- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact chapter 15-18.1 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to authority of the state board of higher education to provide authorizations to operate
- 3 private postsecondary educational institutions offering instruction at the associate in arts level or
- 4 higher and to false academic degrees and accreditation mills; to amend and reenact
- 5 subsections 1, 4, 7, and 10 of section 15-20.4-01, sections 15-20.4-02 and 15-20.4-02.1,

6 subsections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 8 of section 15-20.4-03, sections 15-20.4-03.1 and 15-20.4-04,

- 7 subsections 1 and 2 of section 15-20.4-05, sections 15-20.4-06, 15-20.4-08, 15-20.4-09, and
- 8 15-20.4-13, and subsection 1 of section 15-20.4-14, of the North Dakota Century Code, relating
- 9 to authority of the state board for career and technical education to provide authorizations to
- 10 operate private postsecondary career schools offering instruction at the level of no higher than
- 11 the associate of applied science level; to repeal sections 15-20.4-15, 15-20.4-16, 15-20.4-17,
- 12 and 15-20.4-18 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to false academic degrees and
- 13 accreditation mills; and to provide a penalty.

### 14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

15 SECTION 1. Chapter 15-18.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as16 follows:

- 17 <u>15-18.1-01. Definitions.</u>
- 18 <u>As used in this chapter:</u>
- <u>1.</u> "Authorization to operate" or like term means approval of the board to operate or to
   <u>contract to operate a private postsecondary educational institution in this state.</u>
- 21 <u>2.</u> <u>"Board" means the state board of higher education.</u>
- 22 <u>3.</u> <u>"Education" or "educational services" or like term includes any class, course, or</u>
- 23 program of training, instruction, or study.

1	<u>4.</u>	"Educational credentials" means degrees, diplomas, certificates, transcripts, reports,	
2		documents, or letters of designation, marks, appellations, series of letters, numbers, or	
3		words which signify, purport, or are generally taken to signify enrollment, attendance,	
4		progress, or satisfactory completion of the requirements or prerequisites for education	
5		at a postsecondary educational institution operating in this state.	
6	<u>5.</u>	"Entity" includes a company, firm, society, association, partnership, corporation, limited	
7		liability company, or trust.	
8	<u>6.</u>	"Postsecondary educational institution" means a private academic, technical, home	
9		study, business, professional, or other private school, college, or university, or other	
10		private organization or person, operating in this state, offering educational credentials,	
11		or offering instruction or educational services, primarily to persons who have	
12		completed or terminated their secondary education or who are beyond the age of	
13		compulsory high school attendance, for attainment of educational or professional	
14		objectives at the associate in arts level or higher.	
15	<u>7.</u>	"To grant" includes awarding, selling, conferring, bestowing, or giving.	
16	<u>8.</u>	"To offer" includes, in addition to its usual meanings, advertising, publicizing, soliciting,	
17		or encouraging any person, directly or indirectly, in any form, to perform the act	
18		described.	
19	<u>9.</u>	"To operate" an educational institution, or like term, means to establish, keep, or	
20		maintain any facility or location in this state where, from, or through which, education	
21		is offered or given, or educational credentials are offered or granted, and includes	
22		contracting with any person, group, or entity to perform any such act.	
23	<u>15-1</u>	8.1-02. Exemptions.	
24	The following education and educational schools or institutions are exempt from the		
25	provisions of this chapter:		
26	<u>1.</u>	Education sponsored by a bona fide trade, business, professional, or fraternal	
27		organization, so recognized by the board, solely for that organization's membership, or	
28		offered on a no-fee basis.	
29	<u>2.</u>	Education offered by charitable institutions, organizations, or agencies, so recognized	
30		by the board, provided the education is not advertised or promoted as leading toward	
31		educational credentials.	

