- A BILL for an Act to create and enact three new sections to chapter 15-52 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the school of medicine and health sciences advisory council; to
- 3 amend and reenact sections 15-52-01,15-52-03,15-52-04, 23-42-01, 23-42-04, 23-42-05, and
- 4 54-27-25 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the purpose of the school of medicine
- 5 and health sciences, the school of medicine and health sciences advisory council, the school of
- 6 medicine and health sciences strategic plan, the tobacco prevention and control program, and
- 7 the tobacco settlement trust fund; to provide an appropriation; and to provide for a transfer.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 9 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 15-52-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 11 15-52-01. School of medicine and health sciences.
 - The primary purpose of the university of North Dakota school of medicine and health sciences is to educate increase the health care workforce in the state by educating physicians, with a focus on the education of primary care physicians, and other health professionals and to enhance the quality of life in North Dakota. Other purposes include the discovery of knowledge that benefits the people of this state and enhances the quality of their lives.
- 17 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 15-52-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 15-52-03. School of medicine and health sciences advisory council Members, terms,
 meetings.
 - To assure the proper coordination of the university of North Dakota school of medicine and health sciences with all other health activities of the state, a permanent school of medicine and health sciences advisory council is established to perform the duties in section 15-52-04.

1	2.	The council consists of fifteen members:				
2		a. (1) Two members of the senate, one of whom must be from the majority party				
3		and one of whom must be from the minority party, selected by the chairman				
4		of the legislative management; and				
5		(2) Two members of the house of representatives, one of whom must be from				
6		the majority party and one of whom must be from the minority party, to be				
7		selected by the chairman of the legislative management;				
8		b. One member selected by each of the following:				
9		(1) The department of human services;				
10		(2) The state board of higher education;				
11		(3) The state department of health;				
12		(4) The North Dakota medical association;				
13		(5) The North Dakota healthcare association;				
14		(6) The veterans administration hospital in Fargo; and				
15		(7) The university of North Dakota center for rural health; and				
16		c. Four members selected by the dean of the university of North Dakota school of				
17		medicine and health sciences, one from each of the four campuses of the school				
18		of medicine and health sciences with headquarters in Bismarck, Fargo, Grand-				
19		Forks, and Minot.				
20	3.	The representatives named by the state agencies and boards must be selected to				
21		serve as members of the advisory council for periods of at least one year, but may not				
22		serve longer than their term of office on the public agency. The representatives from				
23		the North Dakota state medical association and the North Dakota healthcare				
24		association shall serve a term of three years or until their successors are named and				
25		qualified.				
26	4.	The council shall name its own chairman and the dean of the university of North				
27		Dakota school of medicine and health sciences shall serve as executive secretary of				
28		the council. The council shall meet not less than twice each year, and, from time to-				
29		time, on its own motion or upon request of the university administration. The council

30	SECTION 3. A new section to chapter 15-52 of the North Dakota Century Code is created					
31	and ena	cted	as fo	llows:		

1 <u>Terms of office.</u>

- a. The term of office for each member of the legislative assembly appointed to the
 council is four years. A member of the legislative assembly may not serve more
 than two consecutive terms.
 - b. The term of office for each member appointed by the governor is three years, except that the terms of those members initially appointed must be staggered so that four serve for terms of two years and four serve for terms of three years. A member appointed by the governor may not serve more than two consecutive terms.
 - c. The term of office for each member appointed by the dean of the university of North Dakota school of medicine and health sciences is three years. A member appointed by the dean may not serve more than two consecutive terms.
 - 2. Any member who is absent from more than three council meetings within a two-year period is precluded from further service on the council and a new member must be appointed, as provided for in section 15-52-03, to complete the term of office.
 - **SECTION 4.** A new section to chapter 15-52 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

Compensation.

