# **SENATE BILL NO. 2187**

### 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 43-23.3-02, 43-23.3-03, and 43-23.3-04.1 of

2 the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the North Dakota real estate appraiser gualifications

3 and ethics board and appraiser permit approval standards; and to provide for application.

### 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 43-23.3-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is

6 amended and reenacted as follows:

### 7 43-23.3-02. North Dakota real estate appraiser qualifications and ethics board.

- 8 1. The governor shall appoint the board. The board must consist of fiveseven members.
- 9 One member must represent thebe a public, member; one member must represent be
- 10 a representative of the financial industry; one member must be a representative of the
- 11 builder industry; one member must be a realtor; and three members must be
- 12 appraisers, at least one of which is experienced in the appraisal of agricultural
- 13 property and at least one of which resides in a rural area not included within the
- 14 boundaries of a city having a population in excess of four thousand inhabitants at the
- 15 time of the member's appointment. The appraiser members first appointed to the board-
- 16 must be members in good standing of an organization belonging to the appraisal
- 17 foundation or have the equivalent of five years of full-time experience as an appraiser
- 18 in this state. Thereafter, each
- 19 Each appraiser member of the board must be either a licensed or certified а. 20 appraiser, but at least two of the appraiser members must be certified appraisers.
- 21 <u>b.</u> The governor shall appoint the financial industry representative who has a
- 22 background in real estate and the lending process from a list of qualified 23
  - individuals submitted by the North Dakota bankers associations, the North-
- 24 Dakota and the mid-America credit union league, and the North Dakota league of

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1			savings institutionsassociation. Each of these entities may submit two names of		
2			candidates to the governor.		
3		<u>C.</u>	The governor shall appoint the builder industry representative from a list of two		
4			qualified individuals submitted by the North Dakota association of builders.		
5		<u>d.</u>	The governor shall appoint the realtor representative from a list of two qualified		
6			individuals submitted by the North Dakota association of realtors.		
7		<u>e.</u>	The public member of the board may not be engaged in the practice of real		
8			estate appraising.		
9	<u>2.</u>	The term of each member is five years, except that of the members first appointed,			
10		one	shall serve for five years, one shall serve for four years, one shall serve for three		
11		<del>yea</del> i	rs, one shall serve for two years, and one shall serve for one year. A member may		
12		not :	serve more than ten years. The governor shall appoint members so the terms of		
13		<u>no n</u>	nore than two members expire each year. A member of the board continues to		
14		hold	l office until the appointment and qualification of a successor. The governor may		
15		remove a board member for cause. The			
16	<u>3.</u>	<u>Ann</u>	<u>ually the</u> members <del>annually</del> shall elect a chairman from among the members. At		
17		least two of the members who are appraiser members must be present in order for a			
18		quo	rum to exist. The members are entitled to receive compensation for each day		
19		actu	ally engaged in the service of the board and actual and necessary traveling		
20		expe	enses at the rate allowed other state officials, paid from the fees collected by the		
21		boa	rd.		
22	<u>4.</u>	<u>A m</u>	ember may not accept an appraisal assignment if the services are provided for the		
23		state	e or are related to real estate in which the state has a direct interest.		
24	SEC	ECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 43-23.3-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is			
25	amended and reenacted as follows:				
26	43-23.3-03. Powers and duties of the board.				
27	1.	The	board, or itsthe board's designated representative, shall:		
28		a.	Define apprentice appraiser, licensed appraiser, certified residential appraiser,		
29			and certified general appraiser;; determine the type of educational experience,		
30			appraisal experience, and equivalent experience that meet the requirements of		

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1			this chapter, and; establish application procedures; and establish standards for	
2			approval and disapproval of applications for permits.	
3		b.	Establish examination specifications for each category of licensed and certified	
4			appraiser and administer examinations.	
5		C.	Approve or disapprove applications for permits, issue pocket cards and permits	
6			to practice, and maintain a registry of the names and addresses of individuals	
7			holding permits.	
8		d.	Discipline permittees.	
9		e.	Hold meetings, hearings, and examinations in places and at times as itthe board	
10			designates and maintain records of board activities.	
11		f.	Adopt rules, pursuant to chapter 28-32, necessary to implement this chapter or	
12			carry out the requirements imposed by federal law.	
13		<u>g.</u>	Adopt rules that clearly and concisely establish the standards for approval and	
14			disapproval of applications for permits. The rules must include a requirement that	
15			an application disapproval clearly specify the basis for the disapproval.	
16		<u>h.</u>	Keep permittees informed of board activities, including providing notification of	
17			board member terms and any upcoming board vacancy; internet posting of	
18			meeting notices, hearing notices, and minutes; and internet posting of proposed	
19			and final rule changes.	
20	2.	The	e board, or itsthe board's designated representative, may:	
21		a.	Promote research and conduct studies relative to real estate appraising and	
22			sponsor educational activities.	
23		b.	Contract for services necessary to carry out this chapter.	
24		C.	Enter into reciprocity agreements with other states.	
25	3.	The	e board, or itsthe board's authorized representative, may investigate and gather	
26		evio	dence concerning alleged violations of the provisions of chapter 43-23.3 or the	
27		rule	es of the board. Board investigative files are exempt records as defined in	
28		sub	section 5 of section 44-04-17.1, but a copy of the investigative file must be	
29		pro	vided to a licensee if a complaint is filed against the licensee by the board.	
30	SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 43-23.3-04.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is			
31	amended and reenacted as follows:			

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# 1 43-23.3-04.1. Issuance of permits to applicants licensed or certified by another state.

2 TheIn a timely manner the board mayshall issue a permit to an applicant who is licensed or 3 certified in good standing by another state if the other state's requirements to be licensed or 4 certified are at least substantially equivalent to the requirements imposed by this state. If an 5 applicant was licensed or certified by another state by reciprocity or a similar process, the 6 requirements of the state in which the applicant was originally licensed or certified must be at 7 least substantially equivalent to the requirements imposed by this state. Board reciprocity 8 consideration may not be based on review standards. 9 SECTION 4. APPLICATION. The ten-year limit for board members under section 1 of this 10 Act applies to all board members serving on the effective date of this Act. In order to maintain 11 staggered board member terms the governor shall appoint an individual to complete the 12 remainder of the term of a board member who becomes ineligible due to the ten-year limitation. 13 In order to initiate staggered board member terms for the two new board members the governor

14 may appoint one new member to serve a four-year term.
