FIRST ENGROSSMENT with Conference Committee Amendments ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2155

1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact two new sections to chapter 43-32 of the North Dakota

2 Century Code, relating to regulation of applied behavior analysts; and to amend and reenact

3 sections 43-32-01, 43-32-08, 43-32-08.1, 43-32-08.2, 43-32-09, 43-32-12, 43-32-13, and

4 43-32-14, subsection 1 of section 43-32-16, and sections 43-32-19.1 and 43-32-30 of the North

5 Dakota Century Code, relating to the regulation of applied behavior analysis by the state board

6 of psychologist examiners.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

8 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-32-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is

9 amended and reenacted as follows:

10 **43-32-01**. **Definitions**.

- 1. <u>"Applied behavior analyst" means an individual licensed under this chapter as an</u>
- applied behavior analyst. The term does not include a registered applied behavior
 analyst.
- <u>"Autism spectrum disorder" means a neurobiological medical condition that includes</u>
 <u>autistic disorder, Asperger's disorder, pervasive development disorder not otherwise</u>
 specified, Rett's disorder, and childhood disintegrative disorder.

17 <u>3.</u> "Board" means the North Dakota state board of psychologist examiners.

- 18 2.4. "Industrial-organizational psychologist" means an individual who is licensed under this
 19 chapter to engage in the practice of industrial-organizational psychology.
- 20 <u>3.5.</u> "Industrial-organizational psychology" means the provision of psychological research
- 21 services or consultation services to a group or an organization. The term does not
- include the delivery or supervision of services to individuals who are themselves,
- rather than the group or organization, the intended beneficiaries of the services,
- 24 regardless of the source or extent of payment for services rendered.

1	<u>4.6.</u>	"Industrial-organizational psychology resident" means an individual who has met the
2		requirement of subdivision b of subsection 2 of section 43-32-20, is involved in
3		supervised employment in industrial-organizational psychology, and has registered
4		with the board.
5	5.<u>7.</u>	"Licensee" means an industrial-organizational psychologist, an applied behavior
6		<u>analyst,</u> or a psychologist.
7	6.<u>8.</u>	"Practice of applied behavior analysis":
8		a. Means the application of the principles, methods, and procedures of the
9		experimental analysis of behavior and applied behavior analysis, including
10		principles of operant and respondent learning. The term includes applications of
11		those principles, methods, and procedures to:
12		(1) Design, supervise, evaluate, and modify treatment programs to change the
13		behavior of individuals diagnosed with an autism spectrum disorder;
14		(2) Design, supervise, evaluate, and modify treatment programs to change the
15		behavior of individuals;
16		(3) Design, supervise, evaluate, and modify treatment programs to change the
17		behavior of groups; and
18		(4) Consult with individuals and organizations.
19		b. The term does not include diagnosis, counseling, psychological testing,
20		personality assessment, intellectual assessment, neuropsychological
21		assessment, psychotherapy, cognitive therapy, sex therapy, family therapy,
22		coordination of care, psychoanalysis, hypnotherapy, and long-term counseling as
23		treatment modalities.
24	<u>9.</u>	"Practice of psychology" means the observation, description, evaluation, interpretation
25		or modification of human behavior by the application of psychological principles,
26		methods, and procedures for the purpose of preventing or eliminating symptomatic,
27		maladaptive, or undesired behavior and enhancing interpersonal relationships, work
28		and life adjustment, personal effectiveness, behavioral health, and mental health. The
29		term includes psychological testing and the evaluation or assessment of personal
30		characteristics, such as intelligence, personality, abilities, interests, aptitudes, and
31		neuropsychological functioning; counseling, psychotherapy, biofeedback, behavior