- 1. Each member of the council, other than one who is employed by the state, is entitled to receive compensation in the amount of one hundred forty-eight dollars per day plus reimbursement for expenses as provided by law for state officers, if the member is attending meetings or participating in meetings through electronic means, or if the member is performing duties directed by the council.
- Each member of the council who is employed by the state is entitled to receive reimbursement for expenses as provided by law for state officers, if the member is attending meetings or participating in meetings through electronic means, or if the member is performing duties directed by the council.
- **SECTION 5.** A new section to chapter 15-52 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

1 **Chairman - Meetings.** 2 The council shall elect one member to serve as the chairman. The council must meet at 3 least four times each year and may meet at its own call or at the request of university 4 administration. 5 SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 15-52-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is 6 amended and reenacted as follows: 7 15-52-04. Duties of council. 8 The advisory council, in consultation with the school of medicine and health sciences 9 and the other agencies, associations, and institutions represented on the advisory 10 council, shall study and make recommendations regarding the strategic plan, 11 programs, and facilities of the school of medicine and health sciences. 12 Biennially Annually, the advisory council shall submit a report, together with its 13 recommendations and outcomes, to the agencies, associations, and institutions 14 represented on the advisory council, to the university of North Dakota, to the budget 15 section, and to the legislative eouncilmanagement. In addition, the advisory council 16 shall submit a report together with its recommendations and outcomes to the 17 appropriations committees of the house and senate during each legislative session. 18 3. a. The report must describe the advisory council's recommendations regarding the 19 strategic plan, programs, and facilities of the school of medicine and health 20 sciences as developed under subsection 1. The recommendations for 21 implementing strategies through the school of medicine and health sciences or 22 other agencies and institutions must: 23 (1) Address the health care needs of the people of the state; and 24 (2) Provide information regarding the state's health care workforce needs; 25 (3)Provide for increasing the number of primary care physicians practicing in 26 the state; 27 (4) Collaborate with local organizations and political subdivisions to place 28 primary care physicians in rural parts of the state; 29 <u>(5)</u> Allow for the recruitment of students into specialized programs identified as 30 necessary for addressing the health care needs of the state;

1			<u>(6)</u>	Provide for increasing the number of resident training positions available to
2				train primary care physicians in the state, including incentives to establish
3				resident training programs; and
4			<u>(7)</u>	Provide that after meeting commitments to the western interstate
5				commission for higher education and the Indians into medicine program,
6				university of North Dakota school of medicine and health sciences students
7				fill at least eighty percent of the resident training positions available in the
8				state.

- "Executive committee" means the three-member committee selected by the advisory
 committee and charged with implementation and administration of the comprehensive
 plan.
 - 4. "Tobacco prevention and control fund" consists of all principal and interest of the tobacco prevention and control trust fund established by section 54-27-25.
- **SECTION 8. AMENDMENT.** Section 23-42-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is 7 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 8 23-42-04. Powers of the executive committee.
 - To implement the purpose of this chapter and, in addition to any other authority granted elsewhere in this chapter, to support its efforts and implement the comprehensive plan, the executive committee may employ staff and fix their compensation, accept grants, property, and gifts, enter contracts, make loans, provide grants, borrow money, lease property, providedirection to the state investment board for investment of the tobacco prevention and control fund, and take any action that any private individual, corporation, or limited liability company lawfully may do except as restricted by the provisions of this chapter.
- SECTION 9. AMENDMENT. Section 23-42-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- **23-42-05. Development of the comprehensive plan.**
 - The advisory committee shall develop the initial comprehensive plan within one hundred eighty days of the initial meeting of the advisory committee. The comprehensive plan must be funded at a level equal to or greater than the centers for disease control recommended funding level. Funding for the comprehensive plan must supplement and may not supplant any funding that in the absence of this chapter would be or has been provided for the community health trust fund or other health initiatives.
 - **SECTION 10. AMENDMENT.** Section 54-27-25 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
 - 54-27-25. Tobacco settlement trust fund Interest on fund Uses.
 - There is created in the state treasury a tobacco settlement trust fund. The fund consists of the tobacco settlement dollars obtained by the state under subsection IX(c)
 (1) of the master settlement agreement and consent agreement adopted by the east central judicial district court in its judgment entered December 28, 1998 [Civil

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- No. 98-3778] in State of North Dakota, ex rel. Heidi Heitkamp v. Philip Morris, Inc.

