## FIRST ENGROSSMENT with House Amendments ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2155

- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact two new sections to chapter 43-32 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to regulation of applied behavior analysts; and to amend and reenact
- 3 sections 43-32-01, 43-32-08, 43-32-08.1, 43-32-08.2, 43-32-09, 43-32-12, 43-32-13, and
- 4 43-32-14, subsection 1 of section 43-32-16, and sections 43-32-19.1 and 43-32-30 of the North
- 5 Dakota Century Code, relating to the regulation of applied behavior analysis by the state board
- 6 of psychologist examiners.

## 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 8 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-32-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 10 **43-32-01. Definitions.**
- 1. "Applied behavior analyst" means an individual licensed under this chapter as an
- 12 <u>applied behavior analyst. The term does not include a registered applied behavior</u>
- 13 <u>analyst.</u>
- 14 <u>2.</u> "Board" means the North Dakota state board of psychologist examiners.
- 15 <u>2.3.</u> "Industrial-organizational psychologist" means an individual who is licensed under this chapter to engage in the practice of industrial-organizational psychology.
- 17 3.4. "Industrial-organizational psychology" means the provision of psychological research
- services or consultation services to a group or an organization. The term does not
- include the delivery or supervision of services to individuals who are themselves,
- rather than the group or organization, the intended beneficiaries of the services,
- regardless of the source or extent of payment for services rendered.
- 22 4.5. "Industrial-organizational psychology resident" means an individual who has met the requirement of subdivision b of subsection 2 of section 43-32-20, is involved in

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1 supervised employment in industrial-organizational psychology, and has registered 2 with the board. 3 <del>5.</del>6. "Licensee" means an industrial-organizational psychologist, an applied behavior 4 analyst, or a psychologist. 5 <del>6.</del>7. "Practice of applied behavior analysis": 6 Means the application of the principles, methods, and procedures of the 7 experimental analysis of behavior and applied behavior analysis, including 8 principles of operant and respondent learning. The term includes applications of 9 those principles, methods, and procedures to: 10 Design, supervise, evaluate, and modify treatment programs to change the 11 behavior of individuals: 12 (2) Design, supervise, evaluate, and modify treatment programs to change the 13 behavior of groups; and 14 Consult with individuals and organizations. (3) 15 <u>b.</u> The term does not include diagnosis, counseling, psychological testing, 16 personality assessment, intellectual assessment, neuropsychological 17 assessment, psychotherapy, cognitive therapy, sex therapy, family therapy, 18 coordination of care, psychoanalysis, hypnotherapy, and long-term counseling as 19 treatment modalities. 20 "Practice of psychology" means the observation, description, evaluation, interpretation, <u>8.</u> 21 or modification of human behavior by the application of psychological principles, 22 methods, and procedures for the purpose of preventing or eliminating symptomatic, 23 maladaptive, or undesired behavior and enhancing interpersonal relationships, work 24 and life adjustment, personal effectiveness, behavioral health, and mental health. The 25 term includes psychological testing and the evaluation or assessment of personal 26 characteristics, such as intelligence, personality, abilities, interests, aptitudes, and 27 neuropsychological functioning; counseling, psychotherapy, biofeedback, behavior 28 analysis and therapy, clinical applications of hypnosis, and other therapeutic 29 techniques based on psychological principles; diagnosis and treatment of mental and

emotional disorder or disability, compulsive disorders, disorders of habit or conduct as

well as of the psychological aspects of physical illness, accident, injury, or disability;

1 and psychoeducational evaluation, therapy, remediation, and consultation. The term 2 includes providing psychological services to individuals, families, groups, 3 organizations, institutions, and the public regardless of whether payment is received 4 for services rendered. The term includes supervising others who are engaged in the 5 practice of psychology. 6 <del>7.</del>9. "Psychologist" means an individual who is licensed under this chapter in the practice 7 of psychology. 8 <del>8.</del>10. "Psychology resident" means an individual who has met the requirement of 9 subdivision b of subsection 1 of section 43-32-20, is involved in supervised 10 psychological employment, and has registered with the board. 11 <del>9.</del>11. "Registered applied behavior analyst" or "registrant" means an individual who is 12 registered under this chapter as a registered applied behavior analyst and is 13 supervised by a licensed psychologist or applied behavior analyst. The term does not 14 include an applied behavior analyst. 15 <u>12.</u> "School or college" means any university or other institution of higher learning which is 16 accredited by a regional accrediting association, offering a full-time graduate course of 17 study in industrial-organizational psychology or, psychology, or applied behavior 18 analysis, as appropriate. 19 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-32-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is 20 amended and reenacted as follows: 21 43-32-08. Rules. 22 The board may adopt rules as necessary to enable the board to carry into effect the 23 provisions of this chapter. The rules may include a code of ethics for licensees and registrants. 24 The board shall adopt rules defining what programs of study are substantially psychological in 25 nature; what educational programs are acceptable for the licensing of psychologists and applied 26 behavior analysts and for registering registered applied behavior analysts; and what educational 27 programs are acceptable for the licensing of industrial-organizational psychologists. The 28 educational program rules for industrial-organizational psychologists must take into account the 29 availability of professionally accredited programs in the field of industrial-organizational 30 psychology.

