- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 4 of section 54-21.3-03 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the state building code.

## 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 4 of section 54-21.3-03 of the North Dakota
  Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
  - Neither the The state building code nor or a building code adopted by a city, township, or county may not include a requirement that fire sprinklers be installed in a single family dwelling or a residential building that contains no more than two dwelling units. The state building code, plumbing code, electrical code, or a building, plumbing, or electrical an equivalent code adopted by a city, township, or county may not include a requirement political subdivision must provide that buildings building designed for and used as a school portable classroom have a permanent foundation, permanent footings, a permanent bathroom if bathroom facilities are located in an adjacent building, permanent plumbing services or fixtures, or permanent electrical service. These portable classrooms are exempt from these provisions of a building code for tenyears after placement. A city, township, or county may require that a temporary foundation system be used that provides adequate anchoring and structural support. This subsection applies to cities or counties adopting a building code under a homerule chartermay be constructed and inspected as a temporary structure as defined by the state building code or may be permitted as a permanent school portable classroom. The foundation system of such a structure must comply with the recommendations of the manufacturer's engineering report for a preengineered unit or a structural engineer's report. Frost-free footings may not be required for a temporary structure that meets the requirements of the state building code unless required by an

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ı	engineering report. Temporary electrical and plumbing installations may be allowed for
2	any structure by the state agencies governing those areas of construction or the
3	applicable codes.
