recommendations and
16		designation determinations, the commission shall give major consideration to the
17		portion of the matching funds provided in cash by the private sector.
18	<u>5.</u>	The commission shall direct the department to distribute the center funds awarded
19		under this chapter in disbursements consistent with the center's budget and timeframe
20		outlined in the approved award. The commission may not direct distribution of center
21		funds under this chapter if there are no private sector partners participating or if the
22		statutorily required matching funds are not available.
23	<u>6.</u>	If, before center funds are distributed by the department, a center undergoes a change
24		in the terms of or assertions made in its application, the commission may direct that
25		the department withhold all or a portion of any undistributed funds pending
26		commission review of the changes.
27	<u>7.</u>	The commission may use funds appropriated for the centers of research excellence
28		program to pay for the commissioner's administrative expenses.
29	Emi	nent researcher recruitment challenge grants.
30	<u>As p</u>	art of the centers of research excellence program, the department of commerce shall
31	<u>establish</u>	and administer an eminent researcher recruitment challenge grant program to provide

1	challenge grants to raise funds to be used by research universities and foundations established
2	to further the work of such research universities in endowing chairs to attract eminent research
3	scholars to join the faculties of the research universities. Under this program, the commission
4	shall make challenge grant award determinations. The commission shall adopt standards
5	relative to the award of a challenge grant under this section which must require that a
6	foundation contribute at least fifty percent and not more than seventy-five percent of the total
7	amount the commission deems necessary to endow a chair. The commission may revise the
8	contribution formulas at any time in order to maximize the benefits that may result from
9	endowing one or more chairs in the biennium and depending on the total funds available to the
10	grant program. In determining whether to make a grant award under this section, the
11	commission may consider the existing programs of the North Dakota university system, the
12	necessity for such a chair, and any duplication the creation of the chair might cause.
13	Centers of research excellence fund - Continuing appropriation.
14	The centers of research excellence fund is a special fund in the state treasury. All moneys
15	in the centers of research excellence fund are appropriated to the department of commerce on
16	a continuing basis for the purpose of implementing and administering this chapter. Interest
17	earned on moneys in the fund must be credited to the fund.
18	SECTION 4. CENTERS OF RESEARCH EXCELLENCE INFRASTRUCTURE GRANTS.
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19	The department of commerce shall use \$4,000,000 of the funds transferred to the centers of

1 commissioner of commerce shall develop application criteria, including local support criteria for

SECTION 5. APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general
fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$5,000,000, or so much of the
sum as may be necessary, to the department of commerce for the purpose of funding centers of
entrepreneurship excellence grants under section 2 of this Act, for the biennium beginning
July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013.

9 SECTION 6. APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general
10 fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$10,000,000, or so much of
11 the sum as may be necessary, to the North Dakota university system for the purpose of funding
12 the North Dakota experimental program to stimulate competitive research, for the biennium
13 beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013.

SECTION 7. APPROPRIATION - TRANSFER - CENTERS OF RESEARCH EXCELLENCE
 FUND. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not
 otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$4,000,000, which the office of management and budget
 shall transfer to the centers of research excellence fund for the purpose of providing centers of
 research excellence infrastructure grants, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending
 June 30, 2013.

20 SECTION 8. APPROPRIATION - TRANSFER - WORKFORCE ENHANCEMENT FUND.

There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$2,000,000, which the office of management and budget shall transfer to the workforce enhancement fund for the purpose of implementing and administering sections 54-60-21 and 54-60-22, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013.

SECTION 9. APPROPRIATION - TRANSFER - CENTERS OF RESEARCH EXCELLENCE
 FUND. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not
 otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$10,000,000, which the office of management and budget
 shall transfer to the centers of research excellence fund for the purpose of implementing and
 administering the centers of research excellence grants provided for under section 3 of this Act,
 for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013.

## 1 SECTION 10. APPROPRIATION - TRANSFER - CENTERS OF RESEARCH

- 2 **EXCELLENCE FUND.** There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state
- 3 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$2,000,000, which the office of management
- 4 and budget shall transfer to the centers of research excellence fund for the purpose of
- 5 implementing and administering the eminent researcher recruitment challenge grants provided
- 6 for under section 3 of this Act, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30,
- 7 2013.