1	SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-08.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is
2	amended and reenacted as follows:
3	43-32-08.1. Continuing education requirements.
4	The board shall adopt rules establishing requirements for the continuing education of
5	licensees, psychology residents, registrants, and industrial-organizational psychology residents
6	The board may refuse to renew, suspend, revoke, or place on probationary status any license
7	or registration issued under this chapter if the licensee or registrant fails to meet applicable
8	continuing education requirements. Applicants for accreditation of continuing education courses
9	classes, or activities may be charged a reasonable fee determined by the board.
10	SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-08.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is
11	amended and reenacted as follows:
12	43-32-08.2. Continuing education requirements - Renewal.
13	Absent a showing of good cause, the board may not renew a license or registration issued
14	under this chapter without proof the continuing education requirements under section
15	43-32-08.1 have been met. An individual whose license or registration is not renewed because
16	of failure to meet the continuing education requirements must be reinstated and the license or
17	registration renewed if, within one year from the date of nonrenewal, the individual
18	demonstrates to the secretary of the board the continuing education requirements have been
19	satisfied, pays the renewal fee, and pays a late fee to be determined by rule of the board.
20	SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is
21	amended and reenacted as follows:
22	43-32-09. Examination of qualifications of applicants.
23	The board shall examine for, deny, approve, revoke, suspend, and renew the licensing and
24	registration of applicants as provided under this chapter.
25	SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is
26	amended and reenacted as follows:
27	43-32-12. Application and license fee for licensure and registration.
28	The board shall adopt rules establishing the amount of the application fee for licensure and
29	registration by written and oral examination and by reciprocity. A fee is not refundable, in whole
30	or in part, except for failure of the board to hold examinations at the time originally announced,
٦1	in which event the entire fee must be refunded upon demand by the applicant

6	1. The boa	rd may grant a license to an applicant, licensed in good standing in another
7	jurisdicti	on, who passes the oral examination on the law and rules regulating the
8	practice	of psychology and, industrial-organizational psychology, or applied behavior
9	<u>analysis</u>	and meets one of the following requirements:
10	<del>1.</del> <u>a.</u> The	e applicant is licensed in a jurisdiction that imposes requirements for licensure
11	wh	ich are at least as stringent as the requirements imposed in this state.
12	<del>2.</del> <u>b.</u> The	e applicant holds a certificate of professional qualification in psychology issued
13	by	the association of state and provincial psychology boards or its successor.
14	2. The boa	rd shall grant a provisional license or registration to an applicant to be an
15	<u>applied</u>	behavior analyst or registered applied behavior analyst while the application is
16	pending	, provided the applicant is:
17	<u>a. Lic</u>	ensed or registered and is in good standing in another jurisdiction; or
18	<u>b.</u> <u>Ce</u>	rtified in good standing with the national behavior analyst certification board.
19	SECTION 11	AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-30 of the North Dakota Century Code is
20	amended and ree	nacted as follows:
21	43-32-30. Pe	rsons exempt from this chapter.
22	This chapter	does not apply to:
23	1. A studer	nt or intern pursuing a course of study in psychology <del>or</del> ,_
24	industria	al-organizational psychology, or applied behavior analysis at a school or
25	college,	if the activities and services are a part of the individual's supervised course of
26	study ar	nd are under the supervision of a licensed psychologist or,_
27	industria	al-organizational psychologist, or applied behavior analyst. The student or
28	intern <del>sł</del>	<del>nall</del> may not use the title "psychologist" <del>or</del> , "industrial-organizational
29	psycholo	ogist", "licensed behavior analyst", or "registered applied behavior analyst" and
30	the stud	ent or intern status <del>shall<u>must</u> be clearly stated</del> .

- 2. A nonresident licensed, registered, or certified in the state of the individual's residence who does not practice psychology er, industrial-organizational psychology, or applied behavior analysis in this state for a period of more than thirty days in any calendar year.
  - 3. A lecturer, from any school or college, who uses an academic or research title when lecturing to institutions or organizations. However, the lecturer may not engage in the practice of psychology, applied behavior analysis, or industrial-organizational psychology unless the lecturer is licensed or registered under this chapter.
  - 4. An individual employed by a public school if that individual's activities and services are restricted to the practice of psychology in the district or service unit of employment. This exemption applies only if the individual has received a master's degree in school psychology from an accredited graduate training program. Standards must be established by mutual consent of the board and the superintendent of public instruction.
  - 5. A person certified, licensed, or registered in this state in another health care profession, or as a member of the clergy functioning in a ministerial capacity, whose scope of practice is consistent with the accepted standards of that person's profession. A person claiming an exemption under this subsection may not represent to be rendering psychological or applied behavior analysis services.
  - 6. An applicant licensed to practice psychology or industrial-organizational psychology in another jurisdiction, pending disposition of the applicant's application in this state, if the applicant notifies the board on a form provided by the board of the applicant's intent to practice pending disposition of the application and the applicant adheres to the requirements of this chapter and the rules adopted by the board.
  - 7. A person employed by an agency, a nonprofit corporation, or an institution if that person is currently exempt from licensure. A person exempt under this subsection continues to be exempt if the person continues employment in the same position with the agency, nonprofit corporation, or institution that applied for and received the exemption.
  - 8. An individual providing applied behavior analysis services to an individual in a public school setting.

