- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 25-17 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the state department of health's food program for individuals with
- 3 metabolic diseases; and to amend and reenact sections 23-41-03, 25-17-03, and 26.1-36-09.7
- 4 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the food program for individuals with metabolic
- 5 diseases.

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6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 7 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 23-41-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 8 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 9 23-41-03. Duties of the department.
- The department, in administering this chapter, shall:
- Cooperate with the federal government in the development of plans and policies for
 services for children with special health care needs.
- Adopt rules and take any necessary action to entitle the state to receive aid from the
 federal government for services for children with special health care needs in
 conformity with title 5, part 2, of the federal Social Security Act and its amendments.
 - Take action, give directions, and adopt rules to carry out the provisions of this chapter, including the adoption and application of suitable standards and procedures to ensure uniform and equitable treatment of all applicants for services for children with special health care needs.
- 4. Cooperate with the federal government in matters of mutual concern pertaining to services to children with special health care needs, including the adoption of methods of administration found necessary by the federal government for the efficient operation of the plan for assistance.
 - 5. Provide necessary qualified employees and representatives.

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- 1 Establish and enforce a merit system as may be required under the federal Social 2 Security Act, as amended through July 1, 2007 [Pub. L. 74-271; 49 Stat. 620; 3 42 U.S.C. 701 et seq.].
- 7. Make reports in the form and containing the information the federal government 5 requires and comply with the provisions, rules, and regulations the federal government makes to assure the correctness and verification of a report.
- 7 8. Publish a biennial report and any interim reports necessary.
- 8 9. Provide medical food and low-protein modified food products to individuals with-9 phenylketonuria or maple syrup urine disease under chapter 25-17as provided under 10 section 3 of this Act.
- 11 10. Establish eligibility criteria for services under this chapter at one hundred eighty-five 12 percent of the poverty line, except for criteria relating to Russell-Silver syndrome. 13 phenylketonuria, or maple syrup urine disease treatment services under section 14 23-41-07 and for metabolic disease treatment services under section 3 of this Act for 15 which income is not to be considered when determining eligibility. For purposes of this 16 chapter, "poverty line" has the same meaning as defined in section 50-29-01.
 - SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 25-17-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
 - 25-17-03. Treatment for positive diagnosis Registry of cases.
- 20 The state department of health shall:
 - Follow up with attending physicians cases with positive tests for metabolic diseases in order to determine the exact diagnosis.
- 23 Refer every diagnosed case of a metabolic disease to a qualified health care provider 2. 24 for necessary treatment of the metabolic disease.
 - 3. Maintain a registry of cases of metabolic diseases.
- 26 4. Provide medical food at no cost to males under age twenty-two and females under-27 age forty-five who are diagnosed with phenylketonuria or maple syrup urine disease, 28 regardless of income. If treatment services under this subsection are provided to an-29 individual by the department, the department may seek reimbursement from any 30 government program that provides coverage to that individual for the treatment 31 services provided by the department.

- 5. Offer for sale at cost medical food to females age forty-five and over and to males age twenty-two and over who are diagnosed with phenylketonuria or maple syrup urine-disease, regardless of income. These individuals are responsible for payment to the department for the cost of medical food.

 6. Provide low-protein modified food products, if medically necessary as determined by a
 - 6. Provide low-protein modified food products, if medically necessary as determined by a qualified health care provider, to females under age forty-five and males under age twenty-two who are receiving medical assistance and are diagnosed with phenylketonuria or maple syrup urine disease.
 - **SECTION 3.** A new section to chapter 25-17 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

Food product services for metabolic disease diagnosis.

- 1. The state department of health shall administer a program to provide medical food and low-protein modified food products to an individual with a metabolic disease for which the department determines the provision of these food items will lead to a significant reduction in mortality, morbidity, and associated disabilities. The health council shall adopt rules specifying which metabolic diseases are covered under this subsection.
- 2. The program must:
 - a. Provide medical food at no cost to a male under age twenty-two and a female under age forty-five who are diagnosed with a metabolic disease as provided under subsection 1, regardless of income. If treatment services under this subdivision are provided to an individual by the department, the department may seek reimbursement from any government program that provides coverage to that individual for the treatment services provided by the department.
 - b. Offer for sale at cost medical food to a female aged forty-five and over and to a male aged twenty-two and over who are diagnosed with a metabolic disease as provided under subsection 1, regardless of income. These individuals are responsible for payment to the department for the cost of the medical food.
 - c. Provide low-protein modified food products, if medically necessary as determined by a qualified health care provider, to a female under age forty-five and a male under age twenty-two who are receiving medical assistance and are diagnosed with a metabolic disease as provided under subsection 1.

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- 1 SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 26.1-36-09.7 of the North Dakota Century Code is 2 amended and reenacted as follows: 3 26.1-36-09.7. Foods and food products for inherited metabolic diseases. 4 As used in this section: 5 "Inherited metabolic disease" means maple syrup urine disease or a. 6 phenylketonuriahas the same meaning as a metabolic disease covered under 7 section 3 of this Act. 8 "Low-protein modified food product" means a food product that is specially b. 9 formulated to have less than one gram of protein per serving and is intended to 10 be used under the direction of a physician for the dietary treatment of an inherited 11 metabolic disease. The term does not include a natural food that is naturally low 12 in protein. 13 "Medical food" means a food that is intended for the dietary treatment of a C. 14 disease or condition for which nutritional requirements are established by medical 15 evaluation and is formulated to be consumed or administered under the direction 16 of a physician. 17 2. An insurance company, nonprofit health service corporation, or health maintenance 18 organization may not deliver, issue, execute, or renew any health insurance policy, 19 health service contract, or evidence of coverage that provides prescription coverage 20 on an individual, group, blanket, franchise, or association basis, unless the policy or 21 contract provides, for any person covered under the policy or contract, coverage for 22 medical foods and low-protein modified food products determined by a physician to be 23 medically necessary for the therapeutic treatment of an inherited metabolic disease. 24 3. This section applies to any covered individual born after December 31, 1962. This 25 section does not require coverage in excess of three thousand dollars per year total 26 for low-protein modified food products or medical food for an individual with an 27 inherited metabolic disease of amino acid or organic acid. 28 This section does not require medical benefits coverage for low-protein modified food
 - products or medical food for an individual to the extent those benefits are available to that individual under a state department of health or department of human services program.

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