1		analysis and therapy, clinical applications of hypnosis, and other therapeutic	
2	techniques based on psychological principles; diagnosis and treatment of mental and		
3		emotional disorder or disability, compulsive disorders, disorders of habit or conduct as	
4		well as of the psychological aspects of physical illness, accident, injury, or disability;	
5		and psychoeducational evaluation, therapy, remediation, and consultation. The term	
6 includes providing psychological services to individuals, families, g		includes providing psychological services to individuals, families, groups,	
7		organizations, institutions, and the public regardless of whether payment is received	
8		for services rendered. The term includes supervising others who are engaged in the	
9		practice of psychology.	
10	7.<u>10.</u>	"Psychologist" means an individual who is licensed under this chapter in the practice	
11		of psychology.	
12	8.<u>11.</u>	"Psychology resident" means an individual who has met the requirement of	
13		subdivision b of subsection 1 of section 43-32-20, is involved in supervised	
14		psychological employment, and has registered with the board.	
15	9.<u>12.</u>	"Registered applied behavior analyst" or "registrant" means an individual who is	
16		registered under this chapter as a registered applied behavior analyst and is	
17		supervised by a licensed psychologist or applied behavior analyst. The term does not	
18		include an applied behavior analyst.	
19	<u>13.</u>	"School or college" means any university or other institution of higher learning which is	
20		accredited by a regional accrediting association, offering a full-time graduate course of	
21		study in industrial-organizational psychology or, psychology, or applied behavior	
22		analysis, as appropriate.	
23	SEC	CTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
24	amende	ed and reenacted as follows:	
25	43-3	32-08. Rules.	
26	The	board may adopt rules as necessary to enable the board to carry into effect the	
27	provisions of this chapter. The rules may include a code of ethics for licensees and registrants.		
28	The board shall adopt rules defining what programs of study are substantially psychological in		
29	nature; what educational programs are acceptable for the licensing of psychologists and applied		
30	behavior analysts and for registering registered applied behavior analysts; and what educational		
31	programs are acceptable for the licensing of industrial-organizational psychologists. The		

- 1 educational program rules for industrial-organizational psychologists must take into account the
- 2 availability of professionally accredited programs in the field of industrial-organizational
- 3 psychology.

4 **SECTION 3. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-32-08.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is 5 amended and reenacted as follows:

6 **43-32-08.1. Continuing education requirements.**

7 The board shall adopt rules establishing requirements for the continuing education of 8 licensees, psychology residents, <u>registrants</u>, and industrial-organizational psychology residents. 9 The board may refuse to renew, suspend, revoke, or place on probationary status any license 10 <u>or registration</u> issued under this chapter if the licensee <u>or registrant</u> fails to meet applicable 11 continuing education requirements. Applicants for accreditation of continuing education courses, 12 classes, or activities may be charged a reasonable fee determined by the board.

13 SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-08.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is

14 amended and reenacted as follows:

15 **43-32-08.2. Continuing education requirements - Renewal.**

16 Absent a showing of good cause, the board may not renew a license <u>or registration</u> issued

17 under this chapter without proof the continuing education requirements under section

18 43-32-08.1 have been met. An individual whose license or registration is not renewed because

19 of failure to meet the continuing education requirements must be reinstated and the license or

20 registration renewed if, within one year from the date of nonrenewal, the individual

21 demonstrates to the secretary of the board the continuing education requirements have been

satisfied, pays the renewal fee, and pays a late fee to be determined by rule of the board.

23 SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is

24 amended and reenacted as follows:

25 **43-32-09. Examination of qualifications of applicants.**

26 The board shall examine for, deny, approve, revoke, suspend, and renew the licensing <u>and</u>

27 <u>registration</u> of applicants as provided under this chapter.

28 SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is

29 amended and reenacted as follows:

1 43-32-12. Application and license fee for licensure and registration.

The board shall adopt rules establishing the amount of the application fee for licensure <u>and</u> registration by written and oral examination and by reciprocity. A fee is not refundable, in whole or in part, except for failure of the board to hold examinations at the time originally announced, in which event the entire fee must be refunded upon demand by the applicant.

6 SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-13 of the North Dakota Century Code is

7 amended and reenacted as follows:

8 43-32-13. Annual license and <u>registration</u> fee.

9 Before January first of each year, every licensee <u>and registrant</u> shall pay to the secretary of

10 the board an annual license fee determined by the board not to exceed one hundred fifty

11 dollars. The secretary of the board, upon receipt of payment of the annual license fee, shall

12 issue the licensee or registrant a certificate of annual licenserenewal. An individual may not hold

13 out as an industrial-organizational psychologist. an applied behavior analyst, a registered

14 applied behavior analyst, or a psychologist until the annual license fee is paid. The board may

15 deny renewal of the license or registration of an individual who violates this section. Annually,

16 the board shall mail a renewal notice to each licensee <u>and registrant</u> at the address on file with

17 the board.

18 SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-14 of the North Dakota Century Code is

19 amended and reenacted as follows:

20 **43-32-14.** Payment of delinquent license fees<u>annual fee</u> - Reinstatement.

