- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new subsection to section 39-01-01, a new paragraph to
- 2 subdivision b of subsection 3 of section 39-06.1-10, and a new section to chapter 39-08 of the
- 3 North Dakota Century Code, relating to demerit points and using an electronic communication
- 4 device; to amend and reenact subsection 1 of section 39-06-03 and sections 39-06-04,
- 5 39-06-17, and 39-06.1-09 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to a graduated operator's
- 6 license and a moving violation; and to provide for application.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 8 **SECTION 1.** A new subsection to section 39-01-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 9 created and enacted as follows:
- 10 "Electronic communication device" means an electronic device, including a wireless
- 11 <u>telephone, personal digital assistant, a portable or mobile computer or other device,</u>
- 12 and video display equipment. The term does not include a global positioning system or
- 13 <u>navigation system or a device that is physically or electronically integrated into the</u>
 14 motor vehicle.
- SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 39-06-03 of the North Dakota Century
 Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 17 1. To any person who is under the age of sixteen years, except that the director may
- 18 issue a restricted permit or license as hereinafter provided in<u>under</u> sections 39-06-05
- 19 and 39-06-17 to any person who is less than sixteen years of age .
- 20 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 39-06-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is

21 amended and reenacted as follows:

- 22 **39-06-04**. Instruction permit.
- Any personresident of this state who is at least fourteen years of age may apply to the
 director for ana class D instruction permit.

1	<u>2.</u>	The director may issue to the applicant ana class D instruction permit that entitles the				
2		applicant while having suchthe permit in the permittee's immediate possession to drive				
3		a motor vehicle upon the public highways for a period of one year when. if the				
4		individual:				
5		a. Has successfully passed a standard written rules of the road knowledge test				
6		prescribed by the director;				
7		b. Has successfully passed a vision examination; and				
8		c. Has the written approval of the individual's parent or legal guardian.				
9	<u>3.</u>	The permittee must be accompanied by a licensed operator who holds a license				
10		corresponding to the vehicle the permittee operates, who is at least eighteen years of				
11		age, who has had at least three years of driving experience, and who is occupying a				
12		seat beside the driver. An individual other than the supervising driver and the				
13		permitholder may not be in the front seat unless the vehicle has only a front seat, in				
14		which case, the supervising driver must be seated next to the permitholder. Persons-				
15		holding an instruction permit for the operation of a motorcycle shall operate the				
16		motorcycle only during hours when the use of headlights is not required pursuant to				
17		section 39-21-01, and may not carry or transport any passenger. Any instruction permit				
18		may be renewed or a new permit issued for an additional period.				
19	<u>4.</u>	A personAn individual who is not yet eighteen years of age is not eligible for a license				
20		until that personindividual has had an instruction permit issued for at least six months				
21		or at least twelve months if under the age of sixteen. The director may recognize an				
22		instruction permit issued by another jurisdiction in computing the six-month or				
23		twelve-month instructional period.				
24	<u>5.</u>	The permittee may not operate an electronic communication device to talk, compose,				
25		read, or send an electronic message while operating a motor vehicle that is in motion				
26		unless the sole purpose of operating the device is to obtain emergency assistance, to				
27		prevent a crime about to be committed, or in the reasonable belief that an individual's				
28		life or safety is in danger.				
29	<u>6.</u>	A resident of this state who is at least fourteen years of age may apply to the director				
30		for a class M learner's permit under section 39-06-14. An individual holding a class M				
31		learner's permit for the operation of a motorcycle may not operate the motorcycle

1		during the hours when the use of headlights are required under section 39-21-01 or						
2		carry or transport any passenger. Any learner's permit may be renewed or a new						
3		permit issued for an additional period.						
4	<u>7.</u>	The director may issue a commercial driver's instruction permit under section						
5		<u>39-06.2-07.</u>						
6	SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 39-06-17 of the North Dakota Century Code is							
7	amended and reenacted as follows:							
8	39-06-17. Restricted licenses - Penalty for violation.							
9	1.	The director, upon issuing an operator's license or a temporary restricted operator's						
10		license pursuant to section 39-06.1-11, has authority to impose restrictions suitable to						
11		the licensee's driving ability with respect to the type of or special mechanical control						
12		devices required on a motor vehicle which the licensee may operate or such other						
13		restrictions applicable to the licensee as the director may determine to be appropriate						
14		to assure the safe operation of a motor vehicle by the licensee.						
15	2.	The director may either issue a special restricted license or may set forth such state						
16		the restrictions upon the usual license form. The In the same manner, the director shall						
17		likewise restrict licenses pursuant to the requirements of under section 39-16.1-09.						
18	3.	A restricted operator's license or permit to operate the parent's or guardian's						
19		automobile, or an automobile which is equipped with dual controls and while						
20		accompanied by a qualified instructor, may be issued to any child, who is at least						
21		fourteen years of age, and otherwise qualified, upon the written recommendation of						
22		the parent or guardian. A child may operate an automobile that is not the parent's or						
23		guardian's to take the road test. No operator's license may be issued until the child,						
24		accompanied by the parent or guardian, appears in person and satisfies the director						
25		that:						
26		a. The child is at least fourteen years of age.						
27		b. The child is qualified to operate an automobile safely.						
28		c. It is necessary for the child to drive the parent's or guardian's automobile without						
29		being accompanied by an adult.						
30		d. The child has:						

