- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new chapter to title 43 of the North Dakota Century
- 2 Code, relating to registration of music therapists; and to provide for a penalty.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 4 SECTION 1. A new chapter to title 43 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and 5 enacted as follows:

- 7 "Certificate of registration" means a document issued by the registrar to an individual 1. 8 who meets the music therapist requirements under this chapter.
 - "Music therapist" is an individual who practices music therapy. <u>2.</u>
- 9 10 3. "Music therapy" is the specialized use of music and the materials of music to restore. 11 maintain, and improve the following areas of functioning: cognitive, psychological. 12 social or emotional, affective, physical, sensory or sensorimotor; motor, 13 communicative; and physiological functioning. Techniques used in the practice of 14 music therapy include the use of music to provide participatory individual and group 15 experiences; musical improvisation; therapeutic development of verbal skills and 16 nonverbal behavior; receptive music learning; lyric discussions; memory recall; music 17 and imagery; self-expression through composition and songwriting; socialization and 18 enhancement of self-esteem through music performance; relaxation to music, 19 including stress and pain management; learning through music; cultural and spiritual 20 expression; development of fine and gross motor skills through responses to rhythm; 21 respiratory and speech improvements through sound production; sensory integration

10	hold one	eself out as being a music therapist, or use a title or other designation indicating the	
11	person i	s a music therapist in this state unless that person holds a valid certificate of registration	
12	issued b	by the registrar under this chapter. The registration provisions of this chapter do not	
13	apply to licensed practitioners of professions who practice music therapy within the scope of		
14	practice of the profession for which they are licensed. This chapter does not exempt an		
15	individual who practices music therapy from regulatory provisions of any other profession for		
16	which that individual is licensed.		
17	Application for registration - Fees - Renewal.		
18	<u>1.</u>	To obtain a certificate of registration under this chapter, an applicant shall submit to the	
19		registrar a completed application, on forms the registrar prescribes, and shall pay the	
20		annual registration fee of one hundred dollars. A qualified applicant must be at least	
21		eighteen years of age.	
22	<u>2.</u>	Upon receipt of a completed application and the registration fee submitted by a	
23		qualified applicant, the registrar shall issue a certificate of registration to the applicant.	
24	<u>3.</u>	A certificate of registration is valid through December thirty-first of the year for which it	
25		is issued. A registrant shall renew the registration annually by submitting to the	
26		registrar the required renewal form, as prescribed by the registrar, and a renewal fee	
27		of one hundred dollars.	
28	Registrant duties - Rules - Deposit of fees.		
29	<u>1.</u>	The registrar shall designate on the certificate of registration that the registrant:	
30		a. Isis certified, registered, or accredited as a music therapist by a	
31		registrar-recognized national organization that certifies registers or accredits

3		b. Meets any education and experience requirements established by the registrar;

5		c. Meets any other requirements established by the registrant.
6	<u>2.</u>	The department of human services shall adopt rules as appropriate to implement this
7		<u>chapter.</u>
8	<u>3.2.</u>	Any moneys the registrar collects as registration fees or renewal fees under this
9		chapter must be deposited in the state department of human services health operating
0		fund in the state treasury and must be spent subject to appropriation by the legislative
11		assembly.

3	<u>Any</u>	person that fails to obtain a certificate of registration as required under this chapter is
4	guilty of	a class B misdemeanoran infraction.
