# FIRST ENGROSSMENT

### **ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2155**

Introduced by

Senator J. Lee

1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact two new sections to chapter 43-32 of the North Dakota

2 Century Code, relating to regulation of applied behavior analysts; and to amend and reenact

3 sections 43-32-01, 43-32-08, 43-32-08.1, 43-32-08.2, 43-32-09, 43-32-12, 43-32-13, and

4 43-32-14, subsection 1 of section 43-32-16, and sections 43-32-19.1 and 43-32-30 of the North

5 Dakota Century Code, relating to the regulation of applied behavior analysis by the state board

6 of psychologist examiners.

# 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

8 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-32-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is

9 amended and reenacted as follows:

#### 10 **43-32-01. Definitions.**

- 1. <u>"Applied behavior analyst" means an individual licensed under this chapter as an</u>
- applied behavior analyst. The term does not include a registered applied behavior
   analyst.
- <u>"Autism spectrum disorder" means a neurobiological medical condition that includes</u>
   <u>autistic disorder, Asperger's disorder, pervasive development disorder not otherwise</u>
   specified, Rett's disorder, and childhood disintegrative disorder.

17 <u>3.</u> "Board" means the North Dakota state board of psychologist examiners.

- 18 2.4. "Industrial-organizational psychologist" means an individual who is licensed under this
   19 chapter to engage in the practice of industrial-organizational psychology.
- 20 <u>3.5.</u> "Industrial-organizational psychology" means the provision of psychological research
- 21 services or consultation services to a group or an organization. The term does not
- include the delivery or supervision of services to individuals who are themselves,
- rather than the group or organization, the intended beneficiaries of the services,
- 24 regardless of the source or extent of payment for services rendered.

2		requirer	nent of subdivision b of subsection 2 of section 43-32-20, is involved in	
3		supervised employment in industrial-organizational psychology, and has registered

5	<del>5.<u>7.</u></del>	"Licens	ee" means an industrial-organizational psychologist, an applied behavior	
6		<u>analyst,</u>	or a psychologist.	
7	<del>6.<u>8.</u></del>	"Practic	e of applied behavior analysis":	
8		<u>a. Me</u>	eans the application of the principles, methods, and procedures of the	
9		<u>ex</u>	perimental analysis of behavior and applied behavior analysis, including	
10		pri	nciples of operant and respondent learning. The term includes applications of	
11		<u>tho</u>	ose principles, methods, and procedures to:	
12		<u>(1)</u>	Design, implement, evaluate, and modify treatment programs to change the	
13			behavior of individuals diagnosed with an autism spectrum disorder;	
14		<u>(2)</u>	Design, implement, evaluate, and modify treatment programs to change the	
15			behavior of individuals;	
16		<u>(3)</u>	Design, implement, evaluate, and modify treatment programs to change the	
17			behavior of groups; and	
18		<u>(4)</u>	Consult with individuals and organizations.	
19		<u>b. Th</u>	e term does not include diagnosis, counseling, psychological testing,	
20		pe	rsonality assessment, intellectual assessment, neuropsychological	
21		as	sessment, psychotherapy, cognitive therapy, sex therapy, family therapy,	
22		<u>CO</u>	ordination of care, psychoanalysis, hypnotherapy, and long-term counseling as	
23		tre	atment modalities.	
24	<u>9.</u>	"Practic	e of psychology" means the observation, description, evaluation, interpretation,	
25		or modi	fication of human behavior by the application of psychological principles,	
26		method	s, and procedures for the purpose of preventing or eliminating symptomatic,	
27		malada	ptive, or undesired behavior and enhancing interpersonal relationships, work	
28		and life	adjustment, personal effectiveness, behavioral health, and mental health. The	
29		term inc	cludes psychological testing and the evaluation or assessment of personal	
30		charact	eristics, such as intelligence, personality, abilities, interests, aptitudes, and	
31		neurops	sychological functioning; counseling, psychotherapy, biofeedback, behavior	

