- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15.1-13 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the approval of theological studies instructors; and to amend and
- 3 reenact section 15.1-21-02.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to theological studies
- 4 courses.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 6 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 15.1-13 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 7 and enacted as follows:
- 8 Approval of theological studies instructors.
- 9 The board shall approve an individual to be an instructor of theological studies upon receipt
- of the application and fees required under section 15.1-13-11 and pending completion of the
- 11 <u>background check required by section 15.1-13-14, if the individual:</u>
- 12 <u>1. Holds a baccalaureate degree; and</u>
- 13 <u>2. Is recommended for approval as an instructor of theological studies by the governing</u>
- board of a nonpublic school offering a theological studies course.
- SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-21-02.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 17 15.1-21-02.1. High school graduation Diploma requirements.
- Except as provided in section 15.1-21-02.3, before a school district, a nonpublic high school, or the center for distance education issues a high school diploma to a student, the student must have successfully completed the following twenty-two units of high school
- 21 coursework:
- 1. Four units of English language arts from a sequence that includes literature,
- composition, and speech;
- 24 2. Three units of mathematics:
