3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 4 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 39-21-44.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

- <u>A</u> vehicle may <u>not</u> be driven or moved on any highway unless it is so constructed or loaded as to prevent <u>itsthe</u> contents from dropping, sifting, leaking, or otherwise escaping <u>therefromfrom the vehicle</u>, except that sand may be dropped for the purpose of securing traction, or water or other substance may be sprinkled on a roadway in cleaning or maintaining the roadway. No person
 - 2. An individual may not operate on any highway any vehicle with any load unless the load and any covering thereonon the load is securely fastened so as to prevent saidthe covering or load from becoming loose, detached, or in any manner a hazard to other users of the highway.
- 3. An individual operating a vehicle transporting sand, gravel, aggregate, dirt, lime rock,
 silica, or similar material on a highway shall ensure that the cargo compartment of the
 vehicle is securely covered if:
 - a. The vertical distance from the top of an exterior wall of the cargo compartment to the load, when measured downward along the inside surface of the wall, is less than six inches [15.24 centimeters]; or
 - b. The horizontal distance from the top of an exterior wall of the cargo compartment
 to the load is less than two feet [60.96 centimeters].
