## **ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1057**

Introduced by

(Workforce Committee)

1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new subsection to section 57-38-57 of the North Dakota

- 2 Century Code, relating to angel fund investment disclosure; to amend and reenact section
- 3 57-38-01.26 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the angel fund investment tax credit;
- 4 to provide for a report to the legislative management; and to provide an effective date; and to
- 5 provide an expiration date.

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## 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 57-38-01.26 of the North Dakota Century Code is
amended and reenacted as follows:

## 57-38-01.26. Angel fund investment tax credit.

- A taxpayer is entitled to a credit against state income tax liability under section 57-38-30 or 57-38-30.3 for an investment made in an angel fund that is incorporated in a domestic organization created under the laws of this state. The amount of the credit to which a taxpayer is entitled is forty-five percent of the amount invested remitted by the taxpayer into an angel fund during the taxable year. The aggregate annual credit for which a taxpayer may obtain a tax credit is not more than forty-five thousand dollars. The aggregate lifetime credits under this section that may be obtained by an individual, married couple, passthrough entity and its affiliates, or other taxpayer is one hundred fifty thousand dollars. The investment used to calculate the credit under this section may not be used to calculate any other income tax deduction or credit allowed by law.
- 2. To be eligible for the credit, the investment must be at risk in the angel fund for at least three years. Investments placed in escrow do not qualify for the credit. The credit must be claimed in the taxable year in which the investment in the angel fund was received by the angel fund. The credit allowed may not exceed the liability for tax under this

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1 chapter. If the amount of credit determined under this section exceeds the liability for 2 tax under this chapter, the excess may be carried forward to each of the fourseven 3 succeeding taxable years. A taxpayer claiming a credit under this section may not 4 claim any credit available to the taxpayer as a result of an investment made by the 5 angel fund in a qualified business under chapter 57-38.5 or 57-38.6. 6 3. An angel fund must: 7 Be a partnership, limited partnership, corporation, limited liability company, limited 8 liability partnership, trust, or estate organized on a for-profit basis which is 9 headquartered in this state. 10 b. Be organized for the purpose of investing in a portfolio of at least three primary 11 sector companies that are early-stage and mid-stage private, nonpublicly traded 12 enterprises with strong growth potential. For purposes of this section, an 13 early-stage entity means an entity with annual revenues of up to two million 14 dollars and a mid-stage entity means an entity with annual revenues over two 15 million dollars not to exceed ten million dollars. Early-stage and mid-stage entities 16 do not include those that have more than twenty-five percent of their revenue 17 from income-producing real estate. 18 C. Consist of at least six accredited investors as defined by securities and exchange 19 commission regulation D, rule 501. 20 Not have more than twenty-five percent of its capitalized investment assets d. 21 owned by an individual investor. 22 Have at least five hundred thousand dollars in commitments from accredited e. 23 investors and that capital must be subject to call to be invested over an 24 unspecified number of years to build a portfolio of investments in enterprises. 25 f. Be member-managed or a manager-managed limited liability company and the 26 investor members or a designated board that includes investor members must 27 make decisions as a group on which enterprises are worthy of investments. 28 Be certified as an angel fund that meets the requirements of this section by the g. 29 department of commerce.

Be in compliance with the securities laws of this state.

1		i. Within thirty days after the date on which an investment in an angel fund is made,		
2		the angel fund shall file with the tax commissioner and provide to the investor		
3		completed forms prescribed by the tax commissioner which show as to each		
4			inve	estment in the angel fund the following:

6				identification number of the taxpayer or passthrough entity that made the
7				investment;
8			<u>(2)</u>	The dollar amount paid for the investment remitted by the taxpayer or

11				fund for the investment.

13			the	tax commissioner a report showing the name and principal place of business
14		of each enterprise in which the angel fund has an investment.		
15	4.	The tax commissioner may disclose to the legislative management the reported		
16		info	rmati	on described under paragraphs 2 and 3 of subdivision i of subsection 3 and
17		the	repor	ted information described under subdivision j of subsection 3.
18	5.	Angel fund investors may be actively involved in the enterprises in which the angel		
19		fun	d inve	ests but the angel fund may not invest in any enterprise if any one angel fund
20		investor owns directly or indirectly more than forty-nine percent of the ownership		
21		inte	rests	in the enterprise. The angel fund may not invest in an enterprise if any one
22		par	tner, s	shareholder, or member of a passthrough entity that directly or indirectly owns
23		mo	re tha	n forty-nine percent of the ownership interests in the enterprise.
24	<del>5.</del> <u>6.</u>	Inve	estors	in one angel fund may not receive more than five million dollars in aggregate
25		credits under this section during the life of the angel fund but this provision may not be		
26		interpreted to limit additional investments in that angel fund.		
27	<u>6.7.</u>	<u>a.</u>	A pa	artnership, subchapter S corporation, limited partnership, limited liability
28			com	pany, or any other passthrough entity entitled to the credit under this section
29			mus	st be considered to be the taxpayer for purposes of this section, and the
30			<u>amc</u>	ount of the credit allowed must be determined at the passthrough entity level.

