ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1012

1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the department of

2 transportation; to provide appropriations to the state treasurer for transportation funding

3 distributions; to repeal section 2 of chapter 573 of the 2009 Session Laws, relating to

4 highway-rail grade safety projects; to provide for transfers; to provide for borrowing authority; to

5 provide an exemption; to provide for a legislative management study; and to declare an

6 emergency.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

8 **SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.** The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds 9 as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state 10 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and 11 other income, to the department of transportation for the purpose of defraying the expenses of 12 the department of transportation, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 13 2013, as follows:

7 SECTION 2. ONE-TIME FUNDING - EFFECT ON BASE BUDGET - REPORT TO

8 **SIXTY-THIRD LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY.** The following amounts reflect the one-time funding

9 items approved by the sixty-first legislative assembly for the 2009-11 biennium and the 2011-13

10 one-time funding items included in the appropriation in section 1 of this Act:

The 2011-13 one-time funding amounts are not part of the entity's base budget for the 2013-15 biennium. The department of transportation shall report to the appropriations committees of the sixty-third legislative assembly on the use of the one-time funding for the biennium beginning July, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013.

23 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION - TRANSFER - HIGHWAY-RAIL GRADE CROSSING

24 SAFETY PROJECTS. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the highway-rail grade 25 crossing safety fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of 26 \$230,000\$1,431,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of 27 transportation for the funding of grants for highway-rail grade crossing safety projects, including 28 grants for the reduction of associated special assessments, for the biennium beginning July 1, 29 2011, and ending June 30, 2013. On June 30, 2013, the state treasurer shall transfer any 30 unexpended and unobligated balance in the highway-rail grade safety projects fund to the 31 highway tax distribution fund.

1	Up to \$1,201,000 of funds provided under this section may be used by the department of		
2	transportation for highway-rail grade crossing safety projects approved by the department and		
3	for which	n funding was obligated during the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and ending

5	Grai	ntsUp to \$230,000 of funds provided under this section <u>may be used</u> by the department	
6	of transp	portation for <u>additional</u> highway-rail grade crossing safety projects areproject grants	
7	subject t	to the following requirements:	
8	1.	A political subdivision seeking a grant shall file an application with the department of	
9		transportation.	
10	2.	A political subdivision grant applicant shall provide ten percent matching funds for the	
11		project costs but no local matching funds are required for a highway-rail grade	
12		crossing on a state highway.	
13	3.	Grant funds may be allocated for development of railroad quiet zones, installation or	
14		upgrading of active warning devices, resurfacing crossings, building of grade	
15		separations, and other costs associated with these improvements.	
16	4.	An applicant for grant approval for development of a railroad quiet zone shall provide	
17		the department of transportation a copy of the notice of intent filed with the federal	
18		railroad administration regarding establishment of a proposed quiet zone and copies of	
19		any subsequent filings with or orders from the federal railroad administration relating to	
20		the notice of intent.	
21	5.	Grants provided to a city may not exceed a cumulative amount of \$80,000.	
22	SEC	TION 4. APPROPRIATION - BORROWING AUTHORITY - ADDITIONAL	
23	EMERG	ENCY RELIEF PROGRAM. The department of transportation may borrow the sum of	
24	\$120,00	0,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, from the Bank of North Dakota for	
25	the purpose of providing funding for emergency relief projects on the state highway system, for		
26	the period beginning with the effective date of this Act and ending June 30, 2013. Any funding		
27	borrowed from the Bank of North Dakota under this section is appropriated to the department of		
28	transportation for emergency relief projects on the state highway system. Funding appropriated		
29	under this section is considered one-time funding and is not to be considered a part of the		
30	department's 2013-15 base budget request. Any federal funding received for projects receiving		
31	funding under this section must be used to repay the loan from the Bank of North Dakota.		

1	SECTION 5. APPROPRIATION - STATE TREASURER - 2009-11 BIENNIUM
2	TRANSPORTATION FUNDING DISTRIBUTIONS. There is appropriated out of any moneys in
3	the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of
4	\$25,000,000\$35,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the state treasurer for
5	the purpose of providing transportation funding distributions, for the period beginning with the
6	effective date of this Act and ending June 30, 2011. The funding provided in this section is
7	considered a one-time funding item. The state treasurer shall distribute the funds provided
8	under this section prior to June 30, 2011, as follows:

25	For purposes of this section, a "non-oil-producing county" means a county that did not receive
26	an allocation of funding under section 57-51-15 during state fiscal year 2010 or a county that
27	received a total allocation under section 57-51-15 of less than \$500,000 for state fiscal year
28	2010.
29	SECTION 6. APPROPRIATION - STATE TREASURER - 2011-13 BIENNIUM
30	TRANSPORTATION FUNDING DISTRIBUTIONS. There is appropriated out of any moneys in
31	the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$25,000,000, or

1	so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the state treasurer for the purpose of providing			
2	transportation funding distributions, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending			
3	June 30, 2013. The funding provided in this section is considered a one-time funding item. The			
4	state treasurer shall distribute the funds provided under this section on April 1, 2012, as follows:

25	SECTION 7. APPROPRIATION - TRANSFER - GENERAL FUND TO HIGHWAY FUND.			
26	There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise			
27	appropriated, the sum of \$370,600,000, which the office of management and budget shall			
28	transfer to the highway fund during the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30,			
29	2013.			
30	SECTION 8. LINE ITEM TRANSFERS. The director of the department of transportation			
31	may transfer between the salaries and wages, operating expenses, capital assets, and grants

