1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact two new sections to chapter 43-32 of the North Dakota

2 Century Code, relating to certification regulation of applied behavior analysts; and to amend and

3 reenact sections 43-32-01, 43-32-08, 43-32-08.1, 43-32-08.2, 43-32-09, 43-32-12,

4 <u>43-32-13, and 43-32-14, subsection 1 of section 43-32-16, and sections 43-32-19.1 and</u>

5 <u>43-32-30</u> of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to definitions related to the regulation of

6 <u>applied behavior analysis by</u> the state board of psychologist examiners.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

8 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is

9 amended and reenacted as follows:

10 **43-32-01**. Definitions.

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- 11 "Applied behavior analysis analyst" means the design, implementation, and evaluation-1. 12 of environmental modifications, using behavioral stimuli and consequences, to-13 produce socially significant improvement in human behavior, including the use of direct 14 observation, measurement, and functional analysis of the relationship between 15 environment and behavioran individual licensed under this chapter as an applied 16 behavior analyst. The term does not include a registered applied behavior analyst. 17 "Autism spectrum disorder" means a neurobiological medical condition that includes 2. 18 autistic disorder, Asperger's disorder, pervasive development disorder not otherwise
 - specified, Rett's disorder, and childhood disintegrative disorder.
- 20 3. "Board" means the North Dakota state board of psychologist examiners.
- 21 2.3.4. "Industrial-organizational psychologist" means an individual who is licensed under this
 22 chapter to engage in the practice of industrial-organizational psychology.
- 3.4.5. "Industrial-organizational psychology" means the provision of psychological research
 services or consultation services to a group or an organization. The term does not

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1		include the delivery or supervision of services to individuals who are themselves,			
2	rather than the group or organization, the intended beneficiaries of the services,				
3	regardless of the source or extent of payment for services rendered.				
4	<u>4.5.6.</u>	"Industrial-organizational psychology resident" means an individual who has met the			
5		requirement of subdivision b of subsection 2 of section 43-32-20, is involved in			
6		supervised employment in industrial-organizational psychology, and has registered			
7		with the board.			
8	5.<u>6.</u>7.	"Licensee" means an industrial-organizational psychologist, an applied behavior			
9		analyst, or a psychologist.			
10	6.<u>7.</u>8.	"Practice of applied behavior analysis" means:			
11		a. Means the application of the principles, methods, and procedures of the			
12		experimental analysis of behavior and applied behavior analysis, including			
13		principles of operant and respondent learning. The term includes applications of			
14		those principles, methods, and procedures to design:			
15		(1) Design, implement, evaluate, and modify treatment programs to change the			
16		behavior of individuals diagnosed with an autism spectrum disorder;-design			
17		(2) Design, implement, evaluate, and modify treatment programs to change the			
18		behavior of individuals; design			
19		(3) Design, implement, evaluate, and modify treatment programs to change the			
20		behavior of groups; and consult			
21		(4) Consult with individuals and organizations.			
22		b. The term does not include diagnosis, counseling, psychological testing,			
23		neuropsychologypersonality assessment, intellectual assessment,			
24		neuropsychological assessment, psychotherapy, cognitive therapy, sex therapy,			
25		family therapy, coordination of care, psychoanalysis, or hypnotherapy, and			
26		long-term counseling as treatment modalities.			
27	<u>8.9.</u>	"Practice of psychology" means the observation, description, evaluation, interpretation,			
28		or modification of human behavior by the application of psychological principles,			
29		methods, and procedures for the purpose of preventing or eliminating symptomatic,			
30		maladaptive, or undesired behavior and enhancing interpersonal relationships, work			
31		and life adjustment, personal effectiveness, behavioral health, and mental health. The			

