1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 15-52-01,15-52-03,15-52-04, and 2 54-27-2557-36-32 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the purpose of the school of 3 medicine and health sciences, the school of medicine and health sciences advisory council, the 4 school of medicine and health sciences strategic plan, and the tobacco settlement trust-5 fundadditional tax on the sale of cigarettes; to repeal chapter 23-42 and section 54-27-25.1 of 6 the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the tobacco prevention and control program and 7 water development trust fund expenditures; and to provide an appropriation; and to provide for-

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 10 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15-52-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is 11 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 12 15-52-01. School of medicine and health sciences.
 - The primary purpose of the university of North Dakota school of medicine and health sciences is to educate increase the health care workforce in the state by educating physicians. with a focus on the education of primary care physicians, and other health professionals, increase the health care workforce in the state with a focus on the education of primary care physicians, and to enhance the quality of life in North Dakota. Other purposes include the discovery of knowledge that benefits the people of this state and enhances the quality of their lives.
- 20 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 15-52-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

27			selected by the governor to represent the human services regions of the		
28			state, of which four members must be from a small community, two

30			community. Of the members selected by the governor, at least five of the		
31			members must be health care providers involved regularly in patient care, at		

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1 least one member must be a clinic or hospital administrator, and at least one 2 member must be an individual involved in health care; 3 C. FourTwo members selected by the dean of the university of North Dakota school 4 of medicine and health sciences, one from each of the four campuses of the 5 school of medicine and health sciences with headquarters in Bismarck, Fargo, 6 Grand Forks, and Minot.; 7 One member selected by the state board of higher education; and d. 8 The director of the university of North Dakota center for rural health, who shall <u>e.</u> 9 serve as an ex officio member. 10 3. The representatives named by the state agencies and boards must be selected to 11 serve as members of the advisory council for periods of at least one year, but may not 12 serve longer than their term of office on the public agency. The representatives from 13 the North Dakota state medical association and the North Dakota healthcare 14 association shall serve a term of three years or until their successors are named and 15 qualified. The legislators must be selected to serve four-year terms and may be 16 selected for one additional term, but may not serve beyond their term of office. The 17 governor shall appoint members to serve terms of three years, except for those first 18 appointed, of which four members must serve for two years and four members for 19 three years. The governor may appoint members to serve one additional term. All 20 other members must be selected to serve three-year terms and may be selected for 21 one additional term. 22 The members of the council are entitled to compensation from the university of North 4. 23 Dakota school of medicine and health sciences for attendance at council meetings, 24 including meetings held through video or teleconference, at a rate of one hundred 25 forty-eight dollars per day and are entitled to reimbursement for expenses incurred in 26 attending the meetings in the amounts provided by law for other state officers. A state 27 employee who is a member of the council may not receive compensation under this 28 subsection but is entitled to mileage and expense reimbursement to be paid by the 29 university of North Dakota school of medicine and health sciences. 30 4.5. The council shall name its own chairman and the dean of the university of North

Dakota school of medicine and health sciences shall serve as executive secretary of

1 the council. The council shall meet not less than twice four times each year, and, from 2 time to time, on its own motion or upon request of the university administration. 3 Any council member absent from three or more advisory council meetings during a 4 two-year period may no longer serve on the advisory council and a new member 5 appointed pursuant to subsection 2. 6 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 15-52-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is 7 amended and reenacted as follows: 8 15-52-04. Duties of council. 9 The advisory council, in consultation with the school of medicine and health sciences 10 and the other agencies, associations, and institutions represented on the advisory 11 council, shall study and make recommendations regarding the strategic plan, 12 programs, and facilities of the school of medicine and health sciences. 13 Biennially Annually, the advisory council shall submit a report, together with its 14 recommendations and outcomes, to the agencies, associations, and institutions 15 represented on the advisory council, to the university of North Dakota, to the budget 16 section, and to the legislative councilmanagement. In addition, the advisory council 17 shall submit a report together with its recommendations and outcomes to the 18 appropriations committees of the house and senate during each legislative session. 19 3. The report must describe the advisory council's recommendations regarding the a. 20 strategic plan, programs, and facilities of the school of medicine and health 21 sciences as developed under subsection 1. The recommendations for 22 implementing strategies through the school of medicine and health sciences or 23 other agencies and institutions must: 24 (1) Address the health care needs of the people of the state; and 25 (2) Provide information regarding the state's health care workforce needs; 26 Provide for increasing the number of primary care physicians practicing in <u>(3)</u> 27 the state; 28 Collaborate with local organizations and political subdivisions to place (4) 29 primary care physicians in rural parts of the state: 30 (5)Allow for the recruitment of students into specialized programs identified as 31 necessary for addressing the health care needs of the state;

1		<u>(6)</u>	Provide for increasing the number of resident training positions available to
2			train primary care physicians in the state, including incentives to establish
3			resident training programs; and
4		<u>(7)</u>	Provide that after meeting commitments to the western interstate
5			commission for higher education and the Indians into medicine program,
6			university of North Dakota school of medicine and health sciences students
7			fill at least eighty percent of the resident training positions available in the
8			state.

