- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact two new subsections to section 15-39.1-04 of the North
- 2 Dakota Century Code, relating to definitions of member tiers under the teachers' fund for
- 3 retirement; to amend and reenact subsections 1 and 2 of section 15-39.1-09, subsection 1 of

4 section 15-39.1-10, and sections 15-39.1-12, 15-39.1-18, 15-39.1-19.1, and 15-39.1-19.2 of the

- 5 North Dakota Century Code, relating to employee and employer contribution requirements,
- 6 eligibility for normal unreduced retirement benefits eligibility for early reduced retirement

7 benefits, eligibility for disability benefits, and retiree reemployment under the teachers' fund for

8 retirement; and to provide an effective date.

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. Two new subsections to section 15-39.1-04 of the North Dakota Century Code
 are created and enacted as follows:

- 12 "Tier one grandfathered member" for purposes of sections 15-39.1-10 and 15-39.1-12
- 13 means a tier one member who, as of June 30, 2013, is vested as a tier one member in
- 14 accordance with section 15-39.1-11; and
- 15 <u>a.</u> <u>Is at least fifty-five years of age; or</u>
- 16b.Has a combined total of years of service credit in the plan and years of age which17equals or exceeds sixty-five.
- 18 "Tier one nongrandfathered member" for purposes of sections 15-39.1-10 and
- 19 <u>15-39.1-12 means a tier one member who does not qualify as a tier one grandfathered</u>
 20 <u>member.</u>
- 21 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Subsections 1 and 2 of section 15-39.1-09 of the North Dakota
- 22 Century Code are amended and reenacted as follows:

1	1.	Except as otherwise provided by law, every teacher is a member of the fund and must
2		be assessed upon the teacher's salary seven and seventy-five hundredths percent per
3		annum, which must be deducted, certified, and paid monthly to the fund by the
4		disbursing official of the governmental body by which the teacher is employed.
5		Member contributions increase to nine and seventy-five hundredths percent per
6		annum beginning July 1, 2012, and increase thereafter to eleven and seventy-five
7		hundredths percent per annum beginning July 1, 2014. Except as otherwise provided
8		by law, every governmental body employing a teacher shall pay to the fund eight and
9		seventy-five hundredths percent per annum of the salary of each teacher employed by
10		it. Contributions to be paid by a governmental body employing a teacher increase to
11		ten and seventy-five hundredths percent per annum beginning July 1, 2012, and
12		increase thereafter to twelve and seventy-five hundredths percent per annum
13		beginning July 1, 2014. The required amount of member and employer contributions
14		must be reduced to seven and seventy-five hundredths percent per annum effective
15		on the July first that follows the first valuation showing a ratio of the actuarial value of
16		assets to the actuarial accrued liability of the teachers' fund for retirement that is equal
17		to or greater than ninety percent. The disbursing official of the governmental body
18		shall certify the governmental body payments and remit the payments monthly to the
19		fund.
20	2.	EachExcept for the member contribution increases beginning after June 30, 2012,
21		each employer, at its option, may pay the teacher contributions required by
22		subsection 1 for all compensation earned after June 30, 1983. The amount paid must
23		be paid by the employer in lieu of contributions by the employee. If an employer
24		decides not to pay the contributions, the amount that would have been paid will
25		continue to be deducted from compensation. If contributions are paid by the employer,
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26 they must be treated as employer contributions in determining income tax treatment 27 under this code and the federal Internal Revenue Code. If contributions are paid by the 28 employer, they may not be included as gross income of the teacher in determining tax 29 treatment under this code and the Internal Revenue Code until they are distributed or 30 made available. The employer shall pay these teacher contributions from the same 31 source of funds used in paying compensation to the teachers. The employer shall pay

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1	these contributions by effecting an equal cash reduction in the gross salary of the			
2	employee or by an offset against future salary increases. If teacher contributions are			
3	paid by the employer, they must be treated for the purposes of this chapter in the			
4	same manner and to the same extent as teacher contributions made prior to the date			
5	the contributions were assumed by the employer. The option given employers by this			
6	subsection must be exercised in accordance with rules adopted by the board.			
7	SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 15-39.1-10 of the North Dakota			
8	Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:			
9	1. The following members who have acquired a vested right to a retirement annuity as			
10	set forth in section 15-39.1-11 are eligible to receive monthly lifetime normal			
11	unreduced retirement benefits under this section:			
12	a. All tier one and tier two members who have earned three years of teaching			
13	service credit and who have attained the age of sixty-five years.			
14	b. All tier one grandfathered members who have earned three years of teaching-			
15	service credit and who have a combined total of years of service credit and years			
16	of age which equals or exceeds eighty-five.			
17	c. All tier two members who have earned five years of teaching service credit and			
18	who have attained the age of sixty-five yearsone nongrandfathered members and			
19	tier two members who are at least sixty years of age and who have combined			
20	total of years of service credit and years of age which equals or exceeds ninety.			
21	d. All tier two members who have earned five years of teaching service credit and			
22	who have a combined total of years of service credit and years of age which			
23	equals or exceeds ninety.			
24	SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 15-39.1-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is			
25	amended and reenacted as follows:			
26	15-39.1-12. Early <u>reduced</u> retirement <u>benefits</u> .			
27	A tier one member who has acquired a vested right to a retirement annuity as set forth in			
28	section 15-39.1-11 and who has attained age fifty-five may retire prior to the normal retirement			
29	age as set forth in section 15-39.1-10 but the benefits to which the member is then entitled mus			
30	be reduced to the actuarial equivalent of the benefit credits earned to the date of early			
31	retirement from the earlier of age sixty-five or the age at which current service plus age equals-			

