

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 4017

1 A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Management to study the feasibility and
2 desirability of allowing school officials access to the otherwise confidential files and records of
3 the juvenile court.

4 **WHEREAS**, the North Dakota Century Code provides that, with certain limited exceptions,
5 the files and records of the juvenile court are closed to the public; and

6 **WHEREAS**, school officials are not within the list of limited exceptions; and

7 **WHEREAS**, the North Dakota Century Code provides that the files and records of the
8 juvenile court are open to inspection with written leave of a juvenile judge or judicial referee by
9 the principal of any public or nonpublic school that is a member of the North Dakota High
10 School Activities Association, or the superintendent of any school district that has one or more
11 schools involved in the association, but only to the extent necessary to enforce the rules and
12 regulations of the North Dakota High School Activities Association; and

13 **WHEREAS**, school officials are not permitted to inspect the files or records for other
14 purposes; and

15 **WHEREAS**, receiving additional information about enrolled students who are juvenile
16 offenders would assist school officials in protecting the welfare and safety of all students and
17 staff, in providing appropriate treatment and rehabilitation to the juvenile offenders, and in
18 providing appropriate levels of support and supervision to the juvenile offenders;

19 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE**
20 **HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:**

21 That the Legislative Management study the feasibility and desirability of allowing school
22 officials access to the otherwise confidential files and records of the juvenile court; and

23 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Legislative Management report its findings and
24 recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to
25 the Sixty-third Legislative Assembly.
