## 5 <u>Crop insurance development board - Membership - Terms.</u>

- 6 <u>1.</u> <u>The crop insurance development board consists of:</u>
  - a. <u>The governor or the governor's designee;</u>
- 8 <u>b.</u> <u>The agriculture commissioner or the commissioner's designee;</u>
- 9 <u>c.</u> <u>One individual appointed by the senate majority leader;</u>
- 10 <u>d.</u> <u>One individual appointed by the house majority leader;</u>
- 11 <u>e.</u> <u>One individual representing an agricultural organization in this state, appointed</u>
  12 <u>by the governor;</u>
- 13<u>f.</u>One individual representing an agricultural organization in this state, appointed14by the agriculture commissioner; and
- 15g.One individual involved in the crop insurance industry, appointed by the16agriculture commissioner.
- 17 <u>2.</u> <u>The term of each appointed member is two years and begins on July 1, 2011.</u>
- 18 <u>3.</u> <u>An appointed member may serve consecutive terms.</u>
- 19 <u>4.</u> If at any time a member ceases to possess any of the qualifications required by this
- 20 <u>section or otherwise terminates the appointment, the member's office is deemed</u>
- 21 vacant and must be filled in the same manner as the original appointment.

1	Crop insurance development board - Chairman.	
2	<u>1.</u>	Biennially, the crop insurance development board shall elect one member to serve as
3		the chairman. The chairman's term begins July 1, 2011. The chairman may serve
4		consecutive terms.
5	<u>2.</u>	The chairman shall call all meetings of the board.
6	<u>3.</u>	The board shall meet as often as necessary to fulfill its duties under section 4 of this
7		<u>Act.</u>
8	SECTION 3.	
9	Crop insurance development board - Compensation of board members.	
10	Each member of the crop insurance development board is entitled to receive compensation	
11	in the amount established by the board but not exceeding one hundred thirty-five dollars per	
12	day plus reimbursement for expenses as provided by law for state officers if the member is	
13	attending meetings or performing duties directed by the board.	
14	SECTION 4.	
15	Crop insurance development board - Duties.	
16	The crop insurance development board shall review and evaluate proposals submitted by	
17	individuals and by public and nonpublic entities pertaining to the development and	
18	implementation of crop insurance instruments. The board shall assess the feasibility and	
19	desirability of the proposals. For those proposals that the board determines viable, the board	
20	may award grants to assist with future actuarial and development costs. The board shall	
21	establish conditions pertaining to the awarding of grants, including the repayment of some or all	
22	of the grants with moneys received by the applicant from the federal crop insurance corporation	
23	for continued development of the proposal. The board shall forward any moneys received as	
24	repayme	ents under this section to the state treasurer for deposit in the general fund.

26	<u>Cor</u>	fidential information.
27	<u>All i</u>	nformation created, collected, and maintained by the board in the course of approving a
28	proposed concept for advanced payment is confidential.	
29	SECTION 6. APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general	
30	fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$1,000,000, or so much of the	
31	sum as	may be necessary, to the governor for the purpose of providing grants to public and

- 1 nonpublic entities pursuing the development and implementation of crop insurance instruments,
- 2 for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013.
