1	A BILL for an Act to create and enact three new sections to chapter 15-52 of the North Dakota
2	Century Code, relating to the school of medicine and health sciences advisory council; and to
3	amend and reenact sections 15-52-01,15-52-03, and 15-52-04, 23-42-01, 23-42-04, 23-42-05,
4	and 54-27-25 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the purpose of the school of
5	medicine and health sciences, the school of medicine and health sciences and the school's
6	advisory council, the school of medicine and health sciences strategic plan, the tobacco-
7	prevention and control program, and the tobacco settlement trust fund; to provide an-
8	appropriation; and to provide for a transfer.

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15-52-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 12 15-52-01. School of medicine and health sciences.
 - The primary purpose of the university of North Dakota school of medicine and health sciences is to educate increase the health care workforce in the state by educating physicians, with a focus on the education of primary care physicians, and other health professionals and to enhance the quality of life in North Dakota. Other purposes include the discovery of knowledge that benefits the people of this state and enhances the quality of their lives.
 - **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 15-52-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

23	SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 23-42-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is			
24	amended and reenacted as follows:			
25	23-42-01. Definitions.			
26	—— As used in this chapter:			
27	1. "Advisory committee" is the nine-member tobacco prevention and control advisory			
28	committee responsible to develop the comprehensive plan.			
29	2. "Comprehensive plan" means a comprehensive statewide tobacco prevention and			
30	control program that is consistent with the centers for disease control best practices			

1	for comprehensive tobacco prevention and control programs and does not duplicate
2	the work of the community health grant program created in chapter 23-38.
3	3. "Executive committee" means the three-member committee selected by the advisory-
4	committee and charged with implementation and administration of the comprehensive
5	plan.
6	4. "Tobacco prevention and control fund" consists of all principal and interest of the
7	tobacco prevention and control trust fund established by section 54-27-25.
8	SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 23-42-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is
9	amended and reenacted as follows:
10	23-42-04. Powers of the executive committee.
11	To implement the purpose of this chapter and, in addition to any other authority granted
12	elsewhere in this chapter, to support its efforts and implement the comprehensive plan, the
13	executive committee may employ staff and fix their compensation, accept grants, property, and
14	gifts, enter contracts, make loans, provide grants, borrow money, lease property, provide-
15	direction to the state investment board for investment of the tobacco prevention and control
16	fund, and take any action that any private individual, corporation, or limited liability company
17	lawfully may do except as restricted by the provisions of this chapter.
18	SECTION 9. AMENDMENT. Section 23-42-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is
19	amended and reenacted as follows:
20	23-42-05. Development of the comprehensive plan.
21	The advisory committee shall develop the initial comprehensive plan within one hundred
22	eighty days of the initial meeting of the advisory committee. The comprehensive plan must be
23	funded at a level equal to or greater than the centers for disease control recommended funding
24	level. Funding for the comprehensive plan must supplement and may not supplant any funding
25	that in the absence of this chapter would be or has been provided for the community health trust
26	fund or other health initiatives.
27	SECTION 10. AMENDMENT. Section 54-27-25 of the North Dakota Century Code is
28	amended and reenacted as follows:
29	54-27-25. Tobacco settlement trust fund - Interest on fund - Uses.
30	— 1. There is created in the state treasury a tobacco settlement trust fund. The fund
31	consists of the tobacco settlement dollars obtained by the state under subsection IX(c)

- (1) of the master settlement agreement and consent agreement adopted by the east central judicial district court in its judgment entered December 28, 1998 [Civil-No. 98-3778] in State of North Dakota, ex rel. Heidi Heitkamp v. Philip Morris, Inc. Except as provided in subsection 2, moneys received by the state undersubsection IX(c)(1) must be deposited in the fund. Interest earned on the fund must be credited to the fund and deposited in the fund. The principal and interest of the fundmust be allocated as follows:
- a. Transfers to a community health trust fund to be administered by the statedepartment of health. The state department of health may use funds asappropriated for community-based public health programs and other public healthprograms, including programs with emphasis on preventing or reducing tobaccousage in this state. Transfers under this subsection must equal ten percent oftotal annual transfers from the tobacco-settlement trust fund of which a minimumof eighty percent must be used for tobacco-prevention and control.
- b. Transfers to the common schools trust fund to become a part of the principal of that fund. Transfers under this subsection must equal forty-five percent of total annual transfers from the tobacco settlement trust fund.
- c. Transfers to the water development trust fund to be used to address the long-term water development and management needs of the state. Transfers under this subsection must equal forty-five percent of the total annual transfers from the tobacco settlement trust fund.
- 2. There is created in the state treasury a tobacco prevention and controlhealth care programs trust fund. The fund consists of the tobacco settlement dollars obtained by the state under section IX(c)(2) of the agreement adopted by the east central judicial district court in its judgment entered December 28, 1998 [Civil No. 98-3778] in State of North Dakota, ex rel. Heidi Heitkamp v. Philip Morris, Inc. Interest earned on the fund must be credited to the fund and deposited in the fund. Moneys received intoin the fund are to be administered by the executive committee for the purpose of creating and implementing the comprehensive plan. If in any biennium, the tobacco prevention and control trust fund does not have adequate dollars to fund a comprehensive plan, the treasurer shall transfer money from the water development trust fund to the

tobacco prevention and control trust fund in an amount equal to the amount determined necessary by the executive committee to fund a comprehensive planavailable, subject to legislative appropriations, for defraying the expenses of the comprehensive tobacco control advisory committee and the university of North Dakota school of medicine and health sciences projects and programs related to increasing the health care workforce in the state, with a focus on the education of primary care physicians.

3. Transfers to the funds under this section must be made within thirty days of receipt by the state.

appropriated out of any moneys in the health care programs trust fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$28,900,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the university of North Dakota for the purpose of constructing a new health sciences facility at the university of North Dakota, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013.

SECTION 12. APPROPRIATION - MEDICAL SCHOOL PROGRAM EXPANSION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the health care programs trust fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$5,800,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the university of North Dakota school of medicine and health sciences for the purpose of increasing the number of medical and health sciences students at the university of North Dakota school of medicine and health sciences and the number of residency training positions in the state, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013.

SECTION 13. APPROPRIATION - COMPREHENSIVE TOBACCO CONTROL ADVISORY COMMITTEE. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the health care programs trust fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$9,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the comprehensive tobacco control advisory committee for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the committee, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013.

SECTION 14. TRANSFER - TOBACCO PREVENTION AND CONTROL TRUST FUND HEALTH CARE PROGRAMS TRUST FUND. The office of management and budget shall
transfer any balance remaining in the tobacco prevention and control trust fund at the end of the

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- 1 2009-11 biennium to the health care programs trust fund. For purposes of this section, "at the
- 2 end of the 2009-11 biennium" means after cancellation of unexpended appropriations under-
- 3 section 54-44.1-11.