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1		analysis and therapy, clinical applications of hypnosis, and other therapeutic	
2		techniques based on psychological principles; diagnosis and treatment of mental and	
3		emotional disorder or disability, compulsive disorders, disorders of habit or conduct as	
4		well as of the psychological aspects of physical illness, accident, injury, or disability;	
5		and psychoeducational evaluation, therapy, remediation, and consultation. The term	
6		includes providing psychological services to individuals, families, groups,	
7		organizations, institutions, and the public regardless of whether payment is received	
8		for services rendered. The term includes supervising others who are engaged in the	
9		practice of psychology.	
10	<del>7.<u>10.</u></del>	"Psychologist" means an individual who is licensed under this chapter in the practice	
11		of psychology.	
12	<del>8.<u>11.</u></del>	"Psychology resident" means an individual who has met the requirement of	
13		subdivision b of subsection 1 of section 43-32-20, is involved in supervised	
14		psychological employment, and has registered with the board.	
15	<del>9.<u>12.</u></del>	"Registered applied behavior analyst" or "registrant" means an individual who is	
16		registered under this chapter as a registered applied behavior analyst. The term does	
17		not include an applied behavior analyst.	
18	<u>13.</u>	"School or college" means any university or other institution of higher learning which is	
19		accredited by a regional accrediting association, offering a full-time graduate course of	
20		study in industrial-organizational psychology or, psychology, or applied behavior	
21		analysis, as appropriate.	
22	SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
23	amended and reenacted as follows:		
24	43-32-08. Rules.		
25	The board may adopt rules as necessary to enable the board to carry into effect the		
26	provisions of this chapter. The rules may include a code of ethics for licensees and registrants.		

27 The board shall adopt rules defining what programs of study are substantially psychological in

28 nature; what educational programs are acceptable for the licensing of psychologists and applied

29 <u>behavior analysts and for registering registered applied behavior analysts;</u> and what educational

- 30 programs are acceptable for the licensing of industrial-organizational psychologists. The
- 31 educational program rules for industrial-organizational psychologists must take into account the

- 1 availability of professionally accredited programs in the field of industrial-organizational
- 2 psychology.

3 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-08.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is
4 amended and reenacted as follows:

5 **43-32-08.1. Continuing education requirements.** 

6 The board shall adopt rules establishing requirements for the continuing education of

7 licensees, psychology residents, <u>registrants</u>, and industrial-organizational psychology residents.

8 The board may refuse to renew, suspend, revoke, or place on probationary status any license

9 <u>or registration</u> issued under this chapter if the licensee <u>or registrant</u> fails to meet applicable

10 continuing education requirements. Applicants for accreditation of continuing education courses,

11 classes, or activities may be charged a reasonable fee determined by the board.

12 SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-08.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is

13 amended and reenacted as follows:

#### 14 **43-32-08.2.** Continuing education requirements - Renewal.

15 Absent a showing of good cause, the board may not renew a license <u>or registration</u> issued

16 under this chapter without proof the continuing education requirements under section

17 43-32-08.1 have been met. An individual whose license or registration is not renewed because

18 of failure to meet the continuing education requirements must be reinstated and the license or

19 registration renewed if, within one year from the date of nonrenewal, the individual

20 demonstrates to the secretary of the board the continuing education requirements have been

21 satisfied, pays the renewal fee, and pays a late fee to be determined by rule of the board.

22 SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is

amended and reenacted as follows:

#### 24 **43-32-09.** Examination of qualifications of applicants.

25 The board shall examine for, deny, approve, revoke, suspend, and renew the licensing <u>and</u>

26 <u>registration</u> of applicants as provided under this chapter.

27 SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is

amended and reenacted as follows:

#### 29 **43-32-12.** Application and license fee for licensure and registration.

30 The board shall adopt rules establishing the amount of the application fee for licensure <u>and</u>

31 <u>registration</u> by written and oral examination and by reciprocity. A fee is not refundable, in whole

- 1 or in part, except for failure of the board to hold examinations at the time originally announced,
- 2 in which event the entire fee must be refunded upon demand by the applicant.
- 3 SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-13 of the North Dakota Century Code is

4 amended and reenacted as follows:

5 **43-32-13.** Annual license and <u>registration</u> fee.

6 Before January first of each year, every licensee <u>and registrant</u> shall pay to the secretary of

7 the board an annual license fee determined by the board not to exceed one hundred fifty-

8 dollarsthe costs incurred by the board in issuing the license or registration. The secretary of the

9 board, upon receipt of payment of the annual license fee, shall issue the licensee or registrant a

10 certificate of annual licenserenewal. An individual may not hold out as an

11 industrial-organizational psychologist, an applied behavior analyst, a registered applied

12 <u>behavior analyst</u>, or a psychologist until the annual license fee is paid. The board may deny

13 renewal of the license or registration of an individual who violates this section. Annually, the

board shall mail a renewal notice to each licensee <u>and registrant</u> at the address on file with the
board.

16 SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-14 of the North Dakota Century Code is

17 amended and reenacted as follows:

18 **43-32-14. Payment of delinquent** *license feesannual fee* - Reinstatement.

19 An individual whose license <u>or registration</u> issued under this chapter was revoked for failure

20 to pay the annual license fee must be reinstated and the license or registration renewed if,

21 within one year from the date of revocation, the individual pays to the secretary of the board the

22 amount of the annual license fees in default and a late fee in the amount of twenty dollars.

