- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 14-07.1 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to a domestic violence fatality review commission.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 14-07.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created

5 and enacted as follows:

6 **Domestic violence fatality review commission.**

- 7 <u>1.</u> <u>The attorney general's office may establish a domestic violence fatality review</u>
- 8 <u>commission to review domestic violence deaths that have occurred in the state. The</u>
- 9 domestic violence fatality review commission may review incidents in which the
- 10 investigation of fatal incidents of domestic violence has been completed or adjudicated
- 11 by law enforcement for the purpose of:
- 12 <u>a.</u> <u>Recommending policies and protocols to prevent the incidence of domestic</u>
 13 <u>violence and resulting fatalities; and</u>
- 14 <u>b.</u> Providing consultation and coordination for agencies involved in the prevention
 15 <u>and investigation of domestic violence.</u>
- 16 2. <u>The attorney general shall appoint the membership of the domestic violence fatality</u>
 17 <u>review commission, as appropriate, and may include representatives from:</u>
- 18 <u>a.</u> Law enforcement agencies within the state;
- 19 <u>b.</u> <u>County or city attorneys and public defenders, and the judiciary;</u>
- 20 <u>c.</u> <u>The medical examiner;</u>
- 21 <u>d.</u> <u>The department of corrections and rehabilitation;</u>
- 22 <u>e.</u> <u>Physicians and mental health professionals;</u>
- 23 <u>f.</u> <u>Employees of the state department of health and county social services;</u>

1		<u>g.</u>	Local civic agencies and organizations involved with crime victims and domestic
2			violence protection, reporting, counseling, and assistance;
3		<u>h.</u>	Other organizations, departments, and agencies determined to be appropriate;
4			and
5		<u>i.</u>	Other individuals serving on an ad hoc basis in association with a particular
6			review.
7	<u>3.</u>	<u>The</u>	commission may investigate and review the facts and circumstances of all deaths
8		<u>that</u>	occur in the state as a result of domestic violence.
9		<u>a.</u>	The review may include necessary and appropriate information, including current
10			laws and policies, actions taken by agencies and persons related to or involved
11			with the incident, criminal justice data collection and analysis, and other
12			information the commission determines to be relevant to the review.
13		<u>b.</u>	The confidential and other appropriate records of a department or agency of the
14			state or municipality relating to the domestic violence incident may be examined
15			by the commission. The domestic violence fatality review commission and each
16			member of the commission shall preserve the confidentiality of any records
17			examined.
18	<u>4.</u>	<u>The</u>	domestic violence fatality review commission shall report its findings and
19		reco	mmendations to the attorney general before December thirty-first of each year.
20	<u>5.</u>	Meetings of the domestic violence fatality review commission are closed to the public	
21		and	are not subject to section 44-04-19.
22	<u>6.</u>	The determinations, conclusions, and recommendations of the domestic violence	
23		<u>fata</u>	ity review commission are not admissible in a civil or criminal proceeding.
24	<u>7.</u>	Except for a public report issued by the attorney general's office, any information,	
25		records, or data collected by the commission are an otherwise exempt record. The	
26		<u>com</u>	mission may not use the information, records, or data for purposes other than
27		<u>thos</u>	e designated by this section.
