PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL NO. 1270

Page 1, line 1, after "A BILL" replace the remainder of the bill with "for an Act to amend and reenact sections 15.1-13-09 and 15.1-13-20 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the licensing of teachers from other states; and to repeal section 15.1-13-21 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to reciprocal teaching licenses.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-13-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

15.1-13-09. Board powers.

The board may:

- 1. Adopt rules in accordance with chapter 28-32.
- 2. Contract with other states for the reciprocal approval of teacher preparation programs.
- 3. Apply for and receive federal or other funds on behalf of the state for purposes related to its duties.
- 4.3. Perform any duty related to the improvement of instruction through teacher education, professional development, and continuing education programs.

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-13-20 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

15.1-13-20. Interim reciprocal teaching license - Period of validity Applicants licensed in other states.

- 1. The board shall grant an interim reciprocala teaching license inaccordance with sections 15.1-18-02 and 15.1-18-03 to an individualto an applicant who holds a regular teaching license or certificate from another state, provided:
 - a. The individual'sapplicant's licensure or certification is based upon a
 minimum of a bachelor's degree with a major that meets the issuing
 state's requirements in early childhood education, elementary
 education, middle level education, or a content area taught at a public
 high school;
 - b. The individual's applicant's licensure or certification is based upon the completion of a professional education sequence from a state-approved teacher education program and includes supervised student teaching;

- The individual applicant submits to the required fee and a criminal history record check, as required of initial applicants by this chapter; and
- d. The criminal history record check reveals nothing for which a North Dakota applicant would be denied initial licensure; and.
- e. The individual submits a plan for meeting all requirements necessary to become a licensed teacher in this state.
- 2. An interim reciprocal license granted under this section is valid for twoyears.
- 3. The individual shall submit evidence of progress on the plan required by subsection 1 to the board prior to renewal of the interim reciprocal license.
- 4. The board may renew the interim reciprocal license for one additional two-year period if the board finds that the individual has demonstrated satisfactory progress.
- Notwithstanding any other law, an interim reciprocal license granted under this section is the equivalent of a teaching license granted under this chapter.
- 2. A license granted under this section is valid for two years if the applicant has not been licensed in another state for at least eighteen months. In all other cases, a license granted under this section is valid for five years.

SECTION 3. Section 15.1-13-21 of the North Dakota Century Code is repealed."
