1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the commissioner of

2 university and school lands; to provide for distributions from permanent funds; to create and

3 enact sections 57-62-07 and 57-62-08 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the oil and

4 gas impact grant advisory committee; to amend and reenact sections 15-01-02 and 15-02-05,

5 subsection 1 of section 57-51-15, and section 57-62-05 of the North Dakota Century Code,

6 relating to the powers of the board of university and school lands, the duties of the

7 commissioner of university and school lands, the apportionment of oil and gas gross production

8 tax proceeds, and the duties of the energy development impact director; and to declare an

9 emergency.

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated from special funds derived from the state lands maintenance fund and the oil and gas impact grant fund in the state treasury, to the commissioner of university and school lands for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the commissioner of university and school lands, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013, as follows:

31 The board has:

1	1.	Full control of the selection, appraisement, rental, sale, disposal, and management of:	
2		a. Lands donated or granted by or received from the United States or from any	
3		other source for the support and maintenance of the common schools.	
4		b. All lands which fall to the state by escheat.	
5		c. All lands donated or granted by or received from the United States or from any	
6		other source for the maintenance of the educational, penal, or charitable	
7		institutions.	
8		d. All lands acquired by the state through the investment of the permanent school	
9		funds of the state as the result of mortgage foreclosure or otherwise.	
10	2.	Full control of the investment of the permanent funds derived from the sale of any of	
11		the lands described in subsection 1.	
12	3.	Full control of such percent of the proceeds of any sale of public lands as may be	
13		granted to the state by the United States on such sale.	
14	4.	Full control of the proceeds of any property that fall to the state by escheat and of the	
15		proceeds of all gifts and donations to the state for the support or maintenance of the	
16		common schools, and of all other property otherwise acquired by the state for the	
17		maintenance of the common schools. Any gift to the state not specifically appropriated	
18		to any other purpose must be considered as a gift for the support and maintenance of	
19		the common schools.	
20	5.	Authority to expend moneys for the purpose of making refunds in cases in which an	
21		error has been made by the board, or a person dealing with the board, with regard to	
22		any of the lands, minerals, funds, proceeds, or any other kind of property managed by	
23		the board. Moneys expended to make refunds must come from the same fund or	
24		account into which the money to be refunded was originally placed.

28	amended and reenacted as follows:

30	The commissioner, under such directions as may be given by the board of university and		
31	school la	ands, shall:	

1	1.	Have general charge and supervision of all lands described in section 15-01-02.	
2	2.	Act as general agent of the board in the performance of its duties.	
3	3.	Have the custody of all maps, books, and papers relating to any of the lands	
4		mentioned in this title.	
5	4.	Procure the books, maps, and plats required to keep a complete record of all such	
6		lands, and keep true records of all the sales, leases, permits, patents, deeds, and	
7		other conveyances of lands under the commissioner's supervision made by the state	
8		showing the amount of money paid, the date of sale and of payment, the description of	of
9		lands sold or leased, the number of acres [hectares] thereof, the name of the	
10		purchaser, and the designation of the fund to be credited therewith.	
11	5.	Direct all appraisements, sales, and leases, and execute all contracts of sale, leases,	
12		permits, and other evidences of disposal of lands, subject to approval by the board.	
13	6.	Certify the book and page number of all contracts, leases, or permits recorded by the	
14		commissioner.

16	SEC	TION 7. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 57-51-15 of the North Dakota Century	
17	Code is	amended and reenacted as follows:	
18	1.	First the tax revenue collected under this chapter equal to one percent of the gross	
19		value at the well of the oil and one-fifth of the tax on gas must be deposited with the	
20		state treasurer who shall:	
21		a. Credit thirty-three and one-third percent of the revenues to the oil and gas impact	t
22		grant fund, but not in an amount exceeding eightone hundred million dollars per	
23		biennium;	
24		b. Allocate five hundred thousand dollars per fiscal year to each city in an	
25		oil-producing county which has a population of seven thousand five hundred or	
26		more and more than two percent of its private covered employment engaged in	
27		the mining industry, according to data compiled by job service North Dakota. The	;
28		allocation under this subdivision must be doubled if the city has more than seven	I
29		and one-half percent of its private covered employment engaged in the mining	
30		industry, according to data compiled by job service North Dakota; and	
31		c. Credit the remaining revenues to the state general fund.	

1 SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 57-62-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is 2 amended and reenacted as follows: 3 57-62-05. Powers and duties of energy development impact director. 4 The energy development impact director shall: 5 1. Develop a plan for the assistance, through financial grants for services and facilities, of 6 counties, cities, school districts, and other political subdivisions in coal development 7 and oil and gas development impact areas. 8 2. Establish procedures and provide proper forms to political subdivisions for use in 9 making application for funds for impact assistance as provided in this chapter. 10 3.2. Make grants disbursements to counties, cities, school districts, and other taxing 11 districts for grants awarded by the board of university and school lands pursuant to 12 chapter 15-01, as provided in this chapter and within the appropriations made for such 13 purposes. In determining the amount of impact grants for which political subdivisions 14 are eligible, the amount of revenue to which such political subdivisions will be entitled 15 from taxes upon the real property of coal and oil and gas development plants and from 16 other tax or fund distribution formulas provided by law must be considered. 17 Serve as a member of the oil and gas impact grant advisory committee. 3. 18 SECTION 9. 26			the distribution of thirty-five percent of moneys available in the oil and gas impact
27			fund to incorporated cities with a population of ten thousand or more, based on
28			the most recent official decennial federal census, that are impacted by oil and gas
29			development.
30		<u>f.</u>	Make recommendations to the board of university and school lands providing for
31			the distribution of sixty-five percent of moneys available in the oil and gas impact

- 1 <u>fund to cities not otherwise eligible for funding under this section, counties,</u>
- 2 school districts, and other political subdivisions impacted by oil and gas
- 3 <u>development.</u>
- 4 <u>2.</u> <u>Members of the advisory committee are entitled to reimbursement for actual and</u>
- 5 <u>necessary expenses incurred in the same manner as state officials.</u>
- 6 SECTION 11. EMERGENCY. Sections 5, 6, 8, 9, and 10 of this Act are declared to be an
- 7 emergency measure.
