1	A BILL for an Act to	create and ena	act a new section	to chapter 15	5.1-06 and	sections
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- 2 15.1-06-06.1, 15.1-06-06.2, and 15.1-06-06.3 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to
- 3 school approval and safety requirements; to amend and reenact sections 15.1-02-11,
- 4 15.1-06-06, 15.1-13-18, 15.1-13-19, and 15.1-13-25 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating
- 5 to school approval; to repeal sections 15.1-27-08 and 15.1-27-09 of the North Dakota Century
- 6 Code, relating to payment reductions for unaccredited schools; to provide an effective date; and
- 7 to declare an emergency.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 9 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-02-11 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 11 15.1-02-11. Superintendent of public instruction Accreditation of schools Rules.
- The superintendent of public instruction may adopt rules governing the accreditation of
- public and nonpublic schools. Any rule adopted under this section must incorporate measures
- 14 of student achievement and bear a direct relationship to improving student achievement.
- 15 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-06-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 16 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 17 15.1-06-06. Approval of public and nonpublic schools.
- 18 Each public and nonpublic school in this state offering elementary or secondary education
- 19 to students must be approved by the superintendent of public instruction. Except as otherwise
- 20 provided by law, the superintendent may not approve a school unless:
- 1. To be certified as an approved school by the superintendent of public instruction, the
- 22 principal of each public school shall submit to the superintendent of public instruction a
- compliance report verifying that:

2			practices board or approved to teach by the education standards and practices	
3			board;	
4	2.	<u>b.</u>	Each classroom teacher is teaching only in those course areas or fields for which	1

6			section 15.1-09-57;	
7	3.	The	e students are offered all subjects required by law;	
8	4 .	The	e school is in compliance with all local and state health, fire, and safety laws; and	
9	5.	The	e school has conducted all criminal history record checks required by section

21			was submitted to and approved by the state fire marshal or the state fire

23		<u>f.</u>	All individuals hired after July 31, 2011, and having unsupervised contact with	
24			students at the school, have:	
25			(1) Undergone a criminal history background check requested by the employing	g

27			(2) Undergone a criminal history background check in order to be licensed by	
28			the education standards and practices board or by any other state licensing	L
29			board.	
30	<u>2.</u>	The	e compliance report required by subsection 1 must:	
31		<u>a.</u>	Be signed by the school principal and the superintendent of the school district;	

1		b. Be formally approved by the board of the school district; and
2		c. Be filed with the superintendent of public instruction before five p.m. on the:
3		(1) First day of October; or
4		(2) The date of the extension provided under subsection 6.
5	<u>3.</u>	On the tenth day of September and on the twenty-fifth day of September, the
6		superintendent of public instruction shall provide to each school principal, school
7		district superintendent, and school board member, electronic notification that the
8		compliance report is due on the first day of October.
9	<u>4.</u>	If a school's compliance report is not submitted at the time and in the manner required
10		by subsection 2, the superintendent of public instruction shall designate the school as
11		unapproved. The superintendent of public instruction shall post a current list of all
12		approved and unapproved public schools on the department's website.
13	<u>5.</u>	If a public school does not meet the approval requirements of this section, the
14		superintendent of public instruction shall:
15		a. Notify the parents of students enrolled in the school, either directly or through the
16		local media outlets, that the school is unapproved; and
17		b. Subtract from any state aid otherwise payable to the school district the prorated
18		amount attributable to the students in attendance at the unapproved school for
19		each day that the school's compliance report is not on file with the superintendent
20		of public instruction.
21	<u>6.</u>	If because of unforeseen or other extenuating circumstances a school is unable to file
22		its compliance report with the superintendent of public instruction before five p.m. on
23		October first, the school principal may request one extension from the superintendent
24		of public instruction. The superintendent of public instruction shall grant the extension
25		provided the request was received before five p.m. on October first. An extension
26		under this section terminates at five p.m. on October fifteenth.
27	<u>7.</u>	Upon receipt of a school's compliance report, as required by this section, the
28		superintendent of public instruction shall certify the school as being approved. A
29		certification of approval under this subsection expires at the conclusion of the regular
30		school calendar.

1	<u>8.</u>	<u>If af</u>	ter be	eing certified as approved a school experiences circumstances or events that

The superintendent of public instruction shall 14 post a current list of all approved and unapproved nonpublic schools on the 15 department's website. 16 If a nonpublic school does not meet the approval requirements of this section, the <u>5.</u> 17 superintendent of public instruction shall notify the parents of students enrolled in the 18 school, either directly or through the local media outlets, that the school is unapproved 19 and that the parents may be in violation of the state's compulsory attendance 20 provisions. 21 <u>6.</u> If because of unforeseen or other extenuating circumstances a nonpublic school is 22 unable to file its compliance report with the superintendent of public instruction before 23 five p.m. on October first, the school administrator may request one extension from the 24 superintendent of public instruction. The superintendent of public instruction shall grant the extension provided the request was received before five p.m. on October 25 26 first. An extension under this section terminates at five p.m. on October fifteenth. 27 <u>7.</u> Upon receipt of a nonpublic school's compliance report, as required by this section, 28 the superintendent of public instruction shall certify the school as being approved. A 29 certification of approval under this subsection expires at the conclusion of the regular 30 school calendar.

21		<u>b.</u>	Maintain and test the automated external defibrillator according to the
22			manufacturer's operational guidelines;
23		<u>C.</u>	Establish an automated external defibrillator use protocol that requires any
24			person who provides emergency care or treatment to an individual in cardiac
25			arrest by using the automated external defibrillator to contact an appropriate
26			health care provider or emergency medical services provider as soon as

21	SEC	CTION 9. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-13-25 of the North Dakota Century Code is					
22	amende	d and reenacted as follows:					
23	15.1	-13-25. Teaching license - Action by board - Causes.					
24	1.	After holding a public hearing in accordance with chapter 28-32, the board may issue					
25		a written warning or reprimand to the individual, suspend the individual's teaching					
26		license, or revoke the individual's teaching license if:					
27		a. The individual obtained a license by means of fraud, misrepresentation, or					
28		concealment of facts.					
29		b. The board becomes aware of any fact or circumstance that would have caused					
30		the board to deny licensure had the board known of the fact or circumstance at					
31		the time of initial licensure.					

1 The individual is incompetent, immoral, intemperate, or cruel. C. 2 d. The individual has been convicted of, has pled guilty to, or has pled 3 nolo contendere to an offense deemed by the board to have a direct bearing 4 upon an individual's ability to serve as a teacher or an administrator. 5 The board believes that the individual, having been convicted of an offense, has e. 6 not been sufficiently rehabilitated under section 12.1-33-02.1. 7 f. The individual has refused to perform the duties of a teacher or an administrator. 8 The individual has breached a contract with a school district or nonpublic school. g. 9 h. The individual knowingly taught in violation of chapter 15.1-18. 10 i. The individual is an administrator in a school district administratoror a nonpublic 11 school and knowingly permitted another individual to teach in violation of chapter 12 15.1-18. 13 The individual has violated this chapter or any rule adopted by the board. 14 Any action of the board taken under this section may be appealed to the district court 15 of Burleigh County in accordance with chapter 28-32. 16 SECTION 10. REPEAL. Sections 15.1-27-08 and 15.1-27-09 of the North Dakota Century 17 Code are repealed. 18 SECTION 11. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act becomes effective on July 1, 2011. 19 **SECTION 12. EMERGENCY.** This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