24	1.	There is	created in the state treasury a tobacco settlement trust fund. The fund
25	consists of the tobacco settlement dollars obtained by the state under subsection IX(c

29		Except a	s provided in subsection 2, moneys received by the state under
30		subsection	on IX(c)(1) must be deposited in the fund. Interest earned on the fund must be

eredited to the fund and deposited in the fund. The principal and interest of the fundmust be allocated as follows:

- a. Transfers to a community health trust fund to be administered by the statedepartment of health. The state department of health may use funds asappropriated for community-based public health programs and other public healthprograms, including programs with emphasis on preventing or reducing tobaccousage in this state. Transfers under this subsection must equal ten percent oftotal annual transfers from the tobacco-settlement trust fund of which a minimumof eighty percent must be used for tobacco-prevention and control.
- b. Transfers to the common schools trust fund to become a part of the principal of that fund. Transfers under this subsection must equal forty-five percent of total annual transfers from the tobacco settlement trust fund.
 - Transfers to the water development trust fund to be used to address the long-term water development and management needs of the state. Transfers under this subsection must equal forty-five percent of the total annual transfers from the tobacco settlement trust fund.
- 2. There is created in the state treasury a tobacco prevention and controlhealth careprograms trust fund. The fund consists of the tobacco settlement dollars obtained bythe state under section IX(c)(2) of the agreement adopted by the east central judicialdistrict court in its judgment entered December 28, 1998 [Civil No. 98-3778] in State ofNorth Dakota, ex rel. Heidi Heitkamp v. Philip Morris, Inc. Interest earned on the fundmust be credited to the fund and deposited in the fund. Moneys received intoin the
 fund are to be administered by the executive committee for the purpose of creatingand implementing the comprehensive plan. If in any biennium, the tobacco preventionand control trust fund does not have adequate dollars to fund a comprehensive plan,
 the treasurer shall transfer money from the water development trust fund to the
 tobacco prevention and control trust fund in an amount equal to the amount
 determined necessary by the executive committee to fund a comprehensiveplanavailable, subject to legislative appropriations, for defraying the expenses of
 university of North Dakota school of medicine and health sciences projects and

programs related to increasing the health care workforce in the state, with a focus on the education of primary care physicians.

3. Transfers to the funds under this section must be made within thirty days of receipt by the state.

 SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 57-36-32 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

57-36-32. Separate and additional tax on the sale of cigarettes - Collection - Allocation of revenue - Tax avoidance prohibited.

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There is hereby levied and assessed and there shall be collected by the state tax commissioner and paid to the state treasurer, upon all cigarettes sold in this state, an additional tax, separate and apart from all other taxes, of seventeenthirty-seven and one-half mills on each cigarette, to be collected as existing taxes on cigarettes sold are, or hereafter may be, collected, by use of appropriate stamps and under similar accounting procedures. No person, firm, corporation, or limited liability company shall transport or bring or cause to be shipped into the state of North Dakota any cigarettes as provided herein, other than for delivery to wholesalers in this state, without first paying the tax thereon to the state tax commissioner. All of the moneys collected by the state treasurer under this section shall be credited to the state general fund.

SECTION 5. REPEAL. Chapter 23-42 and section 54-27-25.1 of the North Dakota Century Code areis repealed.

SECTION 6. APPROPRIATION - HEALTH SCIENCES FACILITY PROJECT. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the health care programs trustgeneral fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$28,900,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the university of North Dakota for the purpose of constructing a new health sciences facility at the university of North Dakota, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013.

SECTION 7. APPROPRIATION - MEDICAL SCHOOL PROGRAM EXPANSION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the health care programs trustgeneral fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$5,800,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the university of North Dakota school of medicine and health sciences for the purpose of increasing the number of medical and health sciences students at the university of

1 North Dakota school of medicine and health sciences and the number of residency training 2 positions in the state, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013. 3 SECTION 8. TRANSFER - TOBACCO PREVENTION AND CONTROL TRUST FUND -4 **HEALTH CARE PROGRAMS TRUST FUND.** The office of management and budget shall-5 transfer any balance remaining in the tobacco prevention and control trust fund at the end of the 6 2009-11 biennium to the health care programs trust fund. For purposes of this section, "at the 7 end of the 2009-11 biennium" means after cancellation of unexpended appropriations under-8 section 54-44.1-11.