1	<u>3.</u>	Postsecondary educational institutions established, operated, and governed by this or	
2		any other state or its political subdivisions, as determined by the board and any	
3		educational consortium that includes one or more of the institutions.	
4	<u>4.</u>	Schools of nursing regulated under chapter 43-12.1.	
5	<u>5.</u>	Native American colleges operating in this state, established by federally recognized	
6		Indian tribes.	
7	<u>6.</u>	Postsecondary educational institutions not operating in this state.	
8	<u>7.</u>	Postsecondary career schools regulated under chapter 15-20.4.	
9	<u>15-1</u>	8.1-03. Voluntary application for authorization to operate.	
10	Alth	bugh a postsecondary educational institution not operating in this state is exempt from	
11	this chapter by section 15-18.1-02, the institution may subject itself to the requirements of this		
12	chapter by applying for and being awarded an authorization to operate by the board. An		
13	authorization to operate, as applied to a postsecondary educational institution not operating in		
14	this state, means approval of the board to offer to students in this state educational services		
15	leading to educational credentials.		
16	15-18.1-04. Board powers and duties.		
17	The	board has, in addition to the powers and duties now vested in it by law, the following	
18	powers	ind duties to:	
19	<u>1.</u>	Establish and require compliance with minimum standards and criteria for	
20		postsecondary educational institutions under this chapter. The standards and criteria	
21		must include quality of education, ethical and business practices, health and safety	
22		and fiscal responsibility, which applicants for authorization to operate shall meet:	
23		a. Before such authorization may be issued; and	
24		b. To continue such authorization in effect.	
25		The criteria and standards developed must effectuate the purposes of this	
26		chapter, but may not unreasonably hinder legitimate educational innovation.	
27	<u>2.</u>	Prescribe forms and conditions for, receive, investigate as it may deem necessary, and	
28		act upon applications for authorization to operate postsecondary educational	
29		institutions.	

1	<u>3.</u>	Maintain a list of postsecondary educational institutions authorized to operate in this
2		state under the provisions of this chapter. The list must be available for the information
3		of the public.
4	<u>4.</u>	Negotiate and enter into interstate reciprocity agreements with similar agencies in
5		other states, if in the judgment of the board such agreements are or will be helpful in
6		effectuating the purposes of this chapter; provided, however, that nothing contained in
7		any such reciprocity agreement may be construed as limiting the board's powers,
8		duties, and responsibilities with respect to independently investigating or acting upon
9		any application for authorization to operate or any application for renewal of such
10		authorization to operate, a postsecondary educational institution, or with respect to the
11		enforcement of any provision of this chapter, or any of the rules adopted hereunder.
12	<u>5.</u>	Receive and cause to be maintained as a permanent file, copies of academic records
13		specified by the board in the event any postsecondary educational institution required
14		to have an authorization to operate under this chapter proposes to discontinue its
15		operation.
16	<u>6.</u>	Adopt such rules and procedures necessary or appropriate for the conduct of its work
17		and the implementation of this chapter, and hold such hearings as it may deem
18		advisable in accordance with chapter 28-32, or as required by law in developing such
19		rules and procedures, or in aid of any investigation or inquiry.
20	<u>7.</u>	Investigate as it may deem necessary, on its own initiative or in response to any
21		complaint lodged with it, any person, group, or entity subject to, or reasonably believed
22		by the board to be subject to, the jurisdiction of this chapter; and in connection
23		therewith to subpoena any persons, books, records, or documents pertaining to such
24		investigation. The board may require answers in writing under oath to questions
25		propounded by the board and may administer an oath or affirmation to any person in
26		connection with any investigation. The board may, after hearing, revoke or suspend
27		authorizations to operate. Subpoenas issued by the board are enforceable by any
28		district court.
29	<u>8.</u>	Require fees and bonds from postsecondary educational institutions in such sums and
30		under such conditions as it may establish; provided, that fees established may not
31		exceed the reasonable cost of the service being provided.