1	eighty-five. A tier two member who has acquired a vested right to a retirement annuity as set				
2	forth in :	forth in section 15-39.1-11 and who has attained age fifty-five may retire prior to the normal			
3	retireme	nt age	as set forth in section 15-39.1-10 but the benefits to which the member is then		
4	entitled	must k	be reduced to the actuarial equivalent of the benefit credits earned to the date of		
5	early retirement from the earlier of age sixty-five or the age at which current service plus age				
6	equals ninety.according to the following schedule:				
7	<u>1.</u>	All tier one grandfathered member benefits must be reduced by six percent per annum			
8		<u>from</u>	the earlier of:		
9		<u>a.</u>	<u>Age sixty-five; or</u>		
10		<u>b.</u>	The age at which the sum of the member's current years of service credit and		
11			years of age equals eighty-five.		
12	<u>2.</u>	<u>All tie</u>	er one nongrandfathered member and tier two member benefits must be reduced		
13		<u>by ei</u>	ght percent per annum from the earlier of:		
14		<u>a.</u>	<u>Age sixty-five; or</u>		
15		<u>b.</u>	The later of:		
16			(1) Age sixty; or		
17			(2) The age at which the sum of the member's current years of service credit		
18			and years of age equals ninety.		
19	SEC	TION	5. AMENDMENT. Section 15-39.1-18 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
20	amended and reenacted as follows:				
21	15-39.1-18. Disability retirements.				
22	1.	Any	member may also retire and receive a disability annuity if, after a period of at least		
23		one y	rearfive years of service as a member in this state, the member suffers		
24		from	qualifies for total disability as determined by the board.		
25	2.	The	amount of the disability annuity is the greater of the amount computed by the		
26		retire	ment formula in section 15-39.1-10 without consideration of age or the amount		
27		comp	puted by that formula without consideration of age but assuming the member had		
28		twen	ty years of credited service. A member determined eligible for a disability annuity		
29		unde	r this section may elect to receive an annuity under any of the options allowed in		
30		secti	on 15-39.1-16, except the level retirement income with social security option or		
31		the p	artial lump sum option.		

1	3.	The	disability annuity continues until the death or prior recovery of the disabled
2		ann	uitant. The board shall ascertain by periodic medical examinations the continued
3		disa	ability status of a disabled annuitant.
4	4.	lf a	disabled annuitant recovers and returns to active teaching, that annuitant is
5		enti	tled to the retirement benefit credits which the annuitant earned prior to the time of
6		disa	ablement, and the credits which the annuitant earned after returning to active
7		tead	ching must be added to those earned prior to disablement.
8	SEC	стю	N 6. AMENDMENT. Section 15-39.1-19.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is
9	amende	d an	d reenacted as follows:
10	15-3	89.1- [,]	19.1. <u>Retired teachers return to active service -</u> Annuities discontinued on
11	resump	tion	of teaching <u>over annual hour limit</u> .
12	1.	a.	Except as otherwise provided in section 15-39.1-19.2, a retired teacher who is
13			receiving a retirement annuity under chapter 15-39, 15-39.1, or 15-39.2 may not
14			return to covered employment until thirty calendar days have elapsed from the
15			member's retirement date. A retired member may then return to covered
16			employment under an annual hour limit and continue receiving a monthly
17			retirement benefit. The annual hour limit is based on the length of the reemployed
18			retiree's contract as follows:
19			(1) Retiree reemployment of nine months or less, annual limit is seven hundred
20			hours;
21			(2) Retiree reemployment of ten months, annual limit is eight hundred hours;
22			(3) Retiree reemployment of eleven months, annual limit is nine hundred hours;
23			or
24			(4) Retiree reemployment of twelve months, annual limit is one thousand hours.
25		b.	Employment as a noncontracted substitute teacher does not apply to the annual
26			hour limit. Professional development and extracurricular duties do not apply to
27			the annual hour limit.
28		C.	The retired member and the retired member's employer must notify the fund
29			office in writing within thirty days of the retired member's return to covered
30			employment. Should the retired member's employment exceed the annual hour
31			limit, the retired member must immediately notify the fund office in writing. Failure