21 An individual whose license <u>or registration</u> issued under this chapter was revoked for failure

22 to pay the annual license fee must be reinstated and the license or registration renewed if,

23 within one year from the date of revocation, the individual pays to the secretary of the board the

24 amount of the annual license fees in default and a late fee in the amount of twenty dollars.

SECTION 9. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 43-32-16 of the North Dakota Century
 Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

- The board shall keep a record of its proceedings and a register of all applicants for
 licensing <u>or registration</u> which must show:
- 29 a. The name, age, and residence of each applicant.
- 30 b. The date of each applicant's application.
- 31 c. The place of business of each applicant.

1	d.	A summary of the educational and other qualifications of each applicant.			
2	e.	Whether an examination was required of an applicant.			
3	f.	Whether a license or registration was granted to an applicant.			
4	g.	The date of the action of the board.			
5	h.	Any information the board determines necessary or advisable in aid of the			
6		requirements of this subsection.			
7	SECTION 10. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-19.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is				
8	amended and reenacted as follows:				
9	43-32-19.1. Licensing applicant licensed in other jurisdictions.				
10	<u>1.</u> The	board may grant a license to an applicant, licensed in good standing in another			
11	juris	diction, who passes the oral examination on the law and rules regulating the			
12	prac	ctice of psychology and, industrial-organizational psychology, or applied behavior			
13	ana	lysis and meets one of the following requirements:			
14	<u>1.a.</u>	The applicant is licensed in a jurisdiction that imposes requirements for licensure			
15		which are at least as stringent as the requirements imposed in this state.			
16	2. b.	The applicant holds a certificate of professional qualification in psychology issued			
17		by the association of state and provincial psychology boards or its successor.			
18	<u>2. The</u>	board shall grant a provisional license or registration to an applicant to be an			
19	app	lied behavior analyst or registered applied behavior analyst while the application is			
20	pen	ding, provided the applicant is:			
21	<u>a.</u>	Licensed or registered and is in good standing in another jurisdiction; or			
22	<u>b.</u>	Certified in good standing with the national behavior analyst certification board.			
23	SECTION	N 11. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-30 of the North Dakota Century Code is			
24	amended and	d reenacted as follows:			
25	43-32-30	. Persons exempt from this chapter.			
26	This chap	oter does not apply to:			
27	1. A st	udent or intern pursuing a course of study in psychology or ,			
28	indu	ustrial-organizational psychology, or applied behavior analysis at a school or			
29	colle	ege, if the activities and services are a part of the individual's supervised course of			
30	stuc	ly and are under the supervision of a licensed psychologist or,			
31	indu	ustrial-organizational psychologist, or applied behavior analyst. The student or			

- 1 intern shall<u>may</u> not use the title "psychologist" or, "industrial-organizational
- psychologist", "licensed behavior analyst", or "registered applied behavior analyst" and
 the student or intern status shallmust be clearly stated.
- A nonresident licensed, registered, or certified in the state of the individual's residence
 who does not practice psychology or, industrial-organizational psychology, or applied
 behavior analysis in this state for a period of more than thirty days in any calendar
 year.
- A lecturer, from any school or college, who uses an academic or research title when
 lecturing to institutions or organizations. However, the lecturer may not engage in the
 practice of psychology, applied behavior analysis, or industrial-organizational
 psychology unless the lecturer is licensed or registered under this chapter.
- 4. An individual employed by a public school if that individual's activities and services are
 restricted to the practice of psychology in the district or service unit of employment.
 This exemption applies only if the individual has received a master's degree in school
 psychology from an accredited graduate training program. Standards must be
 established by mutual consent of the board and the superintendent of public
 instruction.
- 5. A person certified, licensed, or registered in this state in another health care
 profession, or as a member of the clergy functioning in a ministerial capacity, whose
 scope of practice is consistent with the accepted standards of that person's
 profession. A person claiming an exemption under this subsection may not represent
 to be rendering psychological <u>or applied behavior analysis</u> services.
- 6. An applicant licensed to practice psychology or industrial-organizational psychology in
 another jurisdiction, pending disposition of the applicant's application in this state, if
 the applicant notifies the board on a form provided by the board of the applicant's
 intent to practice pending disposition of the application and the applicant adheres to
 the requirements of this chapter and the rules adopted by the board.
- A person employed by an agency, a nonprofit corporation, or an institution if that
 person is currently exempt from licensure. A person exempt under this subsection
 continues to be exempt if the person continues employment in the same position with