1	term includes psychological testing and the evaluation or assessment of personal
2	characteristics, such as intelligence, personality, abilities, interests, aptitudes, and
3	neuropsychological functioning; counseling, psychotherapy, biofeedback, behavior
4	analysis and therapy, clinical applications of hypnosis, and other therapeutic
5	techniques based on psychological principles; diagnosis and treatment of mental and
6	emotional disorder or disability, compulsive disorders, disorders of habit or conduct as
7	well as of the psychological aspects of physical illness, accident, injury, or disability;
8	and psychoeducational evaluation, therapy, remediation, and consultation. The term
9	includes providing psychological services to individuals, families, groups,
10	organizations, institutions, and the public regardless of whether payment is received
11	for services rendered. The term includes supervising others who are engaged in the
12	practice of psychology.
13	7. <u>9.10.</u> "Psychologist" means an individual who is licensed under this chapter in the practice
14	of psychology.
15	8.10.11. "Psychology resident" means an individual who has met the requirement of
16	subdivision b of subsection 1 of section 43-32-20, is involved in supervised
17	psychological employment, and has registered with the board.
18	9.11.12. "Registered applied behavior analyst" or "registrant" means an individual who is
19	registered under this chapter as a registered applied behavior analyst. The term does
20	not include an applied behavior analyst.
21	<u>13.</u> "School or college" means any university or other institution of higher learning which is
22	accredited by a regional accrediting association, offering a full-time graduate course of
23	study in industrial-organizational psychology or, psychology, or applied behavior
24	analysis, as appropriate.
25	SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is
26	amended and reenacted as follows:
27	43-32-08. Rules.
28	The board may adopt rules as necessary to enable the board to carry into effect the
29	provisions of this chapter. The rules may include a code of ethics for licensees and registrants.
30	The board shall adopt rules defining what programs of study are substantially psychological in
31	nature; what educational programs are acceptable for the licensing of psychologists and applied

1	behavior analysts and for registering registered applied behavior analysts; and what educational
2	programs are acceptable for the licensing of industrial-organizational psychologists. The
3	educational program rules for industrial-organizational psychologists must take into account the
4	availability of professionally accredited programs in the field of industrial-organizational
5	psychology.
6	SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-08.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is
7	amended and reenacted as follows:
8	43-32-08.1. Continuing education requirements.
9	The board shall adopt rules establishing requirements for the continuing education of
10	licensees, psychology residents, registrants, and industrial-organizational psychology residents.
11	The board may refuse to renew, suspend, revoke, or place on probationary status any license
12	or registration issued under this chapter if the licensee or registrant fails to meet applicable
13	continuing education requirements. Applicants for accreditation of continuing education courses,
14	classes, or activities may be charged a reasonable fee determined by the board.
15	SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-08.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is
16	amended and reenacted as follows:
17	43-32-08.2. Continuing education requirements - Renewal.
18	Absent a showing of good cause, the board may not renew a license or registration issued
19	under this chapter without proof the continuing education requirements under section
20	43-32-08.1 have been met. An individual whose license or registration is not renewed because
21	of failure to meet the continuing education requirements must be reinstated and the license or
22	registration renewed if, within one year from the date of nonrenewal, the individual
23	demonstrates to the secretary of the board the continuing education requirements have been
24	satisfied, pays the renewal fee, and pays a late fee to be determined by rule of the board.
25	SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is
26	amended and reenacted as follows:
27	43-32-09. Examination of qualifications of applicants.
28	The board shall examine for, deny, approve, revoke, suspend, and renew the licensing and
29	registration of applicants as provided under this chapter.
30	SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is
31	amended and reenacted as follows:

1	43-32-12. Application and license fee for licensure and registration.		
2	The board shall adopt rules establishing the amount of the application fee for licensure an		
3	registration by written and oral examination and by reciprocity. A fee is not refundable, in whole		
4	or in part, except for failure of the board to hold examinations at the time originally announced,		
5	in which event the entire fee must be refunded upon demand by the applicant.		
6	SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-13 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
7	amended and reenacted as follows:		
8	43-32-13. Annual license and <u>registration</u> fee.		
9	Before January first of each year, every licensee and registrant shall pay to the secretary of		
10	the board an annual license fee determined by the board not to exceed one hundred fifty		
11	dollarsthe costs incurred by the board in issuing the license or registration. The secretary of the		
12	board, upon receipt of payment of the annual license fee, shall issue the licensee or registrant a		
13	certificate of annual licenserenewal. An individual may not hold out as an		
14	industrial-organizational psychologist, an applied behavior analyst, a registered applied		
15	behavior analyst, or a psychologist until the annual license fee is paid. The board may deny		
16	renewal of the license or registration of an individual who violates this section. Annually, the		
17	board shall mail a renewal notice to each licensee and registrant at the address on file with the		
18	board.		
19	SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-14 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
20	amended and reenacted as follows:		
21	43-32-14. Payment of delinquent license feesannual fee - Reinstatement.		
22	An individual whose license or registration issued under this chapter was revoked for failure		
23	to pay the annual license fee must be reinstated and the license or registration renewed if,		
24	within one year from the date of revocation, the individual pays to the secretary of the board the		
25	amount of the annual license fees in default and a late fee in the amount of twenty dollars.		
26	SECTION 9. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 43-32-16 of the North Dakota Century		
27	Code is amended and reenacted as follows:		
28	1. The board shall keep a record of its proceedings and a register of all applicants for		
29	licensing or registration which must show:		
30	a. The name, age, and residence of each applicant.		
31	b. The date of each applicant's application.		