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1 Here the first two taxable years beginning after December 31, 2010, if a 2 passthrough entity does not elect to sell, transfer, or assign the credit as provided 3 under this subsection and subsection 78, the amount of the total credit 4 <u>determined at the entity level must be passed through to the partners,</u> 5 shareholders, or members in proportion to their respective interests in the 6 passthrough entity. 7 HFF or the first two taxable years beginning after December 31, 2010, if a C. 8 passthrough entity elects to sell, transfer, or assign a credit as provided under 9 this subsection and subsection 78, the passthrough entity shall make an 10 irrevocable election to sell, transfer, or assign the credit on the return filed by the 11 entity for the taxable year in which the credit was earned. A passthrough entity 12 that makes a valid election to sell, transfer, or assign a credit shall sell one 13 hundred percent of the credit earned, may sell the credit to only one purchaser, 14 and shall comply with the requirements of this subsection and subsection 78. 15 <del>7.</del>8. AFor the first two taxable years beginning after December 31, 2010, a taxpayer may 16 elect to sell, transfer, or assign all of the earned or excess tax credit earned under this 17 section for investment in an angel fund established after July 31, 2011, subject to the 18 following: 19 A taxpayer's total credit sale, transfer, or assignment under this section may not a. 20 exceed one hundred thousand dollars over any combination of taxable years. 21 The cumulative credits transferred by all investors in an angel fund may not 22 exceed fifty percent of the aggregate credits under this section during the life of 23 the angel fund under subsection 6. 24 <u>b.</u> If the taxpayer elects to sell, assign, or transfer a credit under this subsection, the 25 tax credit transferor and the tax credit purchaser jointly shall file with the tax 26 commissioner a copy of the purchase agreement and a statement containing the 27 names, addresses, and taxpayer identification numbers of the parties to the 28 transfer, the amount of the credit being transferred, the gross proceeds received 29 by the transferor, and the taxable year or years for which the credit may be 30 claimed. The taxpayer and the purchaser also shall file a document allowing the

tax commissioner to disclose tax information to either party for the purpose of

1 verifying the correctness of the transferred tax credit. The purchase agreement, 2 supporting statement, and waiver must be filed within thirty days after the date 3 the purchase agreement is fully executed. 4 The purchaser of the tax credit shall claim the credit beginning with the taxable <u>C.</u> 5 year in which the credit purchase agreement was fully executed by the parties. A 6 purchaser of a tax credit under this section has only such rights to claim and use 7 the credit under the terms that would have applied to the tax credit transferor. 8 This subsection does not limit the ability of the tax credit purchaser to reduce the 9 tax liability of the purchaser, regardless of the actual tax liability of the tax credit 10 transferor. 11 A sale, assignment, or transfer of a tax credit under this section is irrevocable and d. 12 the purchaser of the tax credit may not sell, assign, or otherwise transfer the 13 credit. 14 If the amount of the credit available under this section is changed as a result of <u>e.</u> 15 an amended return filed by the transferor, or as the result of an audit conducted 16 by the internal revenue service or the tax commissioner, the transferor shall 17 report to the purchaser the adjusted credit amount within thirty days of the 18 amended return or within thirty days of the final determination made by the 19 internal revenue service or the tax commissioner. The tax credit purchaser shall 20 file amended returns reporting the additional tax due or claiming a refund as 21 provided in section 57-38-38 or 57-38-40, and the tax commissioner may audit 22 these returns and assess or issue refunds, even though other time periods 23 prescribed in these sections may have expired for the purchaser. 24 Gross proceeds received by the tax credit transferor must be assigned to North 25 <u>Dakota</u>. The amount assigned under this subsection cannot be reduced by the 26 taxpayer's income apportioned to North Dakota or any North Dakota net 27 operating loss of the taxpayer. 28 The tax commissioner has four years after the date of the credit assignment to 29 audit the returns of the credit transferor and the purchaser to verify the 30 correctness of the amount of the transferred credit and if necessary assess the

1	credit purchaser if additional tax is found due. This subdivision does not limit or
2	restrict any other time period prescribed in this chapter for the assessment of tax.
3	h. The tax commissioner may adopt rules to establish necessary administrative
4	provisions for the credit under this section, including provisions to permit
5	verification of the validity and timeliness of the transferred tax credit.
6	SECTION 2. A new subsection to section 57-38-57 of the North Dakota Century Code is
7	created and enacted as follows:
8	The tax commissioner, upon written request, may disclose a taxpayer's name and
9	address, the amount of tax credits the taxpayer claimed under section 57-38-01.26,
0	and the name and address of the angel fund with which the taxpayer invested.
11	SECTION 2. REPORT TO THE LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT. During the 2011-12 and
2	2013-14 interims, the tax commissioner shall report to the legislative management on the status
3	of the transferability of tax credits under the angel fund tax credit.the number of in-state and
4	out-of-state investors, amount of investment, and amount of tax credits accrued, claimed, and
5	transferred by each individual angel fund.
6	SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE - EXPIRATION DATE. Section 1 of this This Act is effective
7	for the first four taxable years beginning after December 31, 2010, and is thereafter ineffective.
8	Section 2 of this Act is effective for angel fund investments made after June 30, 2011.
