- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 23-01 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the North Dakota immunization program; to amend and reenact
- 3 section 23-01-05.3 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to reporting immunization data;
- 4 and to provide an appropriation.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 23-01-05.3 of the North Dakota Century Code is
7 amended and reenacted as follows:

8 **23-01-05.3.** Immunization data.

9 The state department of health may establish an immunization information system and 1. 10 may require the childhood immunizations specified in subsection 1 of section 11 23-07-17.1 and other information be reported to the department. The state department 12 of health may only require the reporting of childhood immunizations and other data 13 upon completion of the immunization information reporting system. A health care 14 provider who administers a childhood immunization shall report the patient's 15 identifying information, the immunization that is administered, and other required 16 information to the department. The report must be submitted using electronic media. 17 and must contain the data content and use the format and codes specified by the 18 department. 19 2. If a health care provider fails to submit an immunization report required under this 20 section within four weeks of vaccination: 21 That health care provider may not order or receive any vaccine from the North <u>a.</u> 22 Dakota immunization program until that provider submits all reports required 23 under this section.

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1		<u>b.</u>	The state department of health shall make a report to that health care provider's				
2			occupational licensing entity outlining that provider's failure to comply with the				
3			reporting requirements under this section.				
4	<u>3.</u>	Not	Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a health care provider, elementary or				
5		sec	secondary school, early childhood facility, public or private postsecondary educational				
6		inst	itution, city or county board of health, district health unit, and the state health officer				
7		ma	may exchange immunization data in any manner with one another. Immunization data				
8		that	that may be exchanged under this section is limited to the date and type of				
9		imn	immunization administered to a patient and may be exchanged regardless of the date				
10		of tl	of the immunization.				
11	SEC	TION 2. A new section to chapter 23-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is created					
12	and ena	cted as follows:					
13	<u>lmn</u>	nunization program - Provider choice - Purchasing.					
14	<u>1.</u>	As used in this section:					
15		<u>a.</u>	"Department" means the state department of health.				
16		<u>b.</u>	"North Dakota immunization advisory committee" means the group of private				
17			health care providers, local public health units, department staff, and other				
18			applicable individuals which makes immunization and vaccine selection				
19			recommendations to the North Dakota immunization program.				
20		<u>C.</u>	"North Dakota immunization program" means the program administered by the				
21			department to provide vaccinations to North Dakota children consistent with state				
22			and federal law.				
23		<u>d.</u>	"Program-eligible child" means any child, who is under nineteen years of age,				
24			whose custodial parent or legal guardian resides in this state.				
25		<u>e.</u>	"Vaccine" means any vaccine recommended by the federal advisory committee				
26			on immunization practices of the centers for disease control and prevention.				
27		<u>f.</u>	"Vaccines for children program" is a federally funded program that provides				
28			vaccines at no cost to eligible children pursuant to section 1928 of the Social				
29			Security Act [42 U.S.C. 1396s].				
30	<u>2.</u>	As	part of the North Dakota immunization program:				

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1	<u>a.</u>		department shall implement a provider choice system as part of the state's			
2		<u>imp</u>	ementation of the vaccines for children program. This provider choice system			
3		mus	t provide a health care provider participating in the state's vaccines for			
4		<u>chilo</u>	dren program or in any other immunization program for children, adolescents,			
5		<u>or a</u>	dults which is administered through the state using federal or state funds,			
6		<u>may</u>	v select any licensed vaccine, including combination vaccines, and any			
7		<u>dos</u>	age forms that have in effect a recommendation from the federal advisory			
8		<u>com</u>	mittee on immunization practices. This subsection does not apply in the			
9		eve	nt of a disaster, public health emergency, terrorist attack, hostile military or			
10		para	amilitary action, or extraordinary law enforcement emergency.			
11	<u>b.</u>	<u>The</u>	department shall establish a program through which the department			
12		pure	chases vaccines through the federal vaccine purchasing contract.			
13		<u>(1)</u>	The department shall supply public health units with the purchased			
14			vaccines. A public health unit that receives vaccines under this subdivision			
15			shall administer the vaccines to program-eligible children.			
16		<u>(2)</u>	A public health unit that receives vaccines under this purchasing program			
17			may not bill an insurer for the cost of the vaccine but may charge an			
18			administration fee.			
19		<u>(3)</u>	The department shall fund this purchasing program through participation in			
20			the vaccines for children program, the federal section 317 vaccine program,			
21			and state funds appropriated for this purpose. If it appears there will be			
22			inadequate funds to fund this purchasing program, the department shall			
23			petition the emergency commission for a transfer from the state contingency			
24			fund. The emergency commission may grant the transfer request, or so			
25			much thereof as may be necessary, to fund this purchasing program.			
26	SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general					
27	fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$1,500,000, or so much of the					
28	sum as may be necessary, to the state department of health for the purpose of funding the					
29	program through which the department purchases vaccines through the federal vaccine					
30	purchasing contract, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013.					
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
