## **SENATE BILL NO. 2303**

- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 36-01-01 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to the composition of the state board of animal health.

## 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 4 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 36-01-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 6 36-01-01. State board of animal health Appointment Terms Qualifications.
- 7 1. The state board of animal health consists of nineten members.
  - a. Nine members are appointed by the governor for terms of seven years each, with their terms of office so arranged that two terms expire on the first day of August in one year and, one term expires on the first day of August in each of the next six years. The, and the term of the individual appointed to represent the nontraditional livestock industry expires on August 1, 2010, and every seven years thereafter.
  - b. One member is a cattle feeder appointed as provided for in subsection 3, with a term that expires on August 1, 2018.
    - c. No individual may be appointed to more than two 7-year terms on the board.
- 2. Each member of the board must be a qualified elector of this state. Each member of the board, immediately after appointment, shall take the oath of office required of civil officers.
  - 3. <u>a.</u> The members of the board <u>appointed by the governor</u> must include:
  - a. (1) One individual who is actively engaged and financially interested in the commercial beef cattle industry and who shall represent the industry on the board;

(8) Two individuals who are licensed veterinarians. 16 b. The final member of the board must be a cattle feeder appointed by the feeder 17 council of the North Dakota stockmen's association. 18 4. Vacancies occurring prior to the expiration of terms of office must be filled by 19 appointment by the governor and must be for the balance of the unexpired term. 20 5. Recommendations for the appointment of individuals to the board may be made to the 21 governor by the North Dakota stockmen's association for the individuals representing 22 commercial beef cattle, by the various registered purebred beef cattle associations for 23 the individual representing the registered purebred beef cattle industry, by the various 24 dairy breed associations for the individual representing the dairy cattle industry, by the 25 North Dakota swine breeders' association for the individual representing the swine 26 industry, by the North Dakota wool growers' association for the individual representing 27 the sheep industry, by the state veterinary medical association for the two 28 veterinarians, by the North Dakota buffalo association for the individual representing 29 the bison industry, by the nontraditional livestock industry for the individual 30 representing the nontraditional livestock industry, and by any associations within this

- 2 recommendations must be submitted for each position to be filled.
