- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact sections 15.1-06-06.1 and 15.1-06-06.2 of the North
- 2 Dakota Century Code, relating to school approval; to amend and reenact sections 15.1-02-11,
- 3 15.1-06-06, 15.1-13-18, 15.1-13-19, and 15.1-13-25 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating
- 4 to school approval; to repeal sections 15.1-27-08 and 15.1-27-09 of the North Dakota Century
- 5 Code, relating to payment reductions for unaccredited schools; to provide an effective date; and
- 6 to declare an emergency.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 8 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-02-11 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 10 15.1-02-11. Superintendent of public instruction Accreditation of schools Rules.
- 11 The superintendent of public instruction may adopt rules governing the accreditation of
- public and nonpublic schools. <u>Any rule adopted under this section must incorporate measures</u>
- 13 of student achievement and bear a direct relationship to improving student achievement.
- **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-06-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 15 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 16 **15.1-06-06.** Approval of public and nonpublic schools.
- 17 Each public and nonpublic school in this state offering elementary or secondary education
- 18 to students must be approved by the superintendent of public instruction. Except as otherwise
- 19 provided by law, the superintendent may not approve a school unless:
- 1. To be certified as an approved school by the superintendent of public instruction, the
- 21 <u>principal of each school shall submit to the superintendent of public instruction a</u>
- 22 <u>compliance report verifying that:</u>

20			<u>(2)</u>	Has deficiencies that have been addressed in a plan of correction which	
21				was submitted to and approved by the state fire marshal or the state fire	
22				marshal's designee; and	
23		<u>f.</u>	<u>All ir</u>	ndividuals hired after July 31, 2011, and having unsupervised contact with	
24			<u>stud</u>	ents at the school, have:	
25			<u>(1)</u>	Undergone a criminal history background check requested by the employing	
26				school district or requested on behalf of the employing nonpublic school; or	
27			<u>(2)</u>	Undergone a criminal history background check in order to be licensed by	
28				the education standards and practices board or by any other state licensing	
29				board.

17		<u>app</u>	rove	d and unapproved schools on the department's website.
18		<u>a.</u>	<u>In th</u>	ne case of a public school, the superintendent of public instruction shall:
19			<u>(1)</u>	Notify the parents of students enrolled in the school, either directly or
20				through the local media outlets, that the school is unapproved; and
21			<u>(2)</u>	Subtract from any state aid otherwise payable to the school district the
22				prorated amount attributable to the students in attendance at the
23				unapproved school for each day that the school's compliance report is not
24				on file with the superintendent of public instruction.
25		<u>b.</u>	<u>In th</u>	ne case of a nonpublic school, the superintendent of public instruction shall
26			<u>noti</u>	fy the parents of students enrolled in the school, either directly or through
27			loca	al media outlets, that the school is unapproved and that the parents may
28			ther	refore be in violation of the state's compulsory attendance provisions.
29	<u>5.</u>	<u>If b</u>	ecaus	se of unforeseen or other extenuating circumstances a school is unable to file
30		its (compl	liance report with the superintendent of public instruction before five p.m. on
31		Ser	otemb	per fifteenth, the school principal may request one extension from the

1		superintendent of public instruction. The superintendent of public instruction shall				
2		grant the extension provided the request was received before five p.m. on September				
3		fifteenth. An extension under this section terminates at five p.m. on September				
4		thirtieth.				
5	<u>6.</u>	Upon receipt of a school's compliance report, as required by this section, the				
6		superintendent of public instruction shall certify the school as being approved. A				
7		certification of approval under this subsection expires at the conclusion of the regular				
8		school calendar.				
9	<u>7.</u>	If after being certified as approved a school experiences circumstances or events the				
10		would render the information contained in its compliance report inaccurate, the				
11		principal of the school shall notify the superintendent of public instruction and work				
12		with the superintendent of public instruction to address the circumstances or events at				
13		the earliest possible time.				
14	SEC	SECTION 3. Section 15.1-06-06.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and				
15	enacted	enacted as follows:				
16	<u>15.1</u>	-06-06.1. Compliance report - Impossibility of timely submission.				
17	The superintendent of public instruction may delay imposing the sanctions set forth in					
18						
19	<u>1.</u>	The required submission of a school's compliance report is an impossibility due to:				
20		a. A natural disaster or act of God, including fire, earthquake, or tornado;				
21		b. An unauthorized or illegal act by a third party, including terrorism, sabotage, riot,				
22		or vandalism;				
23		c. Death;				
24		d. A medical or personal emergency;				
25		e. Operational interruption, including electrical failure, and computer hardware or				
26		software failures; or				
27		f. Governmental action, including an emergency order or judicial or law				
28		enforcement action; and				
29	<u>2.</u>	The superintendent of public instruction determines that the report, had it been				
30		submitted, would have demonstrated compliance with the approval requirements in				
31		accordance with section 15.1-06-06.				