1	c. The place of business of each applicant.
2	d. A summary of the educational and other qualifications of each applicant.
3	e. Whether an examination was required of an applicant.
4	f. Whether a license or registration was granted to an applicant.
5	g. The date of the action of the board.
6	h. Any information the board determines necessary or advisable in aid of the
7	requirements of this subsection.
8	SECTION 10. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-19.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is
9	amended and reenacted as follows:
10	43-32-19.1. Licensing applicant licensed in other jurisdictions.
11	<u>1.</u> The board may grant a license to an applicant, licensed in good standing in another
12	jurisdiction, who passes the oral examination on the law and rules regulating the
13	practice of psychology-and, industrial-organizational psychology, or applied behavior
14	analysis and meets one of the following requirements:
15	<u>1.a.</u> The applicant is licensed in a jurisdiction that imposes requirements for licensure
16	which are at least as stringent as the requirements imposed in this state.
17	2.b. The applicant holds a certificate of professional qualification in psychology issued
18	by the association of state and provincial psychology boards or its successor.
19	2. The board shall grant a provisional license or registration to an applicant to be an
20	applied behavior analyst or registered applied behavior analyst while the application is
21	pending, provided the applicant is:
22	a. Licensed or registered and is in good standing in another jurisdiction; or
23	b. Certified in good standing with the national behavior analyst certification board.
24	SECTION 11. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-30 of the North Dakota Century Code is
25	amended and reenacted as follows:
26	43-32-30. Persons exempt from this chapter.
27	This chapter does not apply to:
28	1. A student or intern pursuing a course of study in psychology-or,
29	industrial-organizational psychology, or applied behavior analysis at a school or
30	college, if the activities and services are a part of the individual's supervised course of
31	study and are under the supervision of a licensed psychologist-or.

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1		industrial-organizational psychologist, registrant, or applied behavior analyst. The
2		student or intern shallmay not use the title "psychologist"-or, "industrial-organizational
3		psychologist", "licensed behavior analyst", or "registered applied behavior analyst" and
4		the student or intern status shallmust be clearly stated.
5	2.	A nonresident licensed, registered, or certified in the state of the individual's residence
6		who does not practice psychology-or, industrial-organizational psychology, or applied
7		behavior analysis in this state for a period of more than thirty days in any calendar
8		year.
9	3.	A lecturer, from any school or college, who uses an academic or research title when
10		lecturing to institutions or organizations. However, the lecturer may not engage in the
11		practice of psychology, applied behavior analysis, or industrial-organizational
12		psychology unless the lecturer is licensed or registered under this chapter.
13	4.	An individual employed by a public school if that individual's activities and services are
14		restricted to the practice of psychology in the district or service unit of employment.
15		This exemption applies only if the individual has received a master's degree in school
16		psychology from an accredited graduate training program. Standards must be
17		established by mutual consent of the board and the superintendent of public
18		instruction.
19	5.	A person certified, licensed, or registered in this state in another health care
20		profession, or as a member of the clergy functioning in a ministerial capacity, whose
21		scope of practice is consistent with the accepted standards of that person's
22		profession. A person claiming an exemption under this subsection may not represent
23		to be rendering psychological or applied behavior analysis services.
24	6.	An applicant licensed to practice psychology or industrial-organizational psychology in
25		another jurisdiction, pending disposition of the applicant's application in this state, if
26		the applicant notifies the board on a form provided by the board of the applicant's
27		intent to practice pending disposition of the application and the applicant adheres to
28		the requirements of this chapter and the rules adopted by the board.
29	7.	A person employed by an agency, a nonprofit corporation, or an institution if that
30		person is currently exempt from licensure. A person exempt under this subsection
31		continues to be exempt if the person continues employment in the same position with

