

**FIRST ENGROSSMENT
with House Amendments
ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2053**

Introduced by

Legislative Management

(Tribal and State Relations Committee)

1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 54-35-23 of the North Dakota Century Code,
2 relating to extension and duties of the committee on tribal and state relations.

3 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

4 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 54-35-23 of the North Dakota Century Code is
5 amended and reenacted as follows:

6 **54-35-23. (Effective through July 31, 2014~~2013~~) Committee on tribal and state**
7 **relations - Membership - Duties.**

8 1. The committee on tribal and state relations is composed of seven members as follows:

9 a. ~~The~~A chairman designated by the chairman of the legislative management ~~or the~~
10 ~~chairman's designee~~;

11 b. Three members of the house of representatives, two of whom must be selected
12 by the leader representing the majority faction of the house of representatives
13 and one of whom must be selected by the leader representing the minority
14 faction of the house of representatives; and

15 c. Three members of the senate, two of whom must be selected by the leader
16 representing the majority faction of the senate and one of whom must be
17 selected by the leader representing the minority faction of the senate.

18 2. ~~The chairman of the legislative management, or the chairman's designee, shall serve~~
19 ~~as chairman of the committee.~~

20 3. The committee shall meet at such times and places as determined by the chairman.
21 The legislative council shall provide staffing for the committee.

22 4.3. The committee shall conduct joint meetings with the ~~native American~~North Dakota
23 ~~tribal citizens' governments'~~ task force to study tribal-state issues, including
24 government-to-government relations, ~~the delivery of~~human services, ~~ease~~

1 management services, ~~child support enforcement~~ education, corrections, and issues
2 related to the promotion of economic development. During the 2011-12 interim, the
3 committee also shall study whether the members of the North Dakota tribal
4 governments' task force should be voting members of the committee. After the joint
5 meetings have concluded, the committee shall meet to prepare a report on its findings
6 and recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement those
7 recommendations, to the legislative management.

8 5.4. The members of the committee are entitled to compensation from the legislative
9 council for attendance at committee meetings at the rate provided for members of the
10 legislative assembly for attendance at interim committee meetings and are entitled to
11 reimbursement for expenses incurred in attending the meetings in the amounts
12 provided by law for other state officers.

- 13 6-a.5. a. The ~~native American~~ North Dakota tribal citizens' governments' task force is
14 composed of six members as follows:
- 15 (1) The executive director of the Indian affairs commission, or the executive
16 director's designee;
- 17 (2) The chairman of the Standing Rock Sioux Tribe, or the chairman's
18 designee;
- 19 (3) The chairman of the Spirit Lake Tribe, or the chairman's designee;
- 20 (4) The chairman of the Three Affiliated Tribes of the Fort Berthold Reservation,
21 or the chairman's designee;
- 22 (5) The chairman of the Turtle Mountain Band of Chippewa Indians, or the
23 chairman's designee; and
- 24 (6) The chairman of the Sisseton-Wahpeton Oyate of the Lake Traverse
25 Reservation, or the chairman's designee.
- 26 b. If the executive director of the Indian affairs commission or any of the tribal
27 chairmen appoint a designee to serve on the task force, only one individual may
28 serve as that designee during the biennium. A substitute designee may be
29 appointed by the executive director of the Indian affairs commission or a tribal
30 chairman in the event of the death, incapacity, resignation, or refusal to serve of
31 the initial designee.