1	SECTION 4. Section 15.1-06-06.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and					
2	enacted as follows:					
3	<u>15.1</u>	-06-06.2. Required records - Verification of information - Site visits.				
4	<u>1.</u>	The superintendent of public instruction shall notify each school and school district of				
5		the records that must be maintained in order to allow the superintendent of public				
6		instruction to verify the information contained in each compliance report. The				
7		superintendent of public instruction shall establish the length of time that the records				
8		must be maintained.				
9	<u>2.</u>	The superintendent of public instruction may examine the records at any time and may				
10		conduct site visits to ensure the accuracy of information provided on the compliance				
11		report. The site visits may be scheduled or unscheduled.				
12	SEC	ECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-13-18 of the North Dakota Century Code is				
13	amended and reenacted as follows:					
14	15.1-13-18. Teaching license - Presentation to business manager.					
15	<u>1.</u>	Before being employed to teach by a public school district, an individual shall present				
16		to the school district business manager a teaching license or other evidence of				
17		approval to teach issued by the board.				
18	<u>2.</u>	Before being employed to teach by a nonpublic school, an individual shall present to				
19		the school business manager a teaching license or other evidence of approval to				
20		teach issued by the board.				
21	SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-13-19 of the North Dakota Century Code is					
22	amended and reenacted as follows:					
23	15.1	-13-19. Teaching license - Expiration.				
24	Notwithstanding any other law, an individual whose if an individual's teaching license expires					
25	within the final six weeks of a school year may continue teaching under the expired					
26	licensedistrict's or nonpublic school's calendar, that individual's license is deemed to be					
27	extended and in effect until the completion of the school yeardistrict's or nonpublic school's					
28	calenda	<u>r</u> .				
29	SEC	CTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-13-25 of the North Dakota Century Code is				
30	amended and reenacted as follows:					

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1 15.1-13-25. Teaching license - Action by board - Causes.

- After holding a public hearing in accordance with chapter 28-32, the board may issue
 a written warning or reprimand to the individual, suspend the individual's teaching
 license, or revoke the individual's teaching license if:
 - a. The individual obtained a license by means of fraud, misrepresentation, or concealment of facts.
 - b. The board becomes aware of any fact or circumstance that would have caused the board to deny licensure had the board known of the fact or circumstance at the time of initial licensure.
 - c. The individual is incompetent, immoral, intemperate, or cruel.
 - d. The individual has been convicted of, has pled guilty to, or has pled nolo contendere to an offense deemed by the board to have a direct bearing upon an individual's ability to serve as a teacher or an administrator.
 - e. The board believes that the individual, having been convicted of an offense, has not been sufficiently rehabilitated under section 12.1-33-02.1.
 - f. The individual has refused to perform the duties of a teacher or an administrator.
 - g. The individual has breached a contract with a school district or nonpublic school.
 - h. The individual knowingly taught in violation of chapter 15.1-18.
 - The individual is <u>an administrator in</u> a school district <u>administrator or a nonpublic</u> <u>school</u> and knowingly permitted another individual to teach in violation of chapter 15.1-18.
 - j. The individual has violated this chapter or any rule adopted by the board.
 - 2. Any action of the board taken under this section may be appealed to the district court of Burleigh County in accordance with chapter 28-32.
- 25 **SECTION 8. REPEAL.** Sections 15.1-27-08 and 15.1-27-09 of the North Dakota Century Code are repealed.
- 27 **SECTION 9. EFFECTIVE DATE.** This Act becomes effective on July 1, 2011.
- **SECTION 10. EMERGENCY.** This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