- 1 <u>9.</u> Exercise other powers and duties implied but not enumerated in this section but in
- 2 <u>conformity with the provisions of this chapter which, in the judgment of the board, are</u>
- 3 <u>necessary in order to carry out the provisions of this chapter.</u>

#### 4 <u>15-18.1-05. Institution fee fund.</u>

- 5 There is created an institution fee fund into which fees provided to the board upon
- 6 application for authorization to operate a postsecondary educational institution under section
- 7 <u>15-18.1-04 must be deposited. The fund and interest earned on the fund may be spent by the</u>
- 8 board pursuant to legislative appropriation exclusively to carry out the intent and purpose of this
- 9 chapter. This fund is not subject to section 54-44.1-11.

### 10 <u>15-18.1-06. Minimum standards.</u>

11 <u>All postsecondary educational institutions must be accredited by national or regional</u>

12 accrediting agencies recognized by the United States department of education. The board may

13 additionally require such further evidence and make such further investigation as in its judgment

14 may be necessary. Any postsecondary educational institution operating in this state seeking its

15 first authorization to operate may be issued a provisional authorization to operate on an annual

16 basis until the institution becomes eligible for accreditation by a recognized accrediting agency.

17 Institutions issued a provisional authorization to operate must demonstrate a substantial

18 good-faith showing of progress toward such status. Only upon accreditation may an institution

19 become eligible for a regular authorization to operate.

# 20 <u>15-18.1-07. Prohibition.</u>

21 <u>A person, group, or entity of whatever kind, alone or in concert with others, may not:</u>

- <u>Operate, in this state, a postsecondary educational institution not exempted from the</u>
   provisions of this chapter, unless said institution has a currently valid authorization to
   <u>operate issued pursuant to the provisions of this chapter.</u>
- 25 <u>2.</u> Instruct or educate, or offer to instruct or educate, including advertising or soliciting for
- 26 such purpose, enroll or offer to enroll, contract or offer to contract with any person for
- 27 <u>such purpose, or award any educational credential, or contract with any institution or</u>
- 28 party to perform any such act, at a facility or location in this state unless such person,
- 29 group, or entity observes and is in compliance with the minimum standards and criteria

30 established by the board pursuant to subsection 1 of section 15-18.1-04, and the rules

31 adopted by the board pursuant to subsection 6 of section 15-18.1-04.

24	<u>3.</u>	<u>A po</u>	ostsecondary educational institution may implement a refund schedule that
25		<u>dev</u>	iates from subsection 1 if the proposed refund schedule is more favorable to the
26		<u>stuc</u>	lent than the schedule described in subsection 1.
27	<u>15-</u> 2	<u>18.1-0</u>	09. Cancellation of contract for instrument.
28	<u>A pe</u>	erson	has the right for any cause to rescind, revoke, or cancel a contract for educational
29	services	s at ar	ny postsecondary educational institution within seven days after entering into such
30	<u>contract</u>	with	out incurring any tort or contract liability. In such event, the postsecondary

- 1 educational institution may retain the amount of tuition and other charges as set forth in
- 2 subsection 1 of section 15-18.1-08.
- 3 <u>15-18.1-10. Remedy of defrauded student Treble damages.</u>
- 4 <u>A person defrauded by an advertisement or circular issued by a postsecondary educational</u>
- 5 institution, or by a person who sells textbooks to the institution or to the pupils thereof, may
- 6 recover from such institution or person three times the amount paid.
- 7 <u>15-18.1-11. Board review.</u>
- 8 A person aggrieved by a decision of the board respecting denial or revocation of an
- 9 <u>authorization to operate, or the placing of conditions thereon, whether on initial application or on</u>
- 10 application for renewal, and a person aggrieved by the imposition of a penalty by the board
- 11 <u>under section 15-18.1-13, has the right to a hearing and review of such decision by the board</u>
- 12 and to judicial review in accordance with chapter 28-32.