SECTION 9. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 43-32-16 of the North Dakota Century
 Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

- The board shall keep a record of its proceedings and a register of all applicants for
   licensing <u>or registration</u> which must show:
- a. The name, age, and residence of each applicant.
- 28 b. The date of each applicant's application.
- 29 c. The place of business of each applicant.
- 30 d. A summary of the educational and other qualifications of each applicant.
- 31 e. Whether an examination was required of an applicant.

1	f.	Whether a license or registration was granted to an applicant.	
2	g.	The date of the action of the board.	
3	h.	Any information the board determines necessary or advisable in aid of the	
4		requirements of this subsection.	
5	SECTIO	N 10. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-19.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
6	amended an	d reenacted as follows:	
7	43-32-19	.1. Licensing applicant licensed in other jurisdictions.	
8	<u>1.</u> The	e board may grant a license to an applicant, licensed in good standing in another	
9	juri	sdiction, who passes the oral examination on the law and rules regulating the	
10	pra	ctice of psychology and, industrial-organizational psychology, or applied behavior	
11	ana	lysis and meets one of the following requirements:	
12	<u>1.a.</u>	The applicant is licensed in a jurisdiction that imposes requirements for licensure	
13		which are at least as stringent as the requirements imposed in this state.	
14	<del>2.</del> b.	The applicant holds a certificate of professional qualification in psychology issued	
15		by the association of state and provincial psychology boards or its successor.	
16	<u>2. The</u>	e board shall grant a provisional license or registration to an applicant to be an	
17	app	lied behavior analyst or registered applied behavior analyst while the application is	
18	per	iding, provided the applicant is:	
19	<u>a.</u>	Licensed or registered and is in good standing in another jurisdiction; or	
20	<u>b.</u>	Certified in good standing with the national behavior analyst certification board.	
21	SECTIO	N 11. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-30 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
22	amended and reenacted as follows:		
23	43-32-30	). Persons exempt from this chapter.	
24	This chapter does not apply to:		
25	1. A s <sup>.</sup>	tudent or intern pursuing a course of study in psychology <del>or</del> ,	
26	ind	ustrial-organizational psychology, or applied behavior analysis at a school or	
27	coll	ege, if the activities and services are a part of the individual's supervised course of	
28	stu	dy and are under the supervision of a licensed psychologist <del>or</del> .	
29	ind	ustrial-organizational psychologist, registrant, or applied behavior analyst. The	
30	stu	dent or intern shall <u>may</u> not use the title "psychologist" or, "industrial-organizational	

1	psychologist", "licensed behavior analyst", or "registered applied behavior analyst" and
2	the student or intern status shallmust be clearly stated.

A nonresident licensed, registered, or certified in the state of the individual's residence
 who does not practice psychology <del>or</del>, industrial-organizational psychology, or applied
 <u>behavior analysis</u> in this state for a period of more than thirty days in any calendar
 year.

- A lecturer, from any school or college, who uses an academic or research title when
   lecturing to institutions or organizations. However, the lecturer may not engage in the
   practice of psychology, applied behavior analysis, or industrial-organizational
   psychology unless the lecturer is licensed <u>or registered</u> under this chapter.
- An individual employed by a public school if that individual's activities and services are
   restricted to the practice of psychology in the district or service unit of employment.
   This exemption applies only if the individual has received a master's degree in school
   psychology from an accredited graduate training program. Standards must be
   established by mutual consent of the board and the superintendent of public
   instruction.
- A person certified, licensed, or registered in this state in another health care
  profession, or as a member of the clergy functioning in a ministerial capacity, whose
  scope of practice is consistent with the accepted standards of that person's
  profession. A person claiming an exemption under this subsection may not represent
  to be rendering psychological <u>or applied behavior analysis</u> services.
- An applicant licensed to practice psychology or industrial-organizational psychology in
  another jurisdiction, pending disposition of the applicant's application in this state, if
  the applicant notifies the board on a form provided by the board of the applicant's
  intent to practice pending disposition of the application and the applicant adheres to
  the requirements of this chapter and the rules adopted by the board.
- A person employed by an agency, a nonprofit corporation, or an institution if that
  person is currently exempt from licensure. A person exempt under this subsection
  continues to be exempt if the person continues employment in the same position with
  the agency, nonprofit corporation, or institution that applied for and received the
  exemption.