1			to notify the fund office results in the loss of one month's annuity benefit. The
2			retired member's monthly benefit must be discontinued the first of the month-
3			following the date the member reaches the annual hour limit.
4		d.	A retired member who returns to teaching shall pay the member contributions
5			required by section 15-39.1-09 on those earnings<u>the salary</u> received by the
6			retired member after reaching the annual hour limit. The member contributions
7			must be included in the retired member's account value and may not be refunded
8			except as provided under subdivision a of subsection 2 of section 15-39.1-19.1
9			and section 15-39.1-17.
10		e.	A participating employer who employs a retired member under this section shall
11			pay the employer contributions required by section 15-39.1-09 on the salary of
12			the retired member both before and after the retired member reaches the annual
13			hour limit.
14		<u>f.</u>	A retired teacher who returns to teaching and does not exceed the annual hour
15			limit must be treated as retired for all other purposes under this chapter. A retired
16			teacher may not earn any additional service during the period of reemployment.
17			The retired teacher's benefits may not be adjusted to reflect changes in the
18			retired teacher's age or final average monthly salary at the end of the period of
19			reemployment, any optional form of payment elected under section 15-39.1-16
20			remains effective during and after the period of reemployment, and additional
21			benefits normally available to an active member, such as disability benefits, are
22			not available to a retired teacher reemployed under this section.
23		<u>g.</u>	A retired teacher who returns to teaching and exceeds the annual hour limit must
24			immediately notify the fund office in writing. Failure to notify the fund office results
25			in the loss of one month's annuity benefit for the member. The retired member's
26			monthly benefit must be discontinued the first of the month following the date the
27			member reaches the annual hour limit.
28	2.	Upo	on the retired teacher's subsequent retirement, the member's benefit must be
29		res	umed as follows:
30		a.	If the teacher subsequently retires with less than two years of additional earned
31			credited service, the teacher's contributions paid to the fund after the member's

1	benefit was suspended must be refunded in accordance with section 15-39.1-20
2	and the teacher is entitled to receive the discontinued annuity, plus any
3	postretirement benefit adjustments granted during the period of reemployment,
4	the first day of the month following the teacher's re-retirement.

- 5 If the teacher subsequently retires with two or more but less than five years of b. 6 additional earned credited service, the retired person's annuity is the greater of 7 the sum of the discontinued annuity, plus an additional annuity computed 8 according to this chapter based upon years of service and average salaries 9 earned during the period of reemployment plus any postretirement benefit 10 adjustments granted during the period of reemployment, or a recalculated annuity 11 computed according to this chapter based on total years of service credit earned 12 during both employment periods offset by the actuarial value of payments already 13 received. The new annuity is payable the first day of the month following the 14 member's re-retirement.
- 15 c. If the teacher subsequently retires with five or more years of additional earned
 16 credited service, the retired person's annuity is the greater of the sum of the
 17 discontinued annuity plus an additional annuity based upon years of service and
- 18 average salaries earned during the period of reemployment plus any
- 19 postretirement benefit adjustments granted during the period of reemployment, or
- 20 a recalculated annuity based on all years of service computed under
- subsection 2 of section 15-39.1-10. The new annuity is payable the first day of
 the month following the member's re-retirement.

SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 15-39.1-19.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

25 **15-39.1-19.2.** Retired teachers return to active service - Critical shortage areas and

26 disciplines - Rules.

A retired teacher who is receiving a retirement annuity under chapter 15-39, 15-39.1,
 or 15-39.2 may elect to return to teaching without losing any benefits under the
 provisions of this section or elect to return to teaching under the provisions of section
 15-39.1-19.1. To return to teaching under this section, a retired teacher must:

1		a. Return to teach in a critical shortage geographical area or subject discipline as
2		determined by the education standards and practices board by rule;
3		b. If retired after January 1, 2001, have been receiving a retirement annuity for at
4		least one year. A retired teacher may perform noncontracted substitute teaching
5		duties but may not engage in full-time or part-time teaching duties during the
6		one-year separation from service; and
7		c. Notify the fund office in writing within thirty days of the retired member's return to
8		covered employment. The retired member's employer must also notify the fund
9		office in writing within thirty days of the retired member's return to covered
10		employment.
11	2.	A retired teacher who returns to teaching under this section is not required toshall pay
12		the employee assessmentmember contributions required by section 15-39.1-09 on the
13		salary of the retired member. The member contributions must be included in the retired
14		member's account value and may not be refunded except as provided under section
15		15-39.1-17. A retired teacher who returns to teaching under the provisions of this
16		section must be treated as retired for all other purposes under this chapter. A retired
17		teacher may not earn any additional service during the period of reemployment. The
18		retired teacher's benefits may not be adjusted to reflect changes in the retired
19		teacher's age or final average monthly salary at the end of the period of
20		reemployment, any optional form of payment elected under section 15-39.1-16
21		remains effective during and after the period of reemployment, and additional benefits
22		normally available to an active member, such as disability benefits, are not available to
23		a retired teacher reemployed under this section.
24	3.	A participating employer who employs a retired member under this section shall pay
25		the employer contributions required by section 15-39.1-09 on the salary of the retired
26		member.
27	SEC	TION 8. EFFECTIVE DATE. Sections 6 and 7 of this Act become effective July 1, 2012,
28	and sect	ions 3, 4, and 5 of this Act become effective July 1, 2013.