### 13 <u>15-18.1-12. Violations - Civil penalty.</u>

- 14 <u>A person, group, or entity, or an owner, officer, or employee thereof, who violates the</u>
- 15 provisions of section 15-18.1-07, or who fails or refuses to deposit with the board the records
- 16 required by the board under this chapter, is subject to a civil penalty not to exceed one hundred
- 17 dollars for each violation. Each day's failure to comply with the provisions of these sections is a
- 18 <u>separate violation. Such fine may be imposed by the board in an administrative proceeding or</u>
- 19 by any court of competent jurisdiction.
- 20 <u>15-18.1-13. Violations Criminal penalty.</u>
- 21 <u>A person, group, or entity, or an owner, officer, or employee thereof, who willfully violates</u>
- 22 the provisions of section 15-18.1-07, or who willfully fails or refuses to deposit with the board
- 23 the records required by the board under this chapter, is guilty of a class B misdemeanor. The
- 24 criminal sanctions may be imposed by a court of competent jurisdiction in an action brought by
- 25 the attorney general of this state or a state's attorney pursuant to section 15-18.1-15.
- 26 <u>15-18.1-14. Jurisdiction of courts Service of process.</u>
- 27 <u>A postsecondary educational institution not exempt from this chapter, which has a place of</u>
- 28 business in this state, and which instructs or educates, or offers to instruct or educate, enrolls or
- 29 offers to enroll, or contracts or offers to contract, to provide instructional or educational services
- 30 in this state, whether such instruction or services are provided in person or by correspondence,
- 31 to a resident of this state, or which offers to award or awards any educational credentials to a

1	resident of this state, submits such institution, and if a natural person, the person's personal			
2	represe	representative, to the jurisdiction of the courts of this state, concerning any claim for relief		
3	arising t	herefrom, and for the purpose of enforcement of this chapter by injunction pursuant to		
4	section	15-18.1-15. Service of process upon an institution subject to the jurisdiction of the		
5	<u>courts o</u>	f this state may be made by personally serving the summons upon the defendant within		
6	or outsid	de this state, in the manner prescribed by the North Dakota Rules of Civil Procedure,		
7	with the	same force and effect as if the summons had been personally served within this state.		
8	<u>Nothing</u>	contained in this section limits or affects the right to serve any process as prescribed by		
9	the Nort	h Dakota Rules of Civil Procedure.		
10	<u>15-</u>	18.1-15. Enforcement - Injunction.		
11	<u>1.</u>	The attorney general of this state, or the state's attorney of any county in which a		
12		postsecondary educational institution is found, at the request of the board or on the		
13		attorney general's own motion, may bring any appropriate action or proceeding,		
14		including injunctive proceedings, or criminal proceedings pursuant to section		
15		15-18.1-13, in any court of competent jurisdiction for the enforcement of the provisions		
16		of this chapter.		
17	<u>2.</u>	Whenever it appears to the board that a person, group, or entity is, is about to, or has		
18		been violating any of the provisions of this chapter or any of the lawful rules or orders		
19		of the board, the board may, on its own motion or on the written complaint of any		
20		person, file a petition for injunction in the name of the board in any court of competent		
21		jurisdiction in this state against such person, group, or entity, for the purpose of		
22		enjoining such violation or for an order directing compliance with the provisions of this		
23		chapter, and all rules and orders issued hereunder. It is not necessary that the board		
24		allege or prove that it has no adequate remedy at law. The right of injunction provided		
25		in this section is in addition to any other legal remedy which the board has, and is in		
26		addition to any right of criminal prosecution provided by law; provided, however, the		
27		board may not obtain a temporary restraining order without notice to the person,		
28		group, or entity affected. The existence of board action with respect to alleged		
29		violations of this chapter does not operate as a bar to an action for injunctive relief		
30		pursuant to this section.		

