A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Management to study the feasibility and 2 desirability of requiring use of cigarette tax stamps to ensure compliance with tobacco products 3 tax laws.

WHEREAS, North Dakota is one of only three states that do not require tax stamps on cigarettes; and

WHEREAS, application of tax stamps to cigarette packs intended for sale would help toensure collection of applicable taxes and support state and federal enforcement efforts toreduce illicit tobacco trade; and

WHEREAS, application of tax stamps would demonstrate diligent enforcement of mastersettlement agreement provisions to ensure reliable collection of master settlement agreement payments due to states; and

WHEREAS, a study of the effects feasibility and desirability of requiring tax stamping on cigarettes will allow consideration of the effects benefits and detriments of the requirement requiring cigarette tax stamps on the state, wholesalers, the public, and administrative and law enforcement agencies;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

That the Legislative Management study the feasibility and desirability of requiring use of cigarette tax stamps to ensure compliance with tobacco products tax laws; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Legislative Management report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the Sixty-third Legislative Assembly.