1	<u>9.</u>	An individual providing applied behavior analysis services to an individual served by a
2		public or private service agency licensed by the state to provide residential,
3		habilitative, vocational, or social support services as defined by the board when
4		performed as part of an individual support plan supervised by a professional employee
5		meeting the requirements of that agency's licensure standards, provided the
6		professional employee does not represent to the public as a registrant or an applied
7		behavior analyst.
8	<u>10.</u>	An individual who is implementing applied behavior analysis services to an immediate
9		family member or as a paid or volunteer caregiver implementing procedures
10		established by the family or by the individual served in any setting, if the individual or
11		caregiver does not represent as a registrant or an applied behavior analyst.
12	<u>11.</u>	An individual licensed as an occupational therapist or an occupational therapy
13		assistant pursuant to chapter 43-40 within the body of knowledge and scope of
14		professional practice of occupational therapy.
15	SEC	CTION 12. A new section to chapter 43-32 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
16	and ena	cted as follows:
17	<u>Арр</u>	olied behavior analysis - Licensure or registration required - Titles.
18	<u>Unle</u>	ess a registrant, an applied behavior analyst, or a psychologist, a person may not:
19	<u>1.</u>	Engage in the practice of applied behavior analysis or render services designated as
20		applied behavior analysis or hold out as a practitioner of applied behavior analysis in
21		this state; or
22	<u>2.</u>	Use the title "licensed applied behavior analyst" or "registered applied behavior
23		analyst" or any title that is substantially the same unless licensed or registered by the
24		board under this chapter.
25	SEC	CTION 13. A new section to chapter 43-32 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
26	and ena	cted as follows:
27	<u> App</u>	olied behavior analysis - Renewal - Fees.
28	<u>1.</u>	The board shall issue a license or registration to each applicant who files an
29		application for registration as a registered applied behavior analyst or for licensure as
30		an applied behavior analyst upon a form and in a manner the board prescribes;

1		submits the required fee established by the board; and demonstrates the applicant
2		meets the requirements of subsection 2.
3	<u>2.</u>	An applicant under this section shall demonstrate the applicant:
4		a. Has met board-approved education requirements, such as the education
5		requirements of the board-certified behavior analyst standards;
6		b. Has passed a board-approved demonstration of professional competence, such
7		as a standardized examination specific to the profession such as the
8		board-certified behavior analyst examination;
9		c. Is credentialed as a behavior analyst by a board-approved credentialing entity,
10		such as the behavior analyst certification board; and
11		d. Has established supervision requirements as determined by the board for
12		practice when applying as a registered applied behavior analyst.
13	<u>3.</u>	The board may withhold, deny, revoke, or suspend a license or registration for applied
14		behavior analyst applied for or issued under this chapter and otherwise may discipline
15		a license or registration holder or applicant in the same manner provided under
16		section 43-32-27.
17	<u>4.</u>	A complaint regarding or board investigation of a licensed or registered applied
18		behavior analyst is filed or conducted in the same manner as provided under section
19		43-32-27.1.
20	<u>5.</u>	If an individual employed in the state on August 1, 2011, in the practice of applied
21		behavior analysis submits to the board a written request before January 1, 2013, the
22		required license or registration application fee, and a written statement from the
23		applicant's employer that the applicant's employment remains satisfactory, the board
24		shall issue to that applicant:
25		a. A license as an applied behavior analyst if the applicant is employed in a position
26		granted license exemption by the board and submits a letter of endorsement from
27		the licensed psychologist supervisor.
28		b. A license as an applied behavior analyst if the applicant has a master's degree in
29		psychology and is employed as a behavior analyst as verified in writing by the
30		applicant's employer. Acceptable work titles for an applicant under this

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1		subdivision include behavior analyst, behavior interventionist, and behavior
2		modification specialist.
3	<u>C.</u>	Registration as an applied behavior analyst if the applicant has a bachelor's
4		degree; provides a board-approved plan of supervision from a licensed
5		psychologist or applied behavior analyst; and is employed as a behavior analyst
6		as verified in writing by the applicant's employer. Acceptable work titles for an
7		applicant under this subdivision include behavior analyst, behavior interventionist,
8		and behavior modification specialist.
