## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 57-38 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

## Earned income credit.

- A resident taxpayer is entitled to a credit against tax liability as determined under section 57-38-30.3 in the amount of ten percent of the amount of the earned income credit claimed against that taxpayer's federal income tax liability under section 32 of the Internal Revenue Code for the taxable year in which the credit was claimed against the taxpayer's federal income tax liability. The credit under this section must be allowed against the taxes imposed by this chapter for the taxable year after reduction by the credits permitted by this chapter. If the amount of the credit claimed under this section exceeds the taxpayer's income tax liability under this chapter, the excess amount must be refunded to the taxpayer.
- <u>2.</u> For a part-year resident, the credit under this section must be adjusted based on the percentage calculated under subdivision f of subsection 1 of section 57-38-30.3.
- 3. On an annual basis, the tax commissioner shall alert those resident taxpayers who may be eligible to receive the credit provided under this section as to the taxpayer's potential eligibility. In making the determination of whether a taxpayer may be eligible for the credit, the commissioner shall use such data as may be appropriate and available, including data available from the United States department of the treasury,

1	the internal revenue service, and state income tax returns. The tax commissioner shall
2	include in the notification to potentially eligible taxpayers an application that the eligible
3	taxpayer may use to determine eligibility and apply for the earned income credit under
4	this section. The tax commissioner may require the eligible taxpayer to file a state
5	income tax return to qualify for the earned income credit.
6	4. On a date agreed to by the tax commissioner and the department of human services,
7	the tax commissioner shall provide to the department of human services information
8	regarding the total aggregate expenditures from the state general fund for the
9	refundable portion of the credit under this section. The department of human services
10	may apply the determined expenditures from the state general fund under this section
11	to count as temporary assistance for needy families block grant maintenance of effort
12	requirement to the extent permitted by federal law.
13	SECTION 2. A new subdivision to subsection 7 of section 57-38-30.3 of the North Dakota
14	Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
15	Earned income credit under section 1 of this Act.
16	SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act is effective for taxable years beginning after
17	December 31, 2010.
