- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new chapter to title 31 of the North Dakota Century
- 2 Code, relating to the Uniform Unsworn Foreign Declarations Act; and to amend and reenact
- 3 section 12.1-11-01 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the crime of perjury.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 12.1-11-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
 - 12.1-11-01. Perjury.

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- 1. A person is guilty of perjury, a class C felony, if, in an official proceeding, hethe person makes a false statement under oath or equivalent affirmation, or swears or affirms the truth of a false statement previously made, when the statement is material and hethe person does not believe it the statement to be true.
 - Commission of perjury need not be proved by any particular number of witnesses or by documentary or other types of evidence.
 - Statement under oath or equivalent affirmation inconsistent with another statement made by himthe defendant under oath or equivalent affirmation to the degree that one of them is necessarily false, both having been made within the period of the statute of limitations, the prosecution may set forth the statements in a single count alleging in the alternative that one or the other was false and not believed by the defendant to be true. Proof that the defendant made such statements shall constitute constitutes a prima facie case that one or the other of the statements was false, but in the absence of sufficient proof of which statement was false, the defendant may be convicted under this section only if each of such statements was material to the official proceeding in which it was made.

1 For purposes of this section, "false statement under oath or equivalent affirmation" 2 includes a writing made in accordance with section 2 of this Act. 3 SECTION 2. A new chapter to title 31 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and 4 enacted as follows: 5 Definitions. 6 In this chapter: 7 "Boundaries of the United States" means the geographic boundaries of the United 1. 8 States, Puerto Rico, the United States Virgin Islands, and any territory or insular 9 possession subject to the jurisdiction of the United States. 10 "Law" includes the federal or a state constitution; a federal or state statute; a judicial 11 decision or order; a rule of court; an executive order; and an administrative rule, 12 regulation, or order. 13 "Record" means information that is inscribed on a tangible medium or that is stored in 3. 14 an electronic or other medium and is retrievable in perceivable form. 15 <u>4.</u> "Sign" means with present intent to authenticate or adopt a record: 16 To execute or adopt a tangible symbol; or <u>a.</u> 17 <u>b.</u> To attach to or logically associate with the record an electronic symbol, sound, or 18 process. 19 "State" means a state of the United States, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, the <u>5.</u> 20 United States Virgin Islands, or any territory or insular possession subject to the 21 jurisdiction of the United States. 22 "Sworn declaration" means a declaration in a signed record given under oath. The 6. 23 term includes a sworn statement, verification, certificate, and affidavit. 24 "Unsworn declaration" means a declaration in a signed record that is not given under <u>7.</u> 25 oath but is given under penalty of perjury. 26 Applicability. 27 This chapter applies to an unsworn declaration by a declarant who at the time of making the 28 declaration is physically located outside the boundaries of the United States whether or not the 29 location is subject to the jurisdiction of the United States. This chapter does not apply to a 30 declaration by a declarant who is physically located on property that is within the boundaries of
