## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5	SECTION 1. A	new subdivision to subsection 2 of section 57-38-30.3 of the North Dakota

9	resp	onder for less than a full taxable year is entitled to a percentage of the
10	<u>redu</u>	action under this section equal to the number of days in the taxable year the
11	taxp	ayer serves as a volunteer emergency responder divided by the number of
12	days	s in the taxable year. An organization using the services of volunteer
13	<u>eme</u>	ergency responders shall maintain a roster of volunteer emergency
14	<u>resp</u>	onders in good standing who provide services to the organization, with the
15	<u>beg</u> i	inning and ending dates of service for each individual for the taxable year. An
16	<u>org</u> a	anization shall provide the roster to the tax commissioner upon request. For
17	purp	poses of this subdivision, "volunteer emergency responder" means an
18	indiv	vidual in good standing as:
19	<u>(1)</u>	Within the definition of emergency medical services personnel or
20		emergency medical services professional under section 23-27-02 and who
21		is a volunteer as that term is defined in section 23-27-04.1; or
22	<u>(2)</u>	A volunteer firefighter as that term is defined in section 18-04-07.
23	SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act is effective for taxable years beginning after	
24	December 31, 2010.
