- 1 A BILL for an Act to create a new section to chapter 43-52 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to the regulation of sign language interpreters; to amend and reenact sections

3 43-52-01, 43-52-02, and 43-52-03 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to regulation of

4 sign language interpreters; to provide a penalty; and to provide an effective date.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 43-52-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is
7 amended and reenacted as follows:

8 **43-52-01. Definitions.**

9 As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires:

- "Consumer" means an individual who is deaf, deaf-blind, speech-impaired,
 hard-of-hearing, or who requires special communication techniques in order to
- 12 communicate.
- 13 2. "Interpreter" means an individual who engages in the practice of interpreting.
- "Interpreting" means the translating or transliterating of English concepts to any
 necessary specialized vocabulary used by a consumer or translating of a consumer's
 specialized vocabulary to English concepts. Necessary specialized vocabularies
 include American sign language, English-based sign language, and oral interpreting.
- "Nationally recognized certification" means certification granted by a national
 organization that is based on a skills assessment of the applicant. These organizations
 include the registry of interpreters for the deaf and the national association of the deaf.
- 21 <u>5.</u> <u>"Video remote interpreting" is a process that allows an individual who is deaf or</u>
- 22 <u>hard-of-hearing to communicate with a hearing individual at the same location through</u>
- 23 <u>an interpreter displayed via videoconferencing equipment or through a television with</u>
- 24 <u>a videophone.</u>

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1	SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 43-52-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
2	amended and reenacted as follows:		
3	43-52-02. Practice of interpreting.		
4	An individual may not practice or represent as an interpreter for deaf, deaf-blind,		
5	speech-impaired, or hard-of-hearing individuals in the state unless the individual holds a valid		
6	nationally recognized certification. However, an individual who was practicing as an interpreter		
7	in this state before August 1, 2001, has until July 31, 2003, to meet the certification requirement		
8	under this section. A person may not provide video remote interpreting services in this state		
9	unless certified under this chapter.		
10	SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 43-52-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
11	amended and reenacted as follows:		
12	43-52-03. Exceptions.		
13	This chapter does not prevent or restrict:		
14	1.	A nonresident interpreter working in this state not more than nineteen days per year.	
15	2.	An interpreter working at a religious activity.	
16	3.	An interpreter working as a volunteer without compensation.	
17	4.	An interpreter working in an emergency. An emergency is a situation in which the	
18		consumer decides that the length of time needed to obtain a licensed interpreter is	
19		likely to cause injury or loss to the consumer.	
20	5.	The activities and services of an interpreter intern or student-in-training enrolled in a	
21		program of study in interpreting at an accredited institution of higher learning;	
22		interpreting under the supervision of a licensed interpreter as part of a supervised	
23		program; and identified as an interpreter intern or student-in-training.	
24	6.	An individual using sign language or a manual communication system as a means of	
25		communication with or on behalf of a family member, a deaf individual, a deaf-blind	
26		individual, a speech-impaired individual, or hard-of-hearing individual who has	
27		specifically requested that use by that individual.	
28	7.	A communication made as a reasonable accommodation for the employment of a	
29		deaf, deaf-blind, speech-impaired, or hard-of-hearing individual.	

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1	8.	A communication with a deaf, deaf-blind, speech-impaired, or hard-of-hearing
2		individual who could not communicate using American sign language or English-based
3		sign language.
4	9.	An individual working in an elementary or secondary school who has successfully
5		completed a three-year educational interpreter certificate program of study or who has
6		passed the educational interpreter performance assessment at a level of 3.5 or higher.
7		The individual may work in the school setting without national certification until
8		August 1, 2005, if the individual is being mentored by a trained mentor who is either a
9		certified interpreter or a deaf adult. To continue working in the school setting after-
10		August 1, 2005, the individual must have obtained national certification.
11	10.	An individual who has successfully completed an accredited interpreter training
12		program from interpreting without certification for a period of up to two years from the
13		date of completion of the program if, during that period, the individual is mentored by a
14		trained mentor who is either a certified interpreter or a deaf adult.
15	SECTION 4. A new section to chapter 43-52 of the North Dakota Century Code is created	
16	and enacted as follows:	
17	<u>Pen</u>	alty - Civil penalty.
18	Any person who violates this chapter is guilty of a class B misdemeanor. In addition to the	
19	criminal penalties provided, the civil remedy of injunction is available to restrain and enjoin a	
20	violation of this chapter without proof of actual damages sustained by any person.	
21	SEC	TION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. Section 3 of this Act becomes effective on January 1,
22	2014.