2	highways. The department of transportation shall notify the office of management and budget of		
3	any trans	sfers	made pursuant to this section.
4	SEC		9. REPEAL. Section 2 of chapter 573 of the 2009 Session Laws is repealed.
5	SEC		10. COUNTY AND TOWNSHIP ROAD RECONSTRUCTION PROGRAM.
6	1.	The	sum of \$142,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, included in
7		the o	county and township road reconstruction program line item in section 1 of this Act,
8		mus	t be used to rehabilitate or reconstruct county and township paved and unpaved
9		road	ls.
10		a.	Funding allocations to counties are to be made by the department of
11			transportation based on the needs assessment study conducted by the upper
12			great plains transportation institute, titled "Additional Road Investments Needed
13			to Support Oil and Gas Production and Distribution in North Dakota", dated
14			December 9, 2010.
15		b.	Counties identified in the study are eligible for this funding.
16	2.	Eac	h county requesting funding under this section for county or township roads shall
17		subr	mit the request in accordance with criteria developed by the department of
18		tran	sportation.
19		a.	The request shall include a proposed plan for funding projects that rehabilitate or
20			reconstruct paved and unpaved roads within the county.
21		b.	The plan shall be based on the upper great plains transportation institute study,
22			actual road conditions, and integration with state highway and other county road
23			projects.
24		C.	Funds shall not be used for routine maintenance.
25	3.	The	department of transportation, in consultation with the county, may approve the
26		plan	or approve the plan with amendments.
27	4.	The	funding included in the county and township road reconstruction program line item
28		in se	ection 1 of this Act may be used for:
29		a.	Ninety percent of the cost of the approved paved roadway projects not to exceed
30			the funding available for that county.

1		b. Twenty-five percent of the cost of the approved unpaved roadway projects not to		
2		exceed the funding available for that county.		
3		c. Funding may be used for construction, engineering, and plan development costs.		
4	5.	Upon approval of the plan, the department of transportation shall transfer to the county		
5		the approved funding for engineering and plan development costs.		
6	6.	Upon execution of a construction contract by the county, the department of		
7		transportation shall transfer to the county the approved funding to be distributed for		
8		county and township road rehabilitation and reconstruction projects.		
9	7.	The recipient counties shall report to the department of transportation upon awarding		
10		of each contract and upon completion of each project in a manner prescribed by the		
11		department.		
12	8.	The funding included in the county and township road reconstruction line item in		
13		section 1 of this Act may be applied to engineering and design costs incurred on		
14		related projects as of January 1, 2011.		
15	SEC	TION 11. EXTRAORDINARY STATE HIGHWAY MAINTENANCE. The funding		
16	included	in the capital assets line item in section 1 of this Act relating to extraordinary state		
17	highway	maintenance may be applied to engineering and design costs incurred on related		
18	projects as of January 1, 2011.			
19	SEC	TION 12. FARGO DISTRICT OFFICE LOCATION - EXEMPTION. The sum of		
20	\$800,000 included in the capital assets line item of section 1 of this Act is for the construction of			
21	an equipment storage facility at the Fargo district office location which may only be used			
22	pursuant	to the provisions of this section.		
23	Notw	ithstanding sections 54-01-05.2 and 54-01-05.5, the department of transportation shall		
24	offer for a	sale the entire parcel of land, including buildings, owned by the department of		
25	transport	ation at the Fargo district office location which is at 503 38th street south in the city of		
26	Fargo. In	consideration for the property, the buyer must provide the department of transportation		
27	with an a	Iternative parcel of land in fee simple to be used as a new location for the Fargo district		
28	office. Th	e parcel of land must be located within the interstate storm gates of the cities of Fargo		
29	and West Fargo, be of suitable size and condition for operations of the Fargo district office, and			
30	be readil	y accessible to the interstate system. In consideration for the department of		
31	transport	ation property, the buyer shall construct or otherwise provide the buildings necessary		

1 for the operations of the Fargo district office. If requested, the director of the department of 2 transportation shall provide potential buyers with general land and building requirements 3 necessary for the operations of the Fargo district office. The director of the department of 4 transportation shall have the authority to determine whether the location and buildings 5 adequately address the operations needs of the Fargo district office. The property shall remain 6 open to buyers until May 1, 2012. The department of transportation may proceed with the 7 construction of the equipment storage building at the current Fargo district office location if an 8 offer is not accepted by the department of transportation by May 1, 2012. 9 SECTION 13. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - STATE AGENCY AIRPLANES. 10 During the 2011-12 interim, the legislative management shall consider studying the use of 11 state-owned airplanes. The study, if conducted, must include a review of airplanes owned by 12 state agencies, the justification for each airplane, the frequency of use of each airplane, options 13 for purchasing or leasing new airplanes, and the feasibility and desirability of requiring state 14 airplanes to be managed by state fleet services. The legislative management shall report its 15 findings and recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the 16 recommendations, to the sixty-third legislative assembly. 17 SECTION 14. EMERGENCY. Funding of \$228,600,000 in the capital assets line item 18 relating to extraordinary state highway maintenance and \$142,000,000 in the county and 19 township road reconstruction line item in section 1 of this Act and section sections 4, 5, 10, and

20 12 of this Act are declared to be an emergency measure.