1 the agency, nonprofit corporation, or institution that applied for and receiv		the agency, nonprofit corporation, or institution that applied for and received the
2		exemption.
3	<u>8.</u>	An individual providing applied behavior analysis services to an individual in a public
4		school setting.
5	<u>9.</u>	An individual providing applied behavior analysis services to an individual served by a
6		public or private service agency licensed by the state to provide residential,
7		habilitative, vocational, or social support services as defined by the board when
8		performed as part of an individual support plan supervised by a professional employee
9		meeting the requirements of that agency's licensure standards, provided the
10		professional employee does not represent to the public as a registrant or an applied
11		behavior analyst.
12	<u>10.</u>	An individual who is implementing applied behavior analysis services to an immediate
13		family member or as a paid or volunteer caregiver implementing procedures
14		established by the family or by the individual served in any setting, if the individual or
15		caregiver does not represent as a registrant or an applied behavior analyst.
16	<u>11.</u>	An individual licensed as an occupational therapist or an occupational therapy
17		assistant pursuant to chapter 43-30 within the body of knowledge and scope of
18		professional practice of occupational therapy.
19	SEC	TION 12. A new section to chapter 43-32 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
20	and ena	cted as follows:
21	<u>App</u>	lied behavior analysis - Licensure or registration required - Titles.
22	<u>Unle</u>	ess a registrant, an applied behavior analyst, or a psychologist, a person may not:
23	<u>1.</u>	Engage in the practice of applied behavior analysis or render services designated as
24		applied behavior analysis or hold out as a practitioner of applied behavior analysis in
25		this state; or
26	<u>2.</u>	Use the title "licensed applied behavior analyst" or "registered applied behavior
27		analyst" or any title that is substantially the same unless licensed or registered by the
28		board under this chapter.
29	SEC	TION 13. A new section to chapter 43-32 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
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30 and enacted as follows:

1	<u>App</u>	olied behavior analysis - Renewal - Fees.
2	<u>1.</u>	The board shall issue a license or registration to each applicant who files an
3		application for registration as a registered applied behavior analyst or for licensure as
4		an applied behavior analyst upon a form and in a manner the board prescribes;
5		submits the required fee established by the board; and demonstrates the applicant
6		meets the requirements of subsection 2.
7	<u>2.</u>	An applicant under this section shall demonstrate the applicant:
8		a. Has met board-approved education requirements, such as the education
9		requirements of the board-certified behavior analyst standards;
10		b. Has passed a board-approved demonstration of professional competence, such
11		as a standardized examination specific to the profession such as the
12		board-certified behavior analyst examination:
13		c. Is credentialed as a behavior analyst by a board-approved credentialing entity,
14		such as the behavior analyst certification board; and
15		d. Has established supervision requirements as determined by the board for
16		practice when applying as a registered applied behavior analyst.
17	<u>3.</u>	The board may withhold, deny, revoke, or suspend a license or registration for applied
18		behavior analyst applied for or issued under this chapter and otherwise may discipline
19		a license or registration holder or applicant in the same manner provided under
20		section 43-32-27.
21	<u>4.</u>	A complaint regarding or board investigation of a licensed or registered applied
22		behavior analyst is filed or conducted in the same manner as provided under section
23		<u>43-32-27.1.</u>
24	<u>5.</u>	If an individual employed in the state on August 1, 2011, in the practice of applied
25		behavior analysis submits to the board a written request before January 1, 2013, the
26		required license or registration application fee, and a written statement from the
27		applicant's employer that the applicant's employment remains satisfactory, the board
28		shall issue to that applicant:
29		a. A license as an applied behavior analyst if the applicant is employed in a position
30		granted license exemption by the board and submits a letter of endorsement from
31		the licensed psychologist supervisor.

1	<u>b.</u>	A license as an applied behavior analyst if the applicant has a master's degree in
2		psychology and is employed as a behavior analyst as verified in writing by the
3		applicant's employer. Acceptable work titles for an applicant under this
4		subdivision include behavior analyst, behavior interventionist, and behavior
5		modification specialist.
6	<u>C.</u>	Registration as an applied behavior analyst if the applicant has a bachelor's
7		degree; provides a board-approved plan of supervision from a licensed
8		psychologist or applied behavior analyst; and is employed as a behavior analyst
9		as verified in writing by the applicant's employer. Acceptable work titles for an
10		applicant under this subdivision include behavior analyst, behavior interventionist,
11		and behavior modification specialist.
