ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1224

- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new subdivision to subsection 1 of section 12.1-31-01
- 2 and a new section to chapter 12.1-31 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to disorderly
- 3 conduct and surreptitious intrusion or interference with privacy; and to provide a penalty.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. A new subdivision to subsection 1 of section 12.1-31-01 of the North Dakota
6 Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

- 7 <u>Uses a fixed optical device that enhances or records a visual occurrence to view</u>
- 8 through any window of another person's property; or uses a surveillance camera
- 9 to capture an image from the dwelling or accessory structure of another person;
- 10 <u>however, an individual using a surveillance camera has seven days from notice</u>
- 11 by a law enforcement officer to direct or shield the camera so as to not capture
- an image from another person's dwelling or accessory structure before there is
 an offense.
- 14 **SECTION 2.** A new section to chapter 12.1-31 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
- 15 and enacted as follows:

16 <u>Surreptitious intrusion or interference with privacy.</u>

- 17 <u>1.</u> <u>An individual is guilty of a class B misdemeanor if, with intent to intrude upon or</u>
 18 <u>interfere with the privacy of another, the individual:</u>
- 19a.Enters upon another's property and surreptitiously gazes, stares, or peeps into a20house or place of dwelling of another; or
- b. Enters upon another's property and surreptitiously installs or uses any device for
 observing, photographing, recording, amplifying, or broadcasting sounds or
 events from a house or place of dwelling of another.

8			sleeping room in a hotel, or other place where a reasonable individual would
9			have an expectation of privacy.