1			(1)	CompletedSuccessfully completed an approved driver's education course
2				that includes a course of classroom instruction and a course of
3				behind-the-wheel instruction acceptable to the director; or
4			(2)	Successfully completed a course at an approved commercial driver training
5				school.
6		<u>e.</u>	<u>The</u>	child has accumulated a minimum of fifty hours of supervised,
7			<u>beh</u>	ind-the-wheel driving experience in various driving conditions and situations
8			<u>that</u>	include night driving; driving on gravel, dirt, or aggregate surface road;
9			<u>driv</u>	ing in both rural and urban conditions; and winter driving conditions.
10		The	pare	nt or guardian at all times is responsible for any and all damages growing out
11		of th	ne ne	gligent operation of a motor vehicle by any such child. The provisions of this
12		sub	sectio	on do not authorize the child to drive a commercial truck, motorbus, or taxicab
13		exc	ept th	he holder of a class D license, fourteen or fifteen years of age, may drive a
14		farn	n mot	or vehicle having a gross weight of fifty thousand pounds [22679.62
15		kilo	gram	s] when used to transport agricultural products, farm machinery, or farm
16		sup	plies	to or from a farm when so operated within one hundred fifty miles [241.40

19		rest	rictio	ns of such a license <u>, the director may</u> suspend or revoke the samelicense but

22	5.	It is	a cla	ss B misdemeanor for any person to operate a motor vehicle in any manner
23		in v	iolatio	on of the restrictions imposed in a restricted license issued to that person
24		othe	er tha	n restrictions imposed under subsection 6. If the restricted license was issued
25		und	er se	ction 39-06.1-11 and the underlying suspension was imposed for a violation
26		of s	ectio	n 39-08-01 or equivalent ordinance, or is governed by chapter 39-20,
27		pun	ishm	ent is as provided in subsection 2 of section 39-06-42 and upon receiving
28		noti	ce of	the conviction the director shall revoke, without opportunity for hearing, the
29		lice	nsee'	s restricted license and shall extend the underlying suspension for a like
30		peri	iod of	not more than one year. The director may not issue a restricted license for
31		the	exter	nded period of suspension imposed under this subsection. If the conviction

1		refe	erred to in this section is reversed by an appellate court, the director shall restore				
2		the person to the status held by the person prior to the conviction, including restora					
3		of driving privileges if appropriate.					
4	6.	A restricted license issued under subsection 3 to a child at least fourteen years of					
5		to o	perate a parent's or guardian's automobile authorizes the licenseholder to drive the				
6		type	e or class of motor vehicle specified on the restricted license only under the				
7		follo	following conditions:				
8		a.	A restricted licenseholder must be in possession of the license while operating				
9			the motor vehicle.				
10		b.	An individual holding a restricted driver's license driving a motor vehicle may not				
11			carry more passengers than the vehicle manufacturer's suggested passenger				
12			capacity.				
13		<u>C.</u>	An individual holding a restricted driver's license driving a motor vehicle may not				
14			operate an electronic communication device to talk, compose, read, or send an				
15			electronic message while operating a motor vehicle that is in motion unless the				
16			sole purpose of operating the device is to obtain emergency assistance, to				
17			prevent a crime about to be committed, or in the reasonable belief that an				
18			individual's life or safety is in danger.				
19		<u>d.</u>	An individual holding a restricted driver's license may not operate a motor vehicle				
20			between the later of sunset or nine p.m. and five a.m. unless a parent, legal				
21			guardian, or an individual eighteen years of age or older is in the front seat of the				
22			motor vehicle or the motor vehicle is being driven directly to or from work, an				
23			official school activity, or a religious activity.

26	39-06.1-09. Moving violation defined.						
27	For the purposes of sections 39-06.1-06 and 39-06.1-13, a "moving violation" means a						
28	violation of section 39-04-22, subsection 1 of section 39-04-37, section 39-04-55, 39-06-01,						
29	39-06-14, 39-06-16, section 7 of this Act, 39-09-04.1, 39-09-09, subsection 1 of section						
30	39-12-02, sections 39-12-04, 39-12-05, 39-12-06, 39-12-09, 39-24-02, or 39-24-09, except						
31	subdivisions b and c of subsection 5, or equivalent ordinances; or a violation of the provisions of

A new paragraph to subdivision b of subsection 3 of section 39-06.1-10 of the 6 North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows: 7 Driving in violation of the conditions of an instruction 2 points 8 permit 9 SECTION 7. A new section to chapter 39-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 10 and enacted as follows: 11 Use of an electronic communication device by minor prohibited. 12 An individual at least sixteen and under eighteen years of age who has been issued a 13 class D license may not operate an electronic communication device to talk, compose, read, or 14 send an electronic message while operating a motor vehicle that is in motion unless the sole 15 purpose of operating the device is to obtain emergency assistance, to prevent a crime about to 16 be committed, or in the reasonable belief that an individual's life or safety is in danger. 17 SECTION 8. APPLICATION. This Act applies to permits and licenses issued after 18 January 1, 2012, and does not effect a valid permit or license issued before the effective date of 19 this Act.