1	<u>8.</u>	An individual providing applied behavior analysis services to an individual in a public		
2		school setting.		
3	<u>9.</u>	An individual providing applied behavior analysis services to an individual served by a		
4		public or private service agency licensed by the state to provide residential,		
5		habilitative, vocational, or social support services as defined by the board when		
6		performed as part of an individual support plan supervised by a professional employee		
7		meeting the requirements of that agency's licensure standards, provided the		
8		professional employee does not represent to the public as a registrant or an applied		
9		behavior analyst.		
10	<u>10.</u>	An individual who is implementing applied behavior analysis services to an immediate		
11		family member or as a paid or volunteer caregiver implementing procedures		
12		established by the family or by the individual served in any setting, if the individual or		
13		caregiver does not represent as a registrant or an applied behavior analyst.		
14	4 SECTION 12. A new section to chapter 43-32 of the North Dakota Century Code is created			
15	and ena	cted as follows:		
16	<u>App</u>	lied behavior analysis - Licensure or registration required - Titles.		
17	<u>Unle</u>	ess a registrant, an applied behavior analyst, or a psychologist, a person may not:		
18	<u>1.</u>	Engage in the practice of applied behavior analysis or render services designated as		
19		applied behavior analysis or hold out as a practitioner of applied behavior analysis in		
20		this state; or		
21	<u>2.</u>	Use the title "licensed applied behavior analyst" or "registered applied behavior		
22		analyst" or any title that is substantially the same unless licensed or registered by the		
23		board under this chapter.		
24	SEC	<b>TION 13.</b> A new section to chapter 43-32 of the North Dakota Century Code is created		
25	and enacted as follows:			
26	<u>App</u>	<u> Applied behavior analysis - Renewal - Fees.</u>		
27	<u>1.</u>	The board shall issue a license or registration to each applicant who files an		
28		application for registration as a registered applied behavior analyst or for licensure as		
29		an applied behavior analyst upon a form and in a manner the board prescribes;		
30		submits the required fee established by the board; and demonstrates the applicant		
31		meets the requirements of subsection 2.		

1	<u>2.</u>	An applicant under this section shall demonstrate the applicant:
2		a. Has met board-approved education requirements, such as the education
3		requirements of the board-certified behavior analyst standards;
4		b. Has passed a board-approved demonstration of professional competence, such
5		as a standardized examination specific to the profession such as the
6		board-certified behavior analyst examination;
7		c. Is credentialed as a behavior analyst by a board-approved credentialing entity,
8		such as the behavior analyst certification board; and
9		d. Has established supervision requirements as determined by the board for
10		practice when applying as a registered applied behavior analyst.
11	<u>3.</u>	Before January first of each year, every registrant and applied behavior analyst shall
12		pay to the secretary of the board an annual license or registration renewal fee
13		determined by the board. The secretary of the board, upon receipt of payment of the
14		annual fee, shall issue the license or registration holder a certificate of annual renewal.
15		An individual may not hold out as an applied behavior analyst until the annual fee is
16		paid. The board may deny renewal of the license or registration of an individual who
17		violates this section. Annually, the board shall mail a renewal notice to each registrant
18		and applied behavior analyst at the address on file with the board. An individual whose
19		license or registration issued under this chapter was revoked for failure to pay the
20		annual renewal fee must be reinstated and the license or registration renewed if,
21		within one year from the date of revocation, the individual pays to the secretary of the
22		board the amount of the annual renewal fees in default and a late fee in the amount of
23		twenty dollars.
24	<u>4.</u>	The board may withhold, deny, revoke, or suspend a license or registration for applied
25		behavior analyst applied for or issued under this chapter and otherwise may discipline
26		a license or registration holder or applicant in the same manner provided under
27		section 43-32-27.
28	<u>5.</u>	A complaint regarding or board investigation of a licensed or registered applied
29		behavior analyst is filed or conducted in the same manner as provided under section
30		<u>43-32-27.1.</u>

1	<u>6.</u>	<u>lf ar</u>	n individual employed in the state on August 1, 2011, in the practice of applied
2		<u>beh</u>	avior analysis submits to the board a written request before January 1, 2013, the
3		requ	uired license or registration application fee, and a written statement from the
4		<u>app</u>	licant's employer that the applicant's employment remains satisfactory, the board
5		<u>sha</u>	Il issue to that applicant:
6		<u>a.</u>	A license as an applied behavior analyst if the applicant is employed in a position
7			granted license exemption by the board and submits a letter of endorsement from
8			the licensed psychologist supervisor.
9		<u>b.</u>	A license as an applied behavior analyst if the applicant has a master's degree in
10			psychology and is employed as a behavior analyst as verified in writing by the
11			applicant's employer. Acceptable work titles for an applicant under this
12			subdivision include behavior analyst, behavior interventionist, and behavior
13			modification specialist.
14		<u>C.</u>	Registration as an applied behavior analyst if the applicant has a bachelor's
15			degree; provides a board-approved plan of supervision from a licensed
16			psychologist or applied behavior analyst; and is employed as a behavior analyst
17			as verified in writing by the applicant's employer. Acceptable work titles for an
18			applicant under this subdivision include behavior analyst, behavior interventionist,
19			and behavior modification specialist.
