- 1 A BILL for an Act to prohibit interference with access to medical services and health insurance;
- 2 and to provide a penalty.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 SECTION 1.

5 Interference with access to medical services and health insurance - Prohibition -

6 Penalties.

7 For purposes of this section, "health insurance provider" means any person authorized by

8 the insurance commissioner to contract with residents of North Dakota to provide health

9 insurance.

10	<u>1.</u>	It is a class A misdemeanor for an officer, agent, or employee of the United States, or
11		an employee of any business entity providing services to the United States, to:

- 12a.Prevent, attempt to prevent, interfere with, or withhold medical services from a13legal resident or inhabitant of North Dakota or to withhold medicine or medical14treatment from a legal resident or inhabitant of North Dakota, if the prohibited act
- 15is based on a law, regulation, or rule of the United States which has not received16specific statutory approval by the North Dakota legislative assembly; or
- b. Prevent, attempt to prevent, interfere with, or void a contract between a legal
 resident or inhabitant of North Dakota and a health insurance provider, if the
 prohibited act is based on a law, regulation, or rule of the United States which
 has not received specific statutory approval by the North Dakota legislative
 assembly.
- 22 <u>2.</u> It is a class B misdemeanor for a public servant of the state of North Dakota to:
- 23 a. Prevent, attempt to prevent, interfere with, or withhold medical services from a
 24 legal resident or inhabitant of North Dakota or to withhold medicine or medical

1		treatment from a legal resident or inhabitant of North Dakota, if the prohibited act
2		is based on a law, regulation, or rule of the United States which has not received
3		specific statutory approval by the North Dakota legislative assembly; or
4	<u>b.</u>	Prevent, attempt to prevent, interfere with, or void a contract between a legal
5		resident or inhabitant of North Dakota and a health insurance provider, if the
6		prohibited act is based on a law, regulation, or rule of the United States which
7		has not received specific statutory approval by the North Dakota legislative
8		assembly.
