- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact chapter 15-10.3 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to student fees at institutions of higher education under the control of the state board of
- 3 higher education; to provide for a legislative management study; and to provide an expiration
- 4 date.

## 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 6 **SECTION 1.** Chapter 15-10.3 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- 8 **15-10.3-01. Definitions.**
- 9 For purposes of this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires:
- 1. "Fee" means any monetary charge, other than tuition, that a student is assessed for a
  specific purpose or supplemental service.
- 12 <u>2.</u> "Tuition" means the monetary charge that a student is assessed in order to be enrolled
  13 in a class or program for which a student generally earns academic credit.
- 15-10.3-02. Mandatory fees Fees for optional purposes or services Publication for
  comparison purposes.
- The state board of higher education shall publish on its website in a clear and
- 17 comprehensible form that allows for ease of comparison among all institutions under its control:
- 1. The amount of mandatory fees that each institution has determined it shall assess
  each full-time and part-time student during the ensuing academic year, together with a
  breakdown of the fees by purpose or service;
- 2. The amount of any program-specific fees that each institution has determined it shall assess each student in a particular program during the ensuing academic year; and

5	The total amount of mandatory fees that an institution under the control of the state board of		
6	higher education assesses each full-time and part-time student may not increase from one		
7	academic year to the ensuing academic year by more than one percent of the latest available		
8	average full-time, resident, on-campus, undergraduate tuition rate at institutions each individual		
9	institution under the control of the state board, unless the state board determines that an		
10	exemption from the requirements of this section is necessitated as a result of documented		
11	extraordinary circumstances or student demand.		
12	15-10.3-04. Mandatory fee increases - Criteria - Explanation.		
13	<u>1.</u>	<u>Bef</u>	ore the state board of higher education may approve an institution's request to
14		incr	ease a mandatory fee, the institution shall provide to the board the following
15	<u>information:</u>		
16		<u>a.</u>	The estimated revenue collection to be generated by the proposed fee increase;
17		<u>b.</u>	The specific purpose to which the generated revenue will be allocated;
18		<u>C.</u>	Other anticipated tuition and fee increases:
19		<u>d.</u>	A delineation of fee increases during the preceding five-year period and the
20			revenues collected as a result of each increase;
21		<u>e.</u>	The extent to which students were allowed to participate in the decisionmaking
22			process that preceded and resulted in the request for a fee increase; and
23		<u>f.</u>	The approximate number of students that would be assessed the fee each year.
24	<u>2.</u>	The	board shall examine the information provided by the requesting institution and
25		<u>sha</u>	Il support its decision to grant or deny a request for a mandatory fee increase with
26		<u>spe</u>	cific reference to each piece of information required by this section.
27	SECTION 2. STUDENT FEES - LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY. The legislative		
28	management shall consider studying, during the 2011-12 interim, the assessment of mandatory		
29	fees and fees for optional purposes or services by institutions under the control of the state		
30	board of higher education, including the manner in which such fees are determined, identified,		
31	and justified and whether the programs, purposes, services, and activities supported by such

- 1 fees should in fact be supported by tuition dollars, legislative appropriations, or other public or
- 2 private funding sources. The legislative management shall report its findings and
- 3 recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to
- 4 the sixty-third legislative assembly.
- 5 **SECTION 3. EXPIRATION DATE.** Section 15-10.3-03 is effective through June 30, 2013,
- 6 and after that date is ineffective.