1	<u>15-</u>	18.1-16. Unlawful to issue, manufacture, or use false academic degrees - Penalty.
2	<u>1.</u>	It is unlawful for a person to knowingly advertise to sell, issue, or manufacture a false
3		academic degree. A person that violates this subsection is guilty of a class C felony.
4		This subsection does not apply to a newspaper, television or radio station, or other
5		commercial medium that is not the source of the advertisement.
6	<u>2.</u>	a. It is unlawful for an individual to knowingly use or claim to have a false academic
7		degree:
8		(1) To obtain employment;
9		(2) To obtain a promotion or higher compensation in employment;
10		(3) To obtain admission to an institution of higher learning; or
11		(4) In connection with any business, trade, profession, or occupation.
12		b. An individual who violates this subsection is guilty of a class A misdemeanor.
13	<u>3.</u>	As used in this section, "false academic degree" means a document such as a degree
14		or certification of completion of a degree, coursework, or degree credit, including a
15		transcript, that provides evidence or demonstrates completion of a course of
16		instruction or coursework that results in the attainment of a rank or level of associate
17		or higher which is issued by a person that is not a duly authorized institution of higher
18		learning.
19	<u>4.</u>	As used in this section, "duly authorized institution of higher learning" means an
20		institution that:
21		a. <u>Has accreditation recognized by the United States secretary of education or has</u>
22		the foreign equivalent of such accreditation;
23		b. Has an authorization to operate under this chapter or under chapter 15-20.4;
24		c. Operates in this state, and is exempt from this chapter under section 15-18.1-02
25		or is exempt from chapter 15-20.4 under section 15-20.4-02;
26		d. Does not operate in this state and is:
27		(1) Licensed by the appropriate state agency; and
28		(2) An active applicant for accreditation by an accrediting body recognized by
29		the United States secretary of education; or
30		e. Has been found by the state board of higher education or the state board for
31		career and technical education to meet standards of academic quality

  20 includes contracting with any person, group, or entity to perform any such act.
- 21 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 15-20.4-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is

3		standards and criteria must include quality of education, ethical and business
4		practices, health and safety and fiscal responsibility, which applicants for authorization
5		to operate shall meet:
6		a. Before such authorization may be issued; and
7		b. To continue such authorization in effect.
8		The criteria and standards developed will effectuate the purposes of this chapter, but
9		will not unreasonably hinder legitimate educational innovation.
10	2.	Prescribe forms and conditions for, receive, investigate as it may deem necessary, and
11		act upon applications for authorization to operate postsecondary educational
12		institutionscareer schools.
13	3.	Maintain a list of postsecondary educational institutionscareer schools authorized to
14		operate in this state under the provisions of this chapter. The list must be available for
15		the information of the public.
16	4.	Negotiate and enter into interstate reciprocity agreements with similar agencies in
17		other states, if in the judgment of the board such agreements are or will be helpful in
18		effectuating the purposes of this chapter; provided, however, that nothing contained in
19		any such reciprocity agreement may be construed as limiting the board's powers,
20		duties, and responsibilities with respect to independently investigating or acting upon
21		any application for authorization to operate, or any application for renewal of such
22		authorization to operate, a postsecondary educational institutioncareer school, or with
23		respect to the enforcement of any provision of this chapter, or any of the rules or
24		regulations promulgated hereunder.
25	5.	Receive and cause to be maintained as a permanent file, copies of academic records
26		specified by the board in the event any postsecondary educational institutioncareer
27		school required to have an authorization to operate under this chapter proposes to
28		discontinue its operation.
29	8.	Require fees and bonds from postsecondary educational institutionscareer schools in
30		such sums and under such conditions as it may establish; provided, that fees
31		established may not exceed the reasonable cost of the service being provided.

