## **HOUSE BILL NO. 1298**

- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 54-35 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the creation of a state ethics committee.

## 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 4 SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 54-35 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 5 and enacted as follows:
- 6 State ethics committee - Membership - Responsibilities - Referral of complaints.
- 7 The state ethics committee is composed of eleven members as follows:
- Four members of the house of representatives, two of whom must be selected by the leader representing the majority faction of the house of representatives and 10 two of whom must be selected by the leader representing the minority faction of the house of representatives;
  - Four members of the senate, two of whom must be selected by the leader b. representing the majority faction of the senate and two of whom must be selected by the leader representing the minority faction of the senate;
  - The state health officer, or the state health officer's designee, who shall serve as <u>C.</u> a nonvoting member:
    - A member of the state bar association of North Dakota, appointed by the board of d. governors of the association, who shall serve as a nonvoting member;
    - The secretary of state, who shall serve as chairman of the committee, but serve <u>e.</u> as a nonvoting member.
- 21 Any individual may submit a written complaint to the secretary of state alleging an <u>2.</u> 22 elected official or an individual subject to chapter 54-05.1 has committed a violation of 23 section 9 of article IV of the Constitution of North Dakota, chapter 12.1-12, section 24 12.1-13-01, 12.1-13-03, 12.1-14-02, 12.1-14-03, 12.1-23-03, 12.1-23-05, or

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- 1 12.1-23-07, chapter 16.1-08.1, 16.1-09, or 16.1-10, section 39-01-03, 39-01-05, 44-08-19, 48-01.2-08, or 54-02-01, chapter 54-05.1, or section 54-06-12.
  - 3. Upon receipt of a complaint under subsection 2, the secretary of state shall forward a copy of the complaint to each member of the committee and call a meeting of the committee to be held within ninety days after receipt of the complaint. At the meeting, the committee shall review the complaint and either dismiss the complaint or forward the complaint to either the attorney general or a state's attorney for prosecution. Any decision to refer a complaint for prosecution must be made by a majority vote of the members voting on the question.
  - 4. The attorney general or a state's attorney to whom a complaint is referred under this section shall proceed with prosecution of the complaint or shall provide the committee a written explanation detailing the reason for not pursuing the prosecution.
    - 5. If a written complaint submitted to the secretary of state alleges a voting member of the committee has committed any of the violations listed under subsection 2, that member is disqualified from participating in the review of the complaint and the individual who made the appointment of that member shall appoint a replacement member to participate in the review and disposition of the complaint.
    - 6. If a written complaint submitted to the secretary of state alleges a nonvoting member of the committee has committed any of the violations listed under subsection 2, that member is disqualified from participating in the review of the complaint.
    - 7. The legislative council shall provide staffing for the committee.
