1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the office of the

2 adjutant general; to provide appropriations; to provide for transfers; to provide exemptions; to

3 amend and reenact section 37-17.3-08 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to state

4 <u>radio fees;</u> and to declare an emergency.

## 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds 7 as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state 8 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and 9 other income, to the office of the adjutant general for the purpose of defraying the expenses of 10 that agency, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013, as follows: 11 Subdivision 1.

The 2011-13 one-time funding amounts are not a part of the entity's base budget for the
 2013-15 biennium. The adjutant general shall report to the appropriations committees of the
 sixty-third legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the biennium beginning
 July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013.
 SECTION 3. VETERANS' CEMETERY MAINTENANCE FUND - APPROPRIATION. In
 addition to the amount appropriated to the adjutant general in the veterans' cemetery line item
 in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, there is appropriated any additional funds which are

8 received and deposited in the veterans' cemetery maintenance fund pursuant to sections
9 37-03-14 and 39-04-10.10 for the operation of the North Dakota veterans' cemetery for the

10 biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013.

SECTION 4. STATE DISASTER RELIEF FUND - APPROPRIATION. In addition to the amount appropriated to the adjutant general in subdivision 2 of section 1 of this Act, there is appropriated, subject to emergency commission approval, any additional funds in the state disaster relief fund, as determined necessary by the adjutant general for defraying the expenses of state disasters pursuant to section 37-17.1-27.

16 SECTION 5. MAINTENANCE AND REPAIRS - TRANSFERS. The adjutant general may 17 transfer to the operating expenses and capital assets line items contained in section 1 of this 18 Act up to the sum of \$500,000 from the various other line items contained in section 1 of this 19 Act, as determined necessary by the adjutant general to provide for the maintenance and repair 20 of state-owned armories in this state during the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending 21 June 30, 2013. Any amounts transferred pursuant to this section must be reported to the 22 director of the office of management and budget.

SECTION 6. EXEMPTION. Any amounts carried over pursuant to section 3 of chapter 312
of the 2009 Session Laws that is unexpended as of June 30, 2011, is not subject to section
54-44.1-11 and is available for payment of adjusted compensation to veterans. Any unexpended
funds from this appropriation must be transferred to the veterans' cemetery trust fund during
the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015.

SECTION 7. EXEMPTION. The amount appropriated in the capital assets line for the next
 generation 911 study and state radio tower study in section 1, subdivision 2, of chapter 16 of the
 2009 Session Laws is not subject to section 54-44.1-11 and any unexpended funds from this

- line item are available for conducting these studies during the biennium beginning July 1, 2011,
   and ending June 30, 2013.
- 3 SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 37-17.3-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is
  4 amended and reenacted as follows:

37-17.3-08. State radio system and service fees.

- 6 The director shall establish the appropriate fees for access to the state radio system 1. 7 and the service provided to local government users of the mobile data terminal system 8 and North Dakota law enforcement telecommunications systems and other such 9 systems that may be employed that enhance public safety. Changes to fees charged 10 by the division, including schedule of charges for counties and cities, will take effect on 11 July first. The director shall announce any fee increases a minimum of one year prior-12 tobefore the effective date. When the director considers an adjustment, as a part of 13 the process the director shall consult with representatives of state and local units of 14 government prior tobefore setting fees. The director may consider economic 15 conditions and the general economy when setting fees. The director shall deposit all 16 revenue obtained under this chapter with the state treasurer for deposit in the state 17 radio broadcasting system operating account. The state radio broadcasting system 18 operating account must be expended pursuant to legislative appropriation for the 19 operation and maintenance of the system. Fee structures will include:
- 1.2. Mobile data terminal fees. The division shall establish and charge fees to provide
   mobile data terminal service to interested local law enforcement agencies <u>except for</u>
   local law enforcement agencies using private commercial access to the state message
   switch. The fees must be based on actual costs incurred by the division for providing
   the service and will be levied on a per system user basis. State general fund agencies
   that access the system will not incur any fees for the service.
- 26 2.3. Each county and city law enforcement department that accesses the North Dakota
  27 teletype system shall pay a fee based upon fifty percent of the actual costs incurred by
  28 the division for providing the service. Fees will be levied on a per terminal basis. Other
  29 law enforcement affiliated organizations and federal agencies will pay one hundred
  30 percent of the actual costs incurred by the division for providing the service. Fees will
  31 be levied on a per terminal basis. State general fund agencies that access the system

1	will not incur any fees for the service. City and county law enforcement fees will be		
2	based on the following schedule of charges per terminal:		
3	a. County population of less than five thousand shall pay thirty forty dollars per		
4	month.		
5	b. County population of five thousand or more but less than ten thousand shall pay		
6	sixtyeighty dollars per month.		
7	c. County population of ten thousand or more but less than fifteen thousand shall		
8	pay ninetyone hundred twenty dollars per month.		
9	d. County population of fifteen thousand or more but less than twenty-five thousand		
10	shall pay one hundred twentysixty dollars per month.		
11	e. County population of twenty-five thousand or more shall pay onetwo hundred		
12	sixty dollars per month.		
13	SECTION 9. EMERGENCY. Section 4 of this Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
