HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 3027

1 A concurrent resolution of no confidence in the Natural Resources Conservation Service's state 2 conservationist and urging the United States Department of Agriculture's Natural Resources 3 Conservation Service to continue the present cooperative agreement process at a \$10,000 4 funding level; allow continuation of local decisionmaking by resource conservation and 5 development councils, including implementation of community development projects, for as long 6 as Congress funds the Resource Conservation and Development program; and to allow a 7 resource conservation and development coordinator colocated with a North Dakota regional 8 council to maintain that colocation. 9 **WHEREAS**, resource conservation and development councils play an important role in the 10 conservation, development, and utilization of natural resources; and 11 WHEREAS, resource conservation and development councils work to improve the general 12 level of economic activity and enhance the environment and standard of living in all 13 communities, provide a system of rural development to encourage the wise use of natural 14 resources, and improve the quality of life in America; and 15 **WHEREAS**, North Dakota has eight authorized councils in the state; and 16 WHEREAS, the United States Department of Agriculture's Natural Resources Conservation 17 Service has developed, funded, and signed cooperative agreements, in accordance with 18 Natural Resources Conservation Service policy, with each resource conservation and 19 development council at a constant financial level of \$10,000, which allows the council to be the 20 local decisionmaking body to implement these cooperative agreements; and 21 WHEREAS, resource conservation and development councils have utilized \$42,000 of 22 cooperative agreement funds to generate \$2.2 million of projects in North Dakota, including 23 projects with the state's Indian nations; and 24 WHEREAS, four of the eight councils have established local offices that house a United 25 States Department of Agriculture Natural Resources Conservation Service employee providing

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- 1 technical assistance on a daily basis as directed by the council and functioning within a local
- 2 partnership with regional councils; and

WHEREAS, the state conservationist has determined to modify the cooperative agreement
process to eliminate local decisionmaking, eliminate community development projects, and to

- 5 relocate resource conservation and development coordinators to an office of the state
- 6 conservationist's preference subverting Natural Resources Conservation Service policy;

7 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF

8 NORTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

- 9 That the Sixty-second Legislative Assembly adopts this concurrent resolution of no
- 10 confidence in the state conservationist and urges the United States Department of Agriculture's
- 11 Natural Resources Conservation Service to continue the present cooperative agreement
- 12 process at a \$10,000 funding level; allow continuation of local decisionmaking by resource
- 13 conservation and development councils, including implementation of community development
- 14 projects, for as long as Congress funds the Resource Conservation and Development program;
- 15 and to allow a resource conservation and development coordinator colocated with a North
- 16 Dakota regional council to maintain that colocation; and
- 17 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Secretary of State forward copies of this resolution
- 18 to the Governor, the North Dakota Agriculture Commissioner, Chief of Natural Resources
- 19 Conservation Service, and the United States Secretary of Agriculture.
