- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 43-23.3-02, 43-23.3-03, and 43-23.3-04.1 of
- 2 the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the North Dakota real estate appraiser qualifications
- 3 and ethics board and appraiser permit approval standards; to provide for application; and to
- 4 declare an emergency.

## 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 2 board shall issue or deny the application and inform the applicant of the decision.
- 3 SECTION 4. APPLICATION. The change in the term limits for board members provided for
- 4 under section 1 of this Act applies to board member appointments and reappointments made
- 5 after July 31, 2011; therefore, the new term limit provisions do not disqualify any board member
- 6 serving on the effective date of this Act, but may prevent the governor from reappointing a
- 7 board member after the effective date of this Act.
- 8 **SECTION 5. EMERGENCY.** This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
