- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 14-05 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to a waiting period for divorce and to mandatory marital counseling.to
- 3 provide for a legislative management study relating to divorce reform and education.

## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 14-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
 and enacted as follows:

## Divorce proceeding - Waiting period - Mandatory marital counseling.

- 1. In an action for divorce which includes the issue of parental rights and responsibilities and which does not include substantiated allegations of domestic abuse, the court may not issue a final order for at least twelve months from the date of the filing of the petition.
- Within the twelve-month waiting period, the adult parties to the action shall participate jointly or separately in at least ten 1-hour marital counseling sessions. The marital counseling, which may be provided by a paid or volunteer counselor, clergy member, or any state-certified or licensed marriage mediator, must include at least four sessions that focus on postmarital financial planning.
- 3. The court may not require both parents to attend the same course at the same time.

  Each party shall arrange for participation in the marital counseling sessions. The parties are responsible for the fees or costs of the marital counseling sessions. The court may assess the counseling fees or costs as the court deems equitable.
- 4. A final decree may not be granted or a final order may not be entered until each party submits to the court certification of completion of the marital counseling.

SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - DIVORCE REFORM AND

**EDUCATION.** During the 2011-12 interim, the legislative management shall consider studying

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the physical, emotional, and financial effects associated with divorce involving dependent children. The legislative management shall offer legislative policy solutions, including divorce reform legislation and marriage and relational education, which will lead to increasing the number of dependent children living in intact families. The legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-third legislative assembly.
