A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the state water
commission; to amend and reenact section 7 of chapter 20 of the 2009 Session Laws, relating
to Fargo flood control project funding; to provide exemptions; to repeal section 5 of chapter 535
of the 1999 Session Laws, relating to pledge of revenues from the Grand Forks corporate
center; to provide legislative intent; to provide for retroactive application; and to declare an
emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, to the state water commission for the purpose of defraying the expenses of that agency, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011 with the effective date of this Act, and ending June 30, 2013, as follows:

14	sixty-third legislative assembly on the use of the one-time funding for the biennium beginning					
15	July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013.					
16	SECTION 3. SOVEREIGN LANDS ENFORCEMENT GRANT. The administrative and					
17	support services line item in section 1 of this Act includes \$200,000 from the general fund that					
18	the state water commission shall provide as a grant to the game and fish department for law					
19	enforcement activities on sovereign lands in the state, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011,					
20	and ending June 30, 2013.					
21	SECTION 4. ADDITIONAL INCOME - APPROPRIATION. In addition to the amounts					
22	included in the estimated income line item in section 1 of this Act, any additional amounts in the					
23	resources trust fund and water development trust fund that become available are appropriated					
24	to the state water commission for the purpose of defraying the expenses of that agency, for the					
25	biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013.					
26	SECTION 5. GRANTS - WATER-RELATED PROJECTS - CARRYOVER AUTHORITY.					
27	Section 54-44.1-11 does not apply to	funding for grants or	water-related proje	ects included in the		
28	water and atmospheric resources line item in section 1 of this Act. However, this exclusion is					
29	only in effect for two years after June 30, 2013. Any unexpended funds appropriated from the					
30	resources trust fund after that period has expired must be transferred to the resources trust fund					

and any unexpended funds appropriated from the water development trust fund after that period
has expired must be transferred to the water development trust fund.

SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 7 of chapter 20 of the 2009 Session Laws is amended and reenacted as follows:

SECTION 7. FARGO FLOOD CONTROL PROJECT FUNDING - EXEMPTION.

Of the funds appropriated in the water and atmospheric resources line item in section 1 of this Act, \$45,000,000 is for Fargo flood control projects, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011. Any funds not spent by June 30, 2011, are not subject to section 54-44.1-11 and must be continued into the next or subsequent bienniums and may be expended only for Fargo flood control projects.

TheseExcept as otherwise provided, these funds may be used only for land purchases and construction; including right-of-way acquisition costs. No more than ten percent of these funds may not be used for administration, engineering, legal, planning, or other similar purposes; and are not subject to the sixty-five percent funding requirement contained in Senate Bill No. 2316 (2009). The city of Fargo, Cass County, and the Cass County joint water resource district must approve any expenditures made under this section.

SECTION 7. FARGO FLOOD CONTROL PROJECT FUNDING - EXEMPTION. Of the

funds appropriated in the water and atmospheric resources line item in section 1 of this Act, \$30,000,000 is for Fargo flood control projects, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013. Any funds not spent by June 30, 2013, are not subject to section 54-44.1-11 and must be continued into the next or subsequent bienniums and may be expended only for Fargo flood control projects. These Except as otherwise provided, these funds may be used only for land purchases and construction, and including right-of-way acquisition costs. No more than ten percent of these funds may not be used for administration engineering, legal, planning, or other similar purposes. The city of Fargo, Cass County, and the Cass County joint water resource district must approve any expenditures made under this section.

SECTION 8. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - STATE WATER COMMISSION PROJECTS AND GRANTS. It is the intent of the sixty-second legislative assembly that of the funds appropriated

6	SECTION 9. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - GARRISON DIVERSION CONSERVANCY			
7	DISTRICT. It is the intent of the sixty-second legislative assembly that of the funds appropriated			
8	in the water and atmospheric resources line item in section 1 of this Act, the state water			
9	commission allocate no more than \$1,000,000 to the Garrison Diversion Conservancy District.			
10	SECTION 10. REPEAL. Section 5 of chapter 535 of the 1999 Session Laws is repealed.			
11	SECTION 11. RETROACTIVE APPLICATION. Section 6 of this Act applies retroactively to			
12	January 1, 2011.			
13	SECTION 12. EMERGENCY. The water and atmospheric resources line item in section 1 of			
14	this This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