1	the agency, nonprofit corporation, or institution that applied for and received the		
2	exemption.		
3	8. An individual providing applied behavior analysis services to an individual in a public		
4	school setting.		
5	9. An individual providing applied behavior analysis services to an individual served by a		
6	public or private service agency licensed by the state to provide residential,		
7	habilitative, vocational, or social support services as defined by the board when		
8	performed as part of an individual support plan supervised by a professional employee		
9	meeting the requirements of that agency's licensure standards, provided the		
10	professional employee does not represent to the public as a registrant or an applied		
11	behavior analyst.		
12	10. An individual who is implementing applied behavior analysis services to an immediate		
13	family member or as a paid or volunteer caregiver implementing procedures		
14	established by the family or by the individual served in any setting, if the individual or		
15	caregiver does not represent as a registrant or an applied behavior analyst.		
16	SECTION 12. A new section to chapter 43-32 of the North Dakota Century Code is created		
17	and enacted as follows:		
18	Applied behavior analysis - CertificationLicensure or registration required - Titles		
19	Exemptions.		
20	1. Unless certified as a registrant, an applied behavior analyst under this chapter, or a		
21	psychologist, a person may not:		
22	a.1. Engage in the practice of applied behavior analysis or render services designated as		
23	applied behavior analysis or hold out as a practitioner of applied behavior analysis in		
24	this state; or		
25	b.2. Use the title "certified licensed applied behavior analyst" or "registered applied		
26	behavior analyst" or any title that is substantially the same unless certified licensed or		
27	registered by the board under this chapter.		
28	2. The certification requirement of subdivision a of subsection 1 does not apply to an		
29	individual who is:		
30	a. Providing applied behavior analysis services to an individual in a public school		
31	setting:		

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1		<u>b.</u>	Implementing applied behavior analysis services to an immediate family member;
2		<u> </u>	A student or intern pursuing a course of study in applied behavior analysis at a
3			school or college if the activities and services are part of the individual's
4			supervised course of study and are under the supervision of a licensed
5			psychologist or certified applied behavior analyst.
6		<u>d.</u>	A nonresident licensed or certified in the state of the individual's residence who
7			does not practice applied behavior analysis in this state for a period of more than
8			thirty days in any calendar year;
9		<u>e.</u>	An individual certified, licensed, or registered in this state in another health care
10			profession, or as a member of the clergy functioning in a ministerial capacity,
11			whose scope of practice is consistent with the accepted standards of that
12			individual's profession. An individual claiming an exemption under this subsection
13			may not represent to be rendering applied behavior analysis services.
14	SECTION 13. A new section to chapter 43-32 of the North Dakota Century Code is created

3	<u>3.</u>	Before January first of each year, every certified registrant and applied behavior
4		analyst shall pay to the secretary of the board an annual certification license or
5		registration renewal fee determined by the board not to exceed one hundred fifty
6		dollars. The secretary of the board, upon receipt of payment of the annual certification
7		fee, shall issue the certificatelicense or registration holder a certificate of annual
8		renewal. An individual may not hold out as an applied behavior analyst until the annual
9		certification fee is paid. The board may deny renewal of the certification license or
10		registration of an individual who violates this section. Annually, the board shall mail a
11		renewal notice to each certified registrant and applied behavior analyst at the address
12		on file with the board. An individual whose certification license or registration issued
13		under this chapter was revoked for failure to pay the annual certification renewal fee
14		must be reinstated and the certification license or registration renewed if, within one
15		year from the date of revocation, the individual pays to the secretary of the board the
16		amount of the annual certification renewal fees in default and a late fee in the amount
17		of twenty dollars.
18	<u>4.</u>	The board may withhold, deny, revoke, or suspend a certificatelicense or registration
19		for applied behavior analyst applied for or issued under this chapter and otherwise
20		may discipline a certificatelicense or registration holder or applicant in the same
21		manner provided under section 43-32-27.
22	<u>5.</u>	A complaint regarding or board investigation of a certified licensed or registered applied
23		behavior analyst is filed or conducted in the same manner as provided under section
24		<u>43-32-27.1.</u>
25	6.	If an individual employed in the state on August 1, 2011, in the practice of applied
26		behavior analysis submits to the board a written request before January 1, 2013, the
27		required license or registration application fee, and a written statement from the
28		applicant's employer that the applicant's employment remains satisfactory, the board
29		shall issue to that applicant:

1	a.	A license as an applied behavior analyst if the applicant is employed in a position
2		granted license exemption by the board and submits a letter of endorsement from
3		the licensed psychologist supervisor.
4	b.	A license as an applied behavior analyst if the applicant has a master's degree in
5		psychology and is employed as a behavior analyst as verified in writing by the
6		applicant's employer. Acceptable work titles for an applicant under this
7		subdivision include behavior analyst, behavior interventionist, and behavior
8		modification specialist.
9	C.	Registration as an applied behavior analyst if the applicant has a bachelor's
10		degree; provides a board-approved plan of supervision from a licensed
11		psychologist or applied behavior analyst; and is employed as a behavior analyst
12		as verified in writing by the applicant's employer. Acceptable work titles for an
13		applicant under this subdivision include behavior analyst, behavior interventionist,
14		and behavior modification specialist.