The fund and interest 7 earned on the fund may be spent by the board pursuant to legislative appropriation exclusively 8 to carry out the intent and purpose of this chapter. This fund is not subject to section 54-44.1-11. 9 SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 15-20.4-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is 10 amended and reenacted as follows: 11 15-20.4-04. Minimum standards - Exceptions. 12 1. All postsecondary educational institutionscareer schools must be accredited by 13 national or regional accrediting agencies recognized by the United States department 14 of education. The board may additionally require such further evidence and make such 15 further investigation as in its judgment may be necessary. Any postsecondary 16 educational institutioncareer school operating in this state seeking its first authorization 17 to operate may be issued a provisional authorization to operate on an annual basis 18 until the institutionschool becomes eligible for accreditation by a recognized 19 accrediting agency. InstitutionsSchools issued a provisional authorization to operate 20 must demonstrate a substantial good-faith showing of progress toward such status. 21 Only upon accreditation shall an institutiona school become eligible for a regular 22 authorization to operate. 23 2. This section does not apply to postsecondary educational institutionscareer schools 24 operating in this state that do not grant degrees and that offer mainly hands-on training 25 in low census occupations, as determined by the board. "Degree" as used in this 26 subsection means a document that provides evidence or demonstrates completion of 27 a course of instruction that results in the attainment of a rank or level of associate or 28 higher. 29 SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Subsections 1 and 2 of section 15-20.4-05 of the North Dakota 30 Century Code are amended and reenacted as follows:

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SECTION 9. AMENDMENT. Section 15-20.4-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is

- Postsecondary educational institutionscareer schools shall refund tuition and other
   charges, other than a reasonable application fee, when written notice of cancellation is
   given by the student in accordance with the following schedule:
- 19a.When notice is received prior to, or within seven days after completion of the first20day of instruction, or after receipt of the first correspondence lesson by the21institutionschool, all tuition and other charges must be refunded to the student.
- b. When notice is received prior to, or within thirty days after completion of the first
  day of instruction, or prior to the completion of one-fourth of the educational
  services, all tuition and other charges except twenty-five percent thereof must be
  refunded to the student.
- c. When notice is received upon or after completion of one-fourth of the educational
   services, but prior to the completion of one-half of the educational services, all
   tuition and other charges except fifty percent thereof must be refunded to the
   student.
- 30 d. When notice is received upon or after the completion of fifty percent of the
  31 educational services, no tuition or other charges may be refunded to the student.

- The provisions of this section do not prejudice the right of any student to recovery in
   an action against any postsecondary educational institutioncareer school for breach of
   contract or fraud.
- A postsecondary educational institutioncareer school may implement a refund
  schedule that deviates from subsection 1 if the proposed refund schedule is more
  favorable to the student than the schedule described in subsection 1.

SECTION 10. AMENDMENT. Section 15-20.4-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is

10 Any person has the right for any cause to rescind, revoke, or cancel a contract for

Any postsecondary <u>educational institutioncareer school</u> not exempt from this chapter, which has a place of business in this state, and which instructs or educates, or offers to instruct or educate, enrolls or offers to enroll, or contracts or offers to contract, to provide instructional or

- 28 educational services in this state, whether such instruction or services are provided in person or
- by correspondence, to a resident of this state, or which offers to award or awards any
- 30 educational credentials to a resident of this state, submits such institutionschool, and if a natural
- 31 person, the person's personal representative, to the jurisdiction of the courts of this state,

1 concerning any claim for relief arising therefrom, and for the purpose of enforcement of this 2 chapter by injunction pursuant to section 15-20.4-14. Service of process upon any such 3 institutionschool subject to the jurisdiction of the courts of this state may be made by personally 4 serving the summons upon the defendant within or outside this state, in the manner prescribed 5 by the North Dakota Rules of Civil Procedure, with the same force and effect as if the summons 6 had been personally served within this state. Nothing contained in this section limits or affects 7 the right to serve any process as prescribed by the North Dakota Rules of Civil Procedure. 8 SECTION 13. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 15-20.4-14 of the North Dakota 9 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 10 1. The attorney general of this state, or the state's attorney of any county in which a 11 postsecondary educational institutioncareer school is found, at the request of the 12 board or on the attorney general's own motion, may bring any appropriate action or 13 proceeding, (including injunctive proceedings, or criminal proceedings pursuant to 14 section 15-20.4-12), in any court of competent jurisdiction for the enforcement of the

15 provisions of this chapter.

16 SECTION 14. REPEAL. Sections 15-20.4-15, 15-20.4-16, 15-20.4-17, and 15-20.4-18 of
