A BILL for an Act to create and enact sections 15.1-20-02.1, 15.1-20-03.1, and 15.1-20-03.2 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to compulsory attendance at school; and to amend and reenact section 15.1-20-03 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to compulsory attendance.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. Section 15.1-20-02.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and
 enacted as follows:
- 8 15.1-20-02.1. Attendance Determination Policies.
- 1. To be deemed in attendance for purposes of this chapter, a student may not be absent
 from school without excuse for more than:
- 11 <u>a.</u> Three consecutive school days during either the first half or the second half of a school or school district's calendar;
- b. Six half days during either the first half or the second half of a school or school
 district's calendar; or
 - <u>c.</u> <u>Twenty-one class periods.</u>

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- 16 <u>2.</u> The board of each school district and governing body of each nonpublic school shall
 17 adopt a policy that:
- a. Defines an excused absence as any absence from school, if that absence is
 supported by either a verbal or written excuse supplied by the student's parent,
 teacher, or school administrator; and
- b. Articulates the type of documentation that may be requested to verify a student's
 absence.
- 3. This chapter does not preclude a school district or nonpublic school from withholding
 credit, removing a student from a course, or taking other punitive measures against a

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1		student who does not arrive in a timely fashion or who exceeds a specific number of
2		absences, as determined by the school district or nonpublic school.
3	SEC	TION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-20-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is
4	amende	d and reenacted as follows:
5	15.1-20-03. Compulsory attendance law - Enforcement - Penalty.	
6	1.	Each teacher and administrator is charged with the enforcement of compulsory school-
7		attendance provisions. The compulsory school attendance provisions are applicable to
8		any childstudent who is offered school facilities by a school district, regardless of
9		whether or not the childstudent actually resides in the district.
0	2.	If a teacher determines that a childstudent is not in attendance as required by this
11		chapter and that the ehildstudent has not been excused in accordance with this
2		chapter or in accordance with the school's or school district's or nonpublic school's
3		policies, the teacher shall notify the administrator of the school.
4	3.	Upon receiving notice of a child's student's absence under subsection 2, the
5		administrator shall initiate an investigation into the cause of the absence. If the
6		administrator has reason to believe that the person having responsibility for the
7		childstudent has failed to ensure that the childstudent is in attendance, the
8		administrator shall refer the matter to the local law enforcement agency.
9	4.	Any person who fails to ensure that a childstudent is in attendance as required by this
20		chapter is guilty of an infraction for a first offense and is guilty of a class B
21		misdemeanor for a second or subsequent offense.
22	5.	In a prosecution for an offense under this section, it is an affirmative defense if the
23		person responsible for ensuring that the ehildstudent is in attendance has made
24		substantial and reasonable efforts to comply with the requirements of this section, but
25		is unable to compel the ehildstudent to attend school. If the court determines that the

- 5 **SECTION 4.** Section 15.1-20-03.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and
- 6 enacted as follows:
- 7 <u>15.1-20-03.2. Truancy prevention and intervention programs Resources.</u>
- 8 The superintendent of public instruction shall disseminate to school districts and nonpublic
- 9 schools information regarding truancy prevention and intervention programs and research
- 10 pertaining to best practices in truancy prevention efforts.