 Except as provided in subsection 2, moneys received by the state under

 subsection IX(c)(1) must be deposited in the fund. Interest earned on the fund must be

 credited to the fund and deposited in the fund. The principal and interest of the fund

 must be allocated as follows:
 - a. Transfers to a community health trust fund to be administered by the state department of health. The state department of health may use funds as appropriated for community-based public health programs and other public health programs, including programs with emphasis on preventing or reducing tobacco usage in this state. Transfers under this subsection must equal ten percent of total annual transfers from the tobacco settlement trust fund of which a minimum of eighty percent must be used for tobacco prevention and control.
 - b. Transfers to the common schools trust fund to become a part of the principal of that fund. Transfers under this subsection must equal forty-five percent of total annual transfers from the tobacco settlement trust fund.
 - c. Transfers to the water development trust fund to be used to address the long-term water development and management needs of the state. Transfers under this subsection must equal forty-five percent of the total annual transfers from the tobacco settlement trust fund.
 - 2. There is created in the state treasury a tobacco prevention and controlhealth care programs trust fund. The fund consists of the tobacco settlement dollars obtained by the state under section IX(c)(2) of the agreement adopted by the east central judicial district court in its judgment entered December 28, 1998 [Civil No. 98-3778] in State of North Dakota, ex rel. Heidi Heitkamp v. Philip Morris, Inc. Interest earned on the fund must be credited to the fund and deposited in the fund. Moneys received intoin the fund are to be administered by the executive committee for the purpose of creating and implementing the comprehensive plan. If in any biennium, the tobacco preventionand control trust fund does not have adequate dollars to fund a comprehensive plan, the treasurer shall transfer money from the water development trust fund to the tobacco prevention and control trust fund in an amount equal to the amount determined necessary by the executive committee to fund a comprehensive-

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1		planavailable, subject to legislative appropriations, for defraying the expenses of the
2		comprehensive tobacco control advisory committee and the university of North Dakota
3		school of medicine and health sciences projects and programs related to increasing
4		the health care workforce in the state, with a focus on the education of primary care
5		physicians.
6	3.	Transfers to the funds under this section must be made within thirty days of receipt by
7		the state.
8	SEC	CTION 11. APPROPRIATION - HEALTH SCIENCES FACILITY PROJECT. There is
9	appropr	iated out of any moneys in the health care programs trust fund in the state treasury, not
10	otherwis	se appropriated, the sum of \$28,900,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary,
11	to the u	niversity of North Dakota for the purpose of constructing a new health sciences facility at
12	the univ	ersity of North Dakota, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30,
13	2013.	
14	SEC	CTION 12. APPROPRIATION - MEDICAL SCHOOL PROGRAM EXPANSION. There is
15	appropr	iated out of any moneys in the health care programs trust fund in the state treasury, not
16	otherwis	se appropriated, the sum of \$5,800,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to
17	the univ	ersity of North Dakota school of medicine and health sciences for the purpose of
18	increasi	ng the number of medical and health sciences students at the university of North
19	Dakota	school of medicine and health sciences and the number of residency training positions
20	in the st	ate, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013.
21	SEC	CTION 13. APPROPRIATION - COMPREHENSIVE TOBACCO CONTROL ADVISORY
22	COMMI	TTEE. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the health care programs trust fund
23	in the st	ate treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$9,000,000, or so much of the sum
24	as may	be necessary, to the comprehensive tobacco control advisory committee for the purpose
25	of defra	ying the expenses of the committee, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and
26	ending .	June 30, 2013.
27	SEC	CTION 14. TRANSFER - TOBACCO PREVENTION AND CONTROL TRUST FUND -
28	HEALTI	H CARE PROGRAMS TRUST FUND. The office of management and budget shall
29	transfer	any balance remaining in the tobacco prevention and control trust fund at the end of the
